ORDER SUSPENDING PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

An evidentiary hearing in this case is scheduled for November 12-14, 2013. On October 24, Ameren Missouri filed a motion asking the Commission to indefinitely suspend the remaining procedural schedule, including the hearing. Ameren Missouri explains the Missouri Department of Natural Resources (MDNR) has required it to submit a revised Construction Permit Application as part of that agency's review of Ameren Missouri's plans for the waste landfill at Labadie. Until that revised application is filed with MDNR, Ameren Missouri believes this proceeding cannot go forward. Ameren Missouri asks that proceedings in this case be suspended until after it files its revised application with MDNR, at which time the parties will submit a revised procedural schedule.

Ameren Missouri's motion represents that it has consulted with all other parties to this case and that none of those parties oppose the request to suspend the procedural schedule. Ameren Missouri also asks the Commission to rule on its request quickly so that the parties' witnesses can clear the hearing dates from their schedules.

The Commission will suspend the procedural schedule as requested. The hearing scheduled for November 12-14 will be canceled, and will be rescheduled at a later date.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The procedural schedule is indefinitely suspended.
2. The hearing scheduled for November 12, 13, and 14, 2013, is cancelled.
3. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
