1 LOCAL PUBLIC HEARING AT

2 ST. JOSEPH, MISSOURI

3 THE COURT: We can go ahead go on the
4 record. We are on the record. This is Case Number
5 ER-2018-0145 and ER-20018-0146. Missouri Public
6 Service Commission has set this time for local
7 public hearing in these cases in which Kansas City
8 Power and Light Company and Greater Missouri
9 Operations Company's request to implement a general
10 rate increase.

11 My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the
12 regulatory law judge assigned to preside over this
13 hearing, and I have with me today Commissioner
14 Silvey. I think you probably heard earlier that I
15 will hear all the evidence and testimony in these
16 cases and make an ultimate decision.

17 We are going to begin today. I'm going to
18 ask the attorneys to make entries of appearance and
19 then I will start with the people who signed up to
20 say they wanted to testify. I will go down the
21 list. If you want to testify, I will ask you to
22 come forward to the podium there. I will swear you
23 in, ask you to swear or affirm to tell the truth and
24 then you can give us your general comments.

25 I will ask you to stay at the podium

1 unless we have some clarifying question we would
2 like to ask you. I will also ask you to state and
3 spell your name.

4 This is your opportunity to make comments
5 to the Commission about the rate proposal. All of
6 your comments will be taken down by the court
7 reporter and the commissioners who are not here
8 today will have the opportunity then to read all of
9 those comments and they will be made part of the
10 official record.

11 If you didn't sign up and you decide later
12 you would like to testify, that's perfectly fine.
13 When I get to the end my list, I will ask if there
14 is anybody else who would like to testify and you
15 can let me know at that time.

16 I won't be asking the attorneys if they
17 have any questions. If you wanted to clarify
18 something of somebody's testimony, kind of wave at
19 me and let me know and I will let you talk.

20 We don't have an overly large crowd today
21 so I'm not going to at this time set any kind of
22 time limit on the comments. I will ask you to be
23 respectful and aware of everyone's time here today.

24 So with that being said then, I think we
25 will begin with counsel making his appearance.

1 Is there counsel present for KCP&L?

2 MR. HACK: Robert Hack on behalf of KCP&L
3 and Greater Missouri Operations Company's and Kansas
4 City Power and Light Company, 1200 Main Street,
5 Kansas City, Missouri 64105. Thank you.

6 THE COURT: Thank you. Commission staff?

7 MR. IRVING: Yes. Ryan Irving, the court
8 reporter has my information.

9 THE COURT: Public Counsel?

10 MR. SMITH: Ryan Smith with the Office of
11 the Public Counsel. The court reporter was given my
12 information, thank you.

13 THE COURT: Any interveners that needed to
14 make an entry of appearance?

15 Seeing none, we can go ahead and begin
16 with the first person I have on the list, Jerome
17 Williams.

18 Mr. Williams, please raise your right
19 hand.

20 JEROME WILLIAMS,
21 of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to
22 testify the truth, the whole truth, and
23 nothing but the truth in the case aforesaid,
24 deposes and says in reply to oral

EXAMINATION

THE COURT: Could you still your name for the court reporter, please?

THE WITNESS: Jerome Williams.
J-E-R-O-M-E, W-I-L-L-I-A-M-S.

THE COURT: Thank you, go ahead.

THE WITNESS: As I was talking during the question period, my main thing was street light safety. They changed the lights to LED lights and they are not as bright as the ones that were there before. I told them that, well, my daughter's license plate was stolen right off the front of her car right there underneath the light where you could actually, supposed to be able to see somebody if they are taking it.

I had someone, all I can call is vandals going down the street checking doors of cars as they were leaving. You couldn't tell what color clothes they were wearing, what color their skin was, you just couldn't see at all period. I was just wondering if they were saving money by putting in LED lights instead of something a little bit more brighter, we are still going to need to talk about that.

The Missouri Public Service Commission

1 gave us a public comment form that I found out today
2 that is a form that you as a Commission can see, but
3 it is not really putting in the record as an
4 affidavit where you swear to it.

5 Why are they, sorry for that question.
6 They shouldn't be even giving out the paper if it is
7 not an official form letter to let your feelings be
8 known.

9 That's pretty much all I have to say.
10 Thank you for your time.

11 THE COURT: Let me ask you just one
12 question, Mr. Williams. Which city do you live in?

13 THE WITNESS: I live in St. Joseph,
14 Missouri.

15 THE COURT: Okay. And I will say that
16 while those official forms are not sworn to or
17 anything, our staff does look and read every one of
18 those comments. And so they take that into
19 consideration when they're formulating their
20 testimony and presenting stuff to the Commission.

21 So those comments are still important to
22 the Commission and we --

23 THE WITNESS: They're not really official
24 comments, but they're comments that you look at,
25 thank you.

1 THE COURT: Thank you for your testimony.

2 MR. SILVEY: Thank you for your testimony.

3 THE COURT: Sharon Jones.

4 SHARON JONES,
5 of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to
6 testify the truth, the whole truth, and
7 nothing but the truth in the case aforesaid,
8 deposes and says in reply to oral
9 interrogatories, propounded as follows, to-wit:

10 EXAMINATION

11 THE COURT: Can you spell your name for
12 the court reporter, please?

13 A Sharon Jones. S-H-A-R-O-N, J-O-N-E-S.

14 THE COURT: Will you give us your
15 comments, please?

16 A Basically reverting back to the
17 question/answer. Why it is that everything we have
18 to have or need in our daily life or just our lives,
19 somebody is wanting more money for it. And also the
20 Public Service Commission used to really protect us
21 consumers. Are they still doing that, or they out
22 to sell us out?

23 Every increase on every utility that
24 comes up, they seem to approve. And it just gets
25 harder and harder, especially senior citizens who

1 are on fixed incomes. That's basically it.

2 THE COURT: Okay. Thank you for your
3 comments, ma'am.

4 THE WITNESS: Thank you.

5 MR. SILVEY: Thank you.

6 THE COURT: Bill McMurray.

7 BILL MCMURRAY,
8 of lawful age, having been first duly sworn to
9 testify the truth, the whole truth, and
10 nothing but the truth in the case aforesaid,
11 deposes and says in reply to oral
12 interrogatories, propounded as follows, to-wit:

13 EXAMINATION

14 THE COURT: Thank you. Please spell your
15 name?

16 A B-I-L-L, M-C-M-U-R-R-A-Y. I'm the mayor
17 of St. Joseph. You're sitting in my chair, I hope
18 you enjoy it.

19 THE COURT: I put your chair over here,
20 Mr. Mayor, it was a little intimidating to me.

21 THE WITNESS: I'm not intimidating. I did
22 read the article about Ameren decreasing rates
23 6 percent and I guess it was kind of ill timed given
24 the request today. KCP&L's request for a rate
25 increase. They do mention that part of the

1 justification for this is dropping from 35 percent
2 to 21 percent after federal tax cuts enacted by the
3 Trump Administration.

4 So, you know, I did hear explanations
5 here. You know, a couple dollars a month is not
6 going to impact me particularly, but it is going to
7 impact a lot of citizens of St. Joseph. A lot of
8 our people are on fixed incomes. It has been quoted
9 that we have a poverty rate of like 20 percent or
10 greater in St. Joseph, Missouri. We also have the
11 sewer rate problem. Those rates increased
12 significantly, I might add by the previous council,
13 but in their defense as a result of an EPA mandate.

14 So our council, we are in week number 13
15 of the new council, we did not approve a rate
16 increase for the sewer rates for this year, zero
17 percent increase. So no increase this year.

18 And I would just ask the Public Service
19 Commission consider doing the same in light of the
20 very difficult time that so many of our citizens in
21 St. Joseph have just with sustenance issues. A
22 couple dollars a month means a great deal to someone
23 who is on a fixed income, someone who is living
24 below the property line.

25 I also understand that the commercial

1 customer will see a slight decrease. I have been
2 told like .6 percent. I would hope that the
3 Commission would consider at least giving an equal
4 decrease to the residential customers of .6 percent.
5 Let's be fair across the board to all customers.

6 I love KCP&L, I appreciate Senator Hegeman
7 and RT Turner. They both talk to me and keep me
8 updated on things. I hope to still have a good
9 working relationship after my testimony and I
10 certainly appreciate St. Joe Light and Power.

11 My dad was an employee for 40 years and
12 when he died, he was vice-president of operations
13 and it was his pension that helped send me through
14 college. I'm particularly grateful. All right.
15 Thank you.

16 THE COURT: Thank you, Mr. Mayor.

17 MR. SILVEY: Thank you.

18 THE COURT: Marnie Novak.

19 MR. NOVAK: I choose to pass.

20 THE COURT: That's all the names I had on
21 my list. Is there anyone else who would like to
22 testify?

23 All right. Seeing none, we do really
24 appreciate all of your comments. We appreciate you
25 coming and asking your questions and your questions

1 being answered. We appreciate your comments. If
2 you want to go ahead and put those in or know
3 someone who couldn't be here today. With that being
4 said, then I believe that will conclude the public
5 hearing. We can go off the record. Thank you.
