**NOTICE ACKNOWLEDGING VOLUNTARY DISMISSAL OF COMPLAINT**  
**AND CLOSING CASE**

Issue Date: September 26, 2007

Irene D’Souza filed a formal complaint against Union Electric Company d/b/a AmerenUE (“AmerenUE”) on May 21, 2007. On September 25, 2007, prior to the filing of any prepared testimony or the submission of any oral evidence, Ms. D’Souza filed a Notice of Dismissal (“Notice”), in which she informed the Commission that she wished to withdraw her complaint in its entirety since she had reached an agreement with AmerenUE which resolved all disputed issues covered by the complaint.

Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.116(1) permits a complainant to voluntarily dismiss her complaint without an order of the Commission “at any time before prepared testimony has been filed or oral evidence has been offered, by filing a notice of dismissal with the commission and serving a copy on all parties.”

No prepared testimony or oral evidence has been offered in this case, and the Notice has been filed with the Commission.<sup>1</sup> Therefore, the Commission acknowledges that Irene D'Souza has voluntarily dismissed her complaint against AmerenUE. Nothing remains for decision by the Commission and this case may be closed.<sup>2</sup>
