ORDER REGARDING STIPULATION HEARING

Issue Date: May 28, 2009 Effective Date: May 28, 2009

On September 5, 2008, Kansas City Power & Light Company ("KCPL") submitted to the Commission proposed tariff sheets intended to implement a general rate increase for electrical service provided in its Missouri service area. On April 24, 2009, multiple parties filed a non-unanimous stipulation and agreement purporting to settle all issues in this matter. On the same day, the Commission's Staff and KCPL filed a non-unanimous stipulation and agreement concerning pension and other post-employment benefits. No responses or objections were filed with regard to either agreement.

The Commission has set a date, June 8, 2009, to convene a stipulation hearing for presentation of the agreements. The Commissioners may have questions for the parties' counsel regarding the terms of the agreements or any other factual matters related to KCPL's general rate increase application. Should any party wish to present a witness at the hearing for the purpose of proffering testimony regarding the stipulated facts or terms in the agreements, that party shall be required to disclose the identity, occupational title, and expertise of that witness as directed in the paragraphs below.

All parties are required to bring an adequate number of copies of exhibits that they intend to offer into evidence at the hearing. If an exhibit has not been prefiled, the party offering it should bring, in addition to the copy for the court reporter, copies for the five Commissioners, the Presiding Judge, and all counsel.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. No later than June 3, 2009, any party wishing to present a witness at the stipulation hearing for the purpose of proffering testimony regarding the stipulated facts or terms in the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement or the Non-Unanimous Stipulation and Agreement Regarding Pensions and Other Post Employment Benefits, filed on April 24, 2009, shall disclose the identity of its witness. Unless already included in prefiled testimony, the party proffering the witness shall also disclose the occupational title of that witness, and shall file with the Commission a current resume or curriculum vitae for that witness.
- 2. All parties are required to bring an adequate number of copies of exhibits that they intend to offer into evidence at the on-the-record presentation. If an exhibit has not been prefiled, the party offering it should bring, in addition to the copy for the court reporter, copies for the five Commissioners, the Presiding Judge, and all counsel.

3. This order shall become effective immediately upon issue.
