ORDER GRANTING MOTION FOR ADMISSION PRO HAC VICE

The Missouri Public Service Commission is granting the *Motion for Admission Pro Hac Vice* filed by Larry W. Brewer.

The motion seeks an order granting leave to appear in this action. Such representation constitutes the practice of law,¹ which is subject to the exclusive governance of the Missouri Supreme Court.² The Missouri Supreme Court requires executive branch agencies, like the Commission, to guard against the unauthorized practice of law,³ which the Commission does through 4 CSR 240-2.040(3)(C), which tracks Missouri Supreme Court Rule 9.03.

The motion meets the requirements of the rule and the regulation. Also, the motion shows compliance with Missouri Supreme Court Rule 6.01(m), which relates to the required admission fee. Therefore, the Commission will grant the motion.
