### PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

COMES NOW The Empire District Electric Company ("Empire" or the "Company") on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff"), Praxair, Inc. ("Praxair"), the Office of the Public Counsel ("Public Counsel"), Explorer Pipeline Company ("Explorer") and the Missouri Department of Natural Resources ("DNR") (collectively, the "Parties"), and states the following to the Commission concerning the procedural schedule:

- 1. On May 5, 2004, the Commission issued its Suspension Order and Notice, Order Adopting Protective Order, Order Setting Hearings and Order Directing Filing, wherein, among other things, the Commission set this matter for a prehearing conference on June 3, 2004, and directed that the parties file a proposed procedural schedule by June 10, 2004.
- 2. Also on May 5, 2004, Praxair filed an application to intervene in this case. The Commission granted Praxair's request on May 20, 2004. Applications to intervene were later filed by Explorer and DNR on May 20 and May 25, 2004, respectively. The Commission granted these interventions at the prehearing conference on June 3, 2004.

## PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE

3. The Parties have discussed possible procedural schedules and, as a result, propose the following schedule:

originally set aside two days for a true-up hearing in this case. Because Empire has not requested a true-up, these hearing dates have been eliminated from the proposed schedule.

- 5. The Parties suggest that the identified local public hearings (Joplin and Branson) take place some time during the period October 12-14. The parties leave the specific dates to be determined by the Commission to allow the Commission to take into account the availability of facilities and coordinate the hearings with the Commission's schedule.
- 6. Lastly, the Parties agree that during the course of this case parties propounding data requests will contemporaneously send copies of such requests (requests only, not answers or responses) to all other parties.

#### **AGREEMENT**

7. Counsel for the Parties have given the undersigned authority to file this pleading on their behalf.

WHEREFORE, the Parties respectfully request that the Commission issue its order adopting the procedural schedule proposed herein.
