ORDER GRANTING APPLICATION TO INTERVENE

The Staff of the Public Service Commission has filed a complaint that is pending against Missouri Pipeline Company, LLC; Missouri Gas Company, LLC; Mogas Energy, LLC; United Pipeline Systems, Inc.; and Gateway Pipeline Company, LLC. On May 10, the Municipal Gas Commission of Missouri filed a timely application to intervene. More than ten days have passed since the Municipal Gas Commission applied to intervene and no party has objected to the application to intervene.

The Commission finds that the Municipal Gas Commission has an interest that is different than that of the general public and that its interest may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing the Municipal Gas Commission to intervene will serve the public interest. Therefore, in

accordance with 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Application to Intervene of the Municipal Gas Commission of Missouri is granted.
2. This order shall become effective on May 22, 2006.
