RESPONSE OF INTERVENOR PACE TO OBJECTION OF APPLICANT SOUTHERN UNION COMPANY TO PACE'S APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

Intervenor Local 5-348 of Paper, Allied-Industrial, Chemical and Energy International Union ("PACE"), by and through its attorneys, hereby responds to Applicant Southern Union Company's objection to PACE's Application to Intervene.

- 1. PACE is a voluntary labor organization doing business in representing employees of Panhandle Eastern in the State of Missouri. PACE is the exclusive collective bargaining agent of the bargaining unit employees of Panhandle Eastern Pipeline Company ("Panhandle Easter") in the State of Missouri. PACE is the exclusive collective bargaining agent of the bargaining unit employees of Panhandle Eastern in Missouri.
- 2. The acquisition of Panhandle Eastern by Southern Union Company is the subject of this matter before the Public Service Commission.
- 3. As the exclusive bargaining agent of Panhandle Eastern, PACE is an interested person in this matter and properly should be allowed to intervene in the instant matter.

4. As a direct and proximate result of the proposed sale of Panhandle Eastern to applicant Southern Union Company, the bargaining unit employees represented by PACE will receive a reduction in pension benefits to which they are otherwise entitled. As such it is in the public's interest that the Public Service Commission consider the impact of said purchase upon

5. The Public Service Commission has the authority to enter an order conditioning the authority of Southern Union Company purchasing the equity interest of Panhandle Eastern upon the Panhandle Eastern employees being granted all of their pension benefits otherwise promised.
