For the Missouri Retailers? Nobody on the phone for 22 23 Missouri Retailers? 24 The unions asked to be excused, and I did excuse them from the hearing with the understanding 25

- 3 MR. ROBERTSON: Henry Robertson, Great

- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. Consumers Counsel?
- 8 MR. COFFMAN: This is John B. Coffman,
- 9 appearing on behalf of the Consumers Council of
- 10 Missouri, 871 Tuxedo Boulevard, St. Louis, MO,
- 11 63119.
- 12 JUDGE WOODRUFF: And Midwest Energy
- 13 Consumers?
- MR. WOODSMALL: David Woodsmall on behalf
- of MECG.
- 16 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And I believe that
- 17 takes care of all the parties who have applied to
- 18 intervene. Anyone join us from Missouri retailers
- 19 yet?
- Okay. The first thing I want to take care
- 21 of today are there's several applications to
- 22 intervene that have been filed fairly recently, or
- 23 at least within the last ten days. Did someone
- 24 just join us?
- Okay. And I'll go through them one by one

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- 1 and ask if anybody has any objections to these
- 2 applications to intervene. And if there is no --
- 3 if there are no objections, I'll just go ahead and
- 4 rule on them today from the Bench.
- 5 First of all, application to intervene
- 6 from Renew Missouri. Any objections? Okay. That
- 7 application will be granted.
- 8 For the Missouri Division of Energy's --
- 9 Department -- Department of Economic Development,
- 10 Division of Energy? Any objections?
- 11 MR. LOWERY: No.
- 12 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Hearing none, they will
- 13 be admitted into the case. Application to
- 14 intervene for City of O'Fallon and City of Ballwin?
- 15 Any objections? They will also be allowed to
- 16 intervene.
- 17 The Missouri Retailers Association? Any
- 18 objections? Their motion will -- application to
- 19 intervene will be granted, also.
- 20 Application to intervene by International
- 21 Brotherhood of Electrical Workers, Local Union
- 22 1439, any objections? Their application will be
- 23 granted.
- 24 Application to intervene for Sierra Club?
- 25 Any objections? Their application will be granted.

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- Application to intervene by Metro 1
- 2 Resources Defense Counsel? Any objections?
- 3 MR. LOWERY: No.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Their application will be 4
- 5 granted. Consumers Counsel, application to
- 6 intervene, any objections? They will -- their
- 7 application will also be granted.
- And Midwest Energy Consumers Group, any 8
- objections? Their application will also be 9
- 10 granted. And I believe that takes care of all the
- 11 applications to intervene.
- 12 The main purpose of bringing you here
- 13 today was to get you to come up with a proposed
- procedural schedule. And by previous order, I'd 14
- 15 ask that that be submitted to the Commission by
- 16 August 15th.
- 17 The operational law date in this case is
- May 30th. That means the Commission will generally 18
- like to try and issue their orders about 30 days 19
- before the operational law date. That takes us 20
- 21 April 29th, the final agenda that would fall within
- 22 that time frame.
- 23 And I'm assuming we probably want to have
- 24 final briefs by the first week of April to give you
- roughly 30 days to -- to write the order. That 25

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- 1 means we'd be looking at hearing dates in late
- 2 January or early February, which is coming up very
- 3 fast. So let that guide your discussions.
- 4 And if there's anything else as far as
- 5 test year issues and so forth, if you want to bring
- 6 those up in filings, you can do that as well.
- 7 Anything else anybody wants to take up
- 8 while we're on the record?
- 9 MR. LOWERY: Your Honor, I will just
- 10 mention that the Staff had proposed and circulated
- 11 to the company and other parties a schedule that
- 12 did have -- did contemplate a report and order --
- 13 final vote on May the 6th.
- I don't know whether there's any
- 15 flexibility at all from your perspective or not.
- 16 And then hearings that would have been starting
- 17 about February 23rd, so a slightly -- slightly
- 18 longer -- probably about a week different than what
- 19 maybe you had in your mind.
- 20 And I'd just throw that out there. I know
- 21 the Staff and company had agreed upon it, and we
- 22 haven't heard from the other parties. But my sense
- 23 was there might have been some consensus around
- 24 that schedule.
- 25 JUDGE WOODRUFF: You can propose it. And

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- 1 if we -- if the Commissioners don't want to accept
- 2 it, then I'll let you know.
- 3 MR. LOWERY: Sure. It would be -- it
- 4 would be, I think, essentially the same track that
- 5 we had on the last case.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And the reason we
- 7 like to do that, getting the orders out 30 days
- 8 before the operational law date is just so there's
- 9 less confusion and less issues involving the -- the
- 10 compliance tariffs.
- MR. LOWERY: Absolutely. We share that.
- 12 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And that's the
- 13 reason I said that for the 29th. But if --
- MR. LOWERY: We'll visit about it. I just
- 15 wanted to let you know that we had been floating
- 16 that, and it was one -- basically, one week
- 17 difference than what you had --
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: I'm not going to
- 19 categorically reject it at this point. So --
- MR. LOWERY: Okay. Thank you.
- JUDGE WOODRUFF: Anything else anybody
- 22 wants to bring up? All right. Then I'll leave you
- 23 to your discussions. And the on-the-record portion
- 24 of this proceeding is adjourned then. You can
- 25 discuss this as you like. Thank you.
