PROCEEDINGS

1
2 MS. QUICK: We will go ahead
3 and get started. It's a little bit after
4 12:00 noon.

5 I would like to thank everyone for
6 attending this afternoon's virtual public
7 hearing to the Evergy Missouri Metro electric
8 rate case.

9 My name is Debbie Quick and I am a
10 member of the Public Service Commission staff.
11 I will facilitate the question and answer
12 session for the hearing.

13 This hearing is streaming live on
14 the Public Service Commission website. I have
15 muted all the lines to reduce any excess
16 noise.

17 I would like to provide you with a
18 brief overview of the hearing process. There
19 will be two parts to this public hearing: An
20 informal and formal session.

21 The first part is the question and
22 answer session. This is the informal part of
23 the hearing where you will be able to ask any
24 questions you may have about the case.

25 I will ask representatives from

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the Public Service Commission staff, Office of Public Counsel, which is the consumer advocate, Evergy Missouri, and other parties to the case to introduce themselves shortly.

They will be able to answer any questions you may have.

This part of the hearing will stream live on the Commission's website, but will not be recorded or on the record.

The judge and commissioners don't participate in this part of the hearing since the case is still being decided.

There is a general information sheet about the rate case on the Public Service Commission's website, which is PSC.MO.GOV if you would like to have more information.

The sheet is accessible from the home page. If you have trouble accessing the information sheet, you may contact the Public Service Commission's consumer information department, and that's 800-392-4211, and staff will be able to assist you.

The second part of today's hearing is the comment or testimony session with the

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judge and commissioners.

During this formal part of the hearing, your statement will be on the record, so it will be recorded and will become a part of the case file. You won't be able to ask questions in the second part of the hearing since the case is still active.

The commissioners will review the filings in the case record to make their decision on the case, so it is important for you to have your comment be a part of the record.

The judge, commissioners, or counsel for the parties may ask you a question, but you can't ask a question.

Again, the second part of the hearing is on the record with the court reporter transcribing the comments. The court reporter will not transcribe the question and answer session, but the question and answer session is also streaming live on the website.

At this point, I'd like to ask the representatives to un-mute their lines and identify themselves when introduced.

I will begin with the Evergy

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Missouri representative.

DARRIN IVES: So, this is Darrin Ives with Evergy Missouri, and I will be providing the comments for the meeting today.

DEBBIE QUICK: All right. Thank you. Public Service Commission staff.

KAREN LYONS: This is Karen Lyons. I am a member of the Public Service Commission staff.

There are also several other, I believe, Commission Staff members attending this local public hearing so we will be able to answer any questions that you may have.

DEBBIE QUICK: Okay. Thank you. Office of Public Counsel.

JOHN CLIZER: Good afternoon. My name is John Clizer. I am an attorney with the Missouri Office of Public Counsel, and I will be here to answer any questions that may be posed. Thank you.

DEBBIE QUICK: Okay. Thank you. If there are any other parties in the case who would like to address questions and make a statement, please speak up and let me

1 know.

2 Okay. Hearing none, if you are
3 joining us on video, there is a chat feature.
4 This feature is not a part of the record. If
5 you have questions, you may use the chat
6 feature and we will try to answer your
7 questions as time allows.

8 If you would like to make a
9 comment to the Commission, please make your
10 comment in the second part of the hearing so
11 that it is part of the record, not in the chat
12 feature.

13 I would also like to ask the
14 representatives to identify themselves before
15 answering questions for those who are not on
16 video.

17 When you ask a question, please
18 un-mute your line. You may need to press star
19 six if you are joining the hearing by phone.

20 Unless you are speaking, please
21 make sure your line is muted to eliminate any
22 excess noise so everyone will be able to hear
23 the questions and answers.

24 Okay. We will go ahead and begin.
25 Please speak up if you have a question and we

1 will answer the questions one at a time.

2 (Off the record portion of
3 proceedings.)

4 JUDGE HATCHER: Good afternoon
5 everyone. This is Judge Hatcher. We are
6 getting everyone connected and then we will
7 get started with the hearing portion.

8 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN:
9 Commission Holsman is here.

10 JUDGE HATCHER: Excellent.
11 Thank you, Commissioner.

12 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: Good
13 afternoon.

14 COMMISSIONER Rupp:
15 Commissioner Rupp is in.

16 JUDGE HATCHER: Good
17 afternoon, Commissioner.

18 COMMISSIONER KOLKMEYER:
19 Commissioner Kolkmeier is here.

20 JUDGE HATCHER: Good
21 afternoon, Commissioner KOLKMEYER.

22 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: Judge,
23 if I have a stretch of land here where I lose
24 signal, I will call back in, but just wanted
25 to let you know.

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JUDGE HATCHER: Absolutely.
Thank you, Commissioner. I appreciate that.

MAIDA COLEMAN: Commissioner
Coleman is here.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you,
Commissioner Coleman. Good afternoon.

MAIDA Coleman: Good
afternoon. I will be going to mute status.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you.
Understood.

All right. Let's go ahead and do
we have our court reporter, Miss Hearst?

REPORTER: I am on the line.

JUDGE HATCHER: On the record
then.

First, I would just ask that
everyone mute themselves unless they are
speaking. This will cut down on the noise
level and prevent any audio feedback.

Good afternoon to everyone, thank
everyone for their attendance in joining
today.

For the record, today is August
8th, 2022. The Missouri Public Service
Commission has set this time aside for a local

1 public hearing to give members of the public a
2 chance to comment about Evergy Missouri
3 Metro's electric general rate increase
4 application, and that's file number
5 ER-2022-0129.

6 There might also be some witnesses
7 here for Evergy Missouri West. They also have
8 a concurrent rate increase application going
9 on. Those local public hearings will be
10 tomorrow and there will be a combined hearing
11 Wednesday at noon.

12 The Missouri Public Service
13 Commission regulates the rates charged by
14 public utility companies in Missouri to ensure
15 that those rates are just and reasonable.

16 The Commission also regulates the
17 quality of service and safety of the
18 operations of public utilities.

19 The Commission is made up of five
20 commissioners. The commissioners are
21 appointed by the governor to fix terms and
22 confirmed by the senate.

23 The commissioners employ a staff
24 of engineers, accountants, attorneys,
25 financial analysts and other specialists in

1 the field of utility regulation.

2 My name is Charles Hatcher. I am
3 the regulatory law judge and will preside over
4 this hearing.

5 As you heard at the introductions,
6 all of the Missouri Public Service Commission
7 commissioners are in attendance.

8 With me today, for the record, are
9 Chairman Ryan Silvey; Commissioners Scott
10 Rupp, Maida Coleman, Jason Holsman, and Glen
11 Kolkmeyer.

12 This is an official hearing of the
13 Missouri Public Service Commission and the
14 statements and witnesses, testimony of
15 witnesses will be recorded by a court reporter
16 and are given under oath.

17 The Commission has not made any
18 decisions in this case. I want to make that
19 very clear. This is an ongoing case. And
20 because it is an ongoing case, that also means
21 that the commissioners and myself aren't
22 available to answer questions.

23 They have to remain impartial
24 until after all of the evidence is presented
25 in the case.

1 Let's go ahead and start with
2 entries of appearance for the record for
3 Every Metro.

4 ROGER STEINER: Good
5 afternoon, Roger Steiner appearing for Every
6 Metro. My address is 1200 Main Street, Kansas
7 City, Missouri, Suite 1600. That's zip code
8 64105. Thanks.

9 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you very
10 much. And for the staff of the Commission.

11 ERIC VANDERGRIFF: Good
12 afternoon everyone. I am Eric Vandergriff
13 from the staff counsel's office. My
14 address -- well, representing Missouri Public
15 Service Commission staff. My address is PO
16 Box 360, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City.
17 The zip code is 65102.

18 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you.
19 And Office of the Public Counsel.

20 JOHN CLIZER: Good afternoon.
21 John Clizer appearing on behalf of the
22 Missouri Office of the Public Counsel.

23 My business address is Governor
24 Office Building, Suite 650, 200 Madison
25 Street, PO Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri

1 65102. Thank you.

2 JUDGE HATCHER: Excellent.

3 Thank you.

4 We have a number of intervenors in
5 the case. I am not going to do a roll call
6 for any of those attorneys that are present.

7 If anyone would like to be
8 recorded on the record as being present, would
9 they go ahead and speak up now? This is for
10 the attorneys of the other parties.

11 Okay. We will move on. The
12 process is going to be calling the names that
13 I have listed on the pre-registration, and I
14 am just going to call them in the order that
15 they appear.

16 When I do call your name, please
17 go ahead and un-mute and if you would, speak
18 up. It's a weird way of how Webex works, but
19 that will bring you to everyone's front screen
20 and then I will place you under oath and ask
21 you to state and spell your name, and then ask
22 for your comments on the rate case.

23 If you are calling in, to un-mute,
24 you press star six. That's star six if you
25 called in on a telephone or the telephone

1 function of your smart phone.

2 The first name I have on the list
3 is Dawn Rice. Dawn Rice.

4 JOHN CLIZER: Your Honor?

5 JUDGE HATCHER: Yes.

6 JOHN CLIZER: There is a Dawn
7 in the list of participants, but she is muted.

8 JUDGE HATCHER: We will come
9 back. She might have stepped away for just a
10 moment.

11 And for anyone that did not
12 pre-register and would like to testify, I will
13 ask for those witnesses at the end of my list
14 of pre-registered witness.

15 I have two more pre-registered. I
16 have Beth Pauley, P-A-U-L-E-Y.

17 Okay. We will give Miss Pauley a
18 minute. We will come back around and call her
19 again.

20 Jenn DeRose.

21 JENN DEROSE: That's me. Hi.

22 JUDGE HATCHER: Yes, Miss
23 DeRose. Let's go ahead and get you sworn in.

24 (Witness is sworn in by the
25 judge.)

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JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you.

Would you please state and spell your last name for the record.

A Yes. It's DeRose, D-E, capital R-O-S-E.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you.

And Miss DeRose, please go ahead and give us your comments.

JENN DEROSE: Thank you so much. Thank you all for the opportunity to testify today. My name is Jenn DeRose, and I am Missouri's Beyond Coal campaign representative to the Sierra Club, which is the nation's oldest environmental organization.

Our Missouri chapter alone has over 10,000 members and over 45,000 supporters.

I am here to discuss how Evergy's proposed rate increases will impact vulnerable populations, fail to address the climate crisis, and fail to provide the most affordable, reliable energy to its customers.

Evergy spends nearly \$500 million a year on coal imported from Wyoming. That's

1 just the fuel, not counting the hundreds of
2 millions of dollars spent on keeping outdated,
3 heavily polluting plants running every year.

4 Coal costs, like all fossil fuel
5 costs are variable and unpredictable. These
6 costs are passed down to customers who are
7 increasingly unable to pay their bills.

8 We expect Evergy's requested rate
9 increase to add an extra \$100 a year for
10 Evergy's Missouri customers.

11 Thirteen percent of Missourians
12 live below the poverty line, meaning they are
13 already at risk of energy insecurity, a high
14 energy burden, which means that they pay a
15 much higher percentage of their income to keep
16 their electricity on than they can afford.

17 In the Kansas City region, in
18 Evergy territory, low income Black and Latino
19 communities experience an energy burden
20 averaging double of that of white communities.

21 As a monopoly utility, Evergy
22 should be using the best available resources
23 and tech to run its business. Instead, it
24 continues to invest heavily in coal, a
25 generation source that is two to four times

1 more expensive than reliable clean energy
2 options, as well as being harmful to human
3 health and the environment.

4 Eighty percent of coal plants in
5 the United States are more expensive to
6 operate than building and operating wind and
7 solar facilities, according to a recent report
8 from Energy Innovation.

9 As the climate warms, water
10 shortages become more common, even in
11 water-rich Missouri. According to NERC's
12 Reliability Assessment for 2022, drought
13 conditions can cause low water levels in the
14 rivers that are depended on by utilities for
15 cooling purposes, and this could create
16 reliability issues as climate change continues
17 to wreck havoc on our weather patterns.

18 And of course, climate change is
19 worsened by the burning of coal, creating a
20 vicious cycle of heat and drought that can be
21 catastrophic for grid reliability.

22 Look no further than the last two
23 weeks in St. Louis for ample evidence of
24 climate catastrophes. It's sort of a
25 harbinger of what is to come.

1 Now, renewable's including wind
2 and solar, along with energy efficiency,
3 demand --

4 JUDGE HATCHER: Miss DeRose?

5 JENN DEROSE: Yes, sir.

6 JUDGE HATCHER: I see that you
7 are a party in the case, and I just want to
8 make sure that your testimony here at the
9 public hearing isn't overlapping with the
10 pre-filed testimony from Sierra Club.

11 JENN DEROSE: No, it should
12 not be.

13 JUDGE HATCHER: Okay. A
14 couple more minutes. Please go ahead.

15 JENN DEROSE: Oh, sure. Thank
16 you kindly.

17 So, where was I? I guess we can
18 skip to the end.

19 I would really appreciate
20 disallowing continued investments in outdated
21 tech and modern modeling for future IRP's to
22 save customers money and invest in the health
23 and well being of our community.

24 And I do truly appreciate this
25 opportunity to testify. I really appreciate

1 these public hearings.

2 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you very
3 much. Are there any commissioner questions
4 for Miss DeRose?

5 Thank you all. Miss DeRose, you
6 are excused from our virtual witness stand, so
7 to speak.

8 I am going to circle back and ask
9 for the first two names of witnesses, and that
10 is Dawn Rice. Miss Dawn Rice and Beth Pauley.

11 Okay. I am not hearing anyone
12 speak up. Let's go ahead and open it to
13 anyone else that is on the Webex or the
14 call-in.

15 Anyone else wish to testify?

16 JOHN CLIZER: Your Honor, I
17 apologize. I assume that you mentioned this
18 earlier, but I want to remind participants
19 that anyone who has called in would need to
20 hit star six to un-mute themselves, otherwise
21 we will not be able to hear them. Sorry.

22 JUDGE HATCHER: No. Excellent
23 point. Excellent point.

24 If you have called in on a phone,
25 it is star six to un-mute.

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Thank you very much, Mr. Clizer.

I will give it one more minute,
and then we will go ahead and close our
hearing today.

Once again, we are looking for
testimony from Dawn Rice, Beth Pauley or
anyone interested from the Webex audience.

Okay. With that, I would like to
thank all of our participants today for their
testimony.

I would ask if there is any
closing remarks from any of our commissioners
today, and again for the record, we have all
five of our commissioners in attendance today.

MR. SILVEY: No remarks.

MR. Rupp: Thank you, Judge, I
have no remarks.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you,
Chairman. Thank you, Commissioner Rupp.

MR. HOLSMAN: Thank you,
Judge. No remarks.

JUDGE HATCHER: Thank, you
Commissioner Holsman.

If anyone does have any additional
comments or they know of someone who could not

1 be present and would like to make a comment,
2 you may make written comments by going to the
3 PSC's web page, and that's PSC.MO.GOV.

4 You can also ask questions of the
5 Office of the Public Counsel. Their web --

7 This hearing is now adjourned and
8 we are off the record.
