**ORDER APPROVING RECONCILIATION OF CONTESTED ISSUES**

Section 386.420.4, RSMo (Supp. 2012) requires the Commission to prepare and approve a detailed reconciliation regarding the dollar value and rate or charge impact of the contested issues decided by the Commission in this case. The law requires the Commission to allow the parties an opportunity to provide written input regarding that reconciliation.

On May 31, 2013, the Office of the Public Counsel filed a motion asking the Commission to direct its Staff to prepare the required reconciliation. The Commission directed Staff to prepare and file the reconciliation by June 4, and allowed other parties until June 5 to respond to the reconciliation. Staff filed the reconciliation on June 4 and Southern Union Company d/b/a Missouri Gas Energy filed a response on June 5. No other party has responded to the reconciliation.


Southern Union does not disagree with the reconciliation filed by Staff, but contends some of the information contained in the reconciliation is not relevant and could be misleading. Despite Southern Union's concerns, the Commission will approve the reconciliation filed by Staff.

The Commission finds that the reconciliation submitted by Staff on June 4, 2013, is an accurate representation of the dollar value and rate or charge impact of the issues decided by the Commission. The Commission further finds that the submitted reconciliation satisfies the requirements of Section 386.420.4, RSMo (Supp. 2012).

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The Reconciliation filed by Staff on June 4, 2013, is approved.
2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
