4	JUDGE DIPPELL: We will go on the record.
5	The Missouri Public Service Commission has set this
6	time for a local hearing, in Case Number ER-2019-0335
7	in which Union Electric Company, doing business as
8	Ameren Missouri, seeks to decrease its revenues for
9	electric service.
10	My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm a
11	regulatory law judge for the Public Service Commission
12	and I have been assigned to preside over this hearing
13	this evening.
14	With me is Commissioner Rupp, who is one
15	of our five commissioners at the Public Service
16	Commission and we have come tonight to hear your
17	comments.
18	I believe you probably heard a little bit
19	about how the process works, earlier but we have come
20	tonight to hear your comments. We will be taking the
21	comments down. The court reporter will be transcribing
22	them, so they will be taken under oath.
23	And I would ask I will start by calling
24	the person who signed up on the sheet and I will ask
25	name and a couple of questions. Then I will just have

1 you give your comments. I would ask that you stay at 2 the podium, in case the commissioner or myself have some clarifying questions. Perhaps some of the 3 attorneys might have some clarifying questions. 4 And then if there is anybody else that 5 would like to speak, if you didn't sign up, that's 6 7 I'll ask if there is anybody else. We don't have a very big crowd tonight, so there will be plenty 8 of time for everyone. I'd like to thank the Fox C-6 School 10 District for letting us use their facility this evening 11 and just mention that in no way are the comments here 12 13 tonight associated with the school district. They have just been gracious enough to let us use their facility. 14 15 This is an official hearing of the 16 Missouri Public Service Commission, so as I said, your comments will be taken down and the other commissioners 17 will be able to review those and they will become part 18 of the official record of the case. 19 20 We are going to begin by asking the 2.1 attorneys present to make their entries of appearance. Can I have the staff? 2.2 MS. MYERS: For the staff of the Missouri 23 24 Public Service Commission, Jamie Myers. My address is 25 200 Madison Street, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City,

9	MS. JOHNSON: Thank you, Your Honor.
10	Paula Johnson for Union Electric Company, doing
11	business as Ameren Missouri, 1901 Chouteau Avenue,
12	St. Louis, Missouri 63103.
13	JUDGE DIPPELL: And are there any
14	intervening attorneys present? Seeing none. Thank
15	you.
16	Then we will go ahead and begin with our
17	first witness, Peggy Nelson.
18	If you could please state your name and
19	spell it for the court reporter?
20	MS. NELSON: Peggy Nelson, P-E-G-G-Y
21	N-E-L-S-O-N. Okay. I just wanted to say that I
22	appreciated the pamphlet about the no cost energy
23	savings action, low cost energy savings actions and the
24	long-term energy savings actions that you could take to
25	reduce your consumption.

1 And what I really need is to get somebody 2 that will work efficiently for the home energy audit 3 and speak to me about that. And the only problem that I had, when I 4 5 changed from one checking account to another and I had 6 auto pay and I didn't get any notices that I past due, 7 that it didn't go through or wasn't -- you have a time frame to where it is set up and I didn't get any 8 notices. 10 So that was a problem and they were threatening to shut my electric off and they sent out 11 something on the 7th and I didn't get it until the 9th, 12 13 so you know, I thought that was really unfair, being 14 that I was never a problem before. 15 So, you know, they could be more lenient about notification because no one contacted me, in any 16 17 other way, other than through mail and I had given them my new phone number and checking account number, all of 18 that kind of stuff, a routing number. 19 It just didn't 20 go through, so they didn't get paid. 2.1 But at this point in time, that's all that I have to say. This is more of a fact finding mission, 22 23 right now. 24 JUDGE DIPPELL: All right. 25 MS. NELSON: Thank you.
