2	and the Consumers Council of Missouri, John B.

5	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you.
6	And we'll go back to MIEC and let
7	Ms. Holesteck enter her appearance.
8	MS. HOLESTECK: Diana Holesteck of Bryan
9	Cave, LLC, 211 North Broadway, Suite 3600, St. Louis,
10	Missouri 63102.
11	JUDGE WOODRUFF: For the Midwest Energy
12	Users.
13	MR. WOODSMALL: Thank you, your Honor.
14	Appearing on behalf of MEUA, David Woodsmall. I
15	previously entered my written appearance with my
16	address.
17	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. And Missouri
18	American Water, Jim Riechard sent me or actually
19	phoned yesterday and indicated he won't be here.
20	He's involved with a collaborative with other
21	elements of the staff, specifically with Jim Bush,
22	but he would not be able to be here for this portion
23	of it.
24	That's all the parties that have
25	currently been allowed to intervene. There are other

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1	applications to intervene pending. I'll go through
2	those.
3	NRDC, Renew Missouri, are they here?
4	(No response.)
5	JUDGE WOODRUFF: DNR?
6	MS. FRAZIER: Yes, your Honor. Jenny
7	Frazier with the Attorney General's Office appearing
8	for the Department of Natural Resources, P.O. Box
9	899, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
10	JUDGE WOODRUFF: For the Municipal Group?
11	(No response.)
12	JUDGE WOODRUFF: No?
13	And for the unions?
14	(No response.)
15	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. As I
16	indicated, there are some pending intervention
17	requests. I'll deal with those. First of all, the
18	Municipal Group, they initially filed their
19	application to intervene on the 23rd of September and
20	filed an amended application to intervene adding some
21	additional cities on September 29.
22	Does anyone object to the Municipal
23	Group's application to intervene?
24	MR. LOWERY: No, your Honor.
25	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Hearing no objections, I

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1	will grant their application to intervene, and for
2	all these I'll issue a notice so that it will appear
3	in the record also that the intervention has been
4	granted.
5	For DNR, they applied to intervene on
6	September 28. Does anyone object to the DNR's
7	intervention?
8	MR. LOWERY: NO.
9	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Hearing no objections,
10	that will also be granted.
11	And we've got the application to
12	intervene from IBEW and the Operating Engineer's
13	Union. That was filed on October 4.
14	Any objection to their request to
15	intervene?
16	(No response.)
17	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Hearing none, that would
18	also be granted.
19	The final application to intervene was
20	from NRDC and Renew Missouri. I was hoping they
21	would be here. NRDC, I don't have any problem with
22	that. The questionable portion of that application
23	to intervene is for Renew Missouri. Renew Missouri
24	is described as a project of Missouri Coalition for
25	the Environment. I don't believe that we can allow a

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1	project to intervene. Probably Missouri
2	Coalition for the Environment would be an
3	appropriate intervener.
4	I'm not going to make a ruling on
5	this case, but I will ask if any parties have
6	any objection to NRDC or Renew Missouri.
7	MR. BYRNE: We may. If it's not an
8	appropriate party to intervene, we probably do
9	object to a project intervening.
10	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. At this
11	point I'm going to defer making a ruling on the
12	NRDC and Renew Missouri application to
13	intervene. we'll deal with that later through
14	an agenda order. All right. I believe that
15	takes care of all the intervening party
16	requests.
17	Another matter of the Test Year and
18	True-Up, the order that I issued suspending this
19	True-Up indicated that the parties were to take
20	a position by last week on Test Year and True-
21	Up.
22	Several parties requested more time
23	to do that, to take those positions, so I'll
24	allow them until October 19 for the parties to
25	make those positions if they haven't already.

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1	And several parties indicated that
2	that would be a preferable path for the
3	Commission to take in future cases as well, and
4	I agree. In the future you can expect those
5	kind of orders. And I discussed that with all
6	the other judges as well and learned that most
7	of them already do it that way and I'm the one
8	that's lagging behind.
9	The only other matter that I have is
10	that the proposed procedural schedule and local
11	public hearing recommendations are due by
12	October 19 in terms of the previous order, so
13	I'll leave that to discussion.
14	Is there anything else that anyone
15	wants to bring up while we're on the record?
16	(No response.)
17	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Hearing nothing,
18	then yes, Mr. Dottheim.
19	MR. DOTTHEIM: Yes, Judge. I was
20	wondering if you might give us an idea if you
21	foresee Nebraska going to the Big 10, whether
22	that in any manner might affect this proceeding.
23	JUDGE WOODRUFF: I don't think it
24	will have any effect. I will note that I expect
25	Nebraska to be playing for national championship

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1	this year, so don't schedule any public hearings
2	on that date.
3	MR. DOTTHEIM: We most definitely
4	will keep that in mind.
5	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Thank
6	you very much.
7	With that, then, the on-the-record
8	portion of this prehearing conference is
9	adjourned.
