- 2 JUDGE DALE: We are here in the matter of
- 3 the tariff filing of the Empire District Electric Company
- 4 to implement a general rate increase for retail electric
- 5 service provided to customers in the Missouri service
- 6 area, Case No. ER-2006-315. I am Colleen M. Dale. I'm
- 7 the hearing examiner assigned to this case.
- 8 Will the counsel please make their entries
- 9 of appearance.
- 10 MR. SWEARENGEN: James C. Swearengen and
- 11 Dean Cooper of Brydon, Swearengen & England, 312 East
- 12 Capitol Avenue, Jefferson City, Missouri, appearing on
- 13 behalf of the Empire District Electric Company.
- MS. CARTER: Diana Carter with Brydon,
- 15 Swearengen & England, same address as you were just given,
- 16 appearing on behalf of Aquila.

- 12 JUDGE DALE: Is there anyone else? Okay.
- 13 Are there any pending matters that I need to address? I
- 14 know we have a number of motions, a motion and
- 15 applications for rehearing, several of which are still
- 16 pending. If and when the Commission makes a decision,
- 17 I'll let you know.
- MR. WOODSMALL: Do you know if those are
- 19 going to be on the agenda tomorrow?
- 20 JUDGE DALE: I believe that the ones
- 21 concerning whether or not the interim energy charge
- 22 numbers can be rolled into base rates will be heard again
- 23 tomorrow. The others, no.
- Do any of you have any questions for me
- 25 before you begin your negotiations?

- 1 MR. CONRAD: There is a presently pending
- 2 schedule for an order as a result of an Order to file some
- 3 supplementary information. That will probably be
- 4 discussed here early on to see whether there might be the
- 5 potential of seeing whether that could be pushed out, but
- 6 I don't think we have anything to report or to request at
- 7 this point. But I presume you would be available through
- 8 the day today or tomorrow if it was necessary to address
- 9 that matter?
- 10 JUDGE DALE: Yes. And I can tell you that
- 11 if there is a need to push that out, I --
- MR. CONRAD: You remember what I'm speaking
- 13 of?
- 14 JUDGE DALE: The six additional questions?
- MR. CONRAD: I think that's correct. I
- 16 don't remember the title.
- 17 JUDGE DALE: I don't believe there will be
- 18 any problem pushing that out. The hope is that
- 19 Commissioner questions will be given to the participants
- 20 in a case in time for them to file answers, cross on them
- 21 and brief them, rather than asking questions from the
- 22 Bench, getting last-minute late-filed exhibits that people
- 23 don't really have an opportunity to address.
- So if you need to have more time for that,
- 25 I can't imagine that there would be a problem with

extending that. Is there anything else? Then we will go off the record and we'll let you continue your negotiations. WHEREUPON, the recorded portion of the prehearing conference was concluded.
