ORDER SUSPENDING TARIFF

On August 31, 2011, Kansas City Power & Light Company (KCP&L) filed an Advanced Metering Infrastructure Home Area Network Pilot Program tariff. KCP&L's tariff carries a 30-day effective date that would put the tariff in effect on September 30. The Commission's Staff filed a motion on September 27, indicating that it has found that the filed tariff is incorrect and should not be allowed to become effective by operation of law. Staff asks the Commission to suspend that tariff long enough to allow KCP&L to withdraw and replace the tariff.

KCP&L has not yet responded to Staff's motion, but, unless suspended, the tariff will go into effect by operation of law before KCP&L can respond. Therefore, based on Staff's motion, the Commission will suspend KCP&L's tariff for a period of 15 days as permitted by Section 393.150.1, RSMo 2000. The Commission will also direct KCP&L to respond to Staff's motion in an expedited manner.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The tariff submitted under Tariff File No. JE-2012-0101 on August 31, 2011, by Kansas City Power & Light Company is suspended from September 30, 2011, to October 14, 2011.

3. Kansas City Power & Light Company shall respond to Staff's Motion to Suspend Tariff no later than October 6, 2011.
