1 PROCEEDINGS 2 JUDGE RUTH: Good morning. We're here for a prehearing conference in 3 Case No. ER-2004-0034 regarding Aquila's request for rate 4 increases in their electric and steam rates. 5 6 Case No. ER-2004-0024 regarding the steam rates 7 has been consolidated into the lead case, which is 8 ER-2004-0034, and is titled in the matter of Aquila, Inc. 9 d/b/a Aquila Networks - L & P and Aquila Networks - MPS 10 to implement a general rate increase in electricity. 11 Judge Kennard Jones is assigned to this case. He's not able to be here today, so I will be conducting 12 the prehearing conference only, and my name is 13 14 Vicky Ruth. Today's date is August 25th and it is 15 10:05 a.m. 16 I'd like to begin by taking entries of 17 18 appearance. 19 And, Aquila, let's begin with you, please. 20 MR. SWEARENGEN: Thank you, Your Honor. Let the record show the appearance of 21 22 James C. Swearengen and Dean Cooper on behalf of 23 Aquila, Inc. 24 We are with the firm of Brydon, Swearengen & 25 England, Professional Corporation. Our address is

1 312 East Capitol Avenue, Jefferson City, Missouri. 2 Thank you. JUDGE RUTH: For the interveners, I believe, 3 Mr. Conrad, are you representing several? 4 MR. CONRAD: Yes, Your Honor. 5 6 Stuart W. Conrad, the law firm of Finnegan, Conrad and Peterson, 3100 Broadway, Suite 1209, 7 8 Kansas City, Missouri 64111. 9 I'm here on behalf of, in the ER case, 10 Sedalia Industrial Energy Users Association and Ag Processing, Inc., and in the HR case on behalf of 11 Aq Processing, Inc. 12 13 JUDGE RUTH: Thank you. 14 And representing the Federal Executive 15 Agencies. MAJOR PAULSON: Yes. Major Craig Paulson from 16 the Air Force Utility Litigation Team. 17 JUDGE RUTH: Can you go ahead and give your 18 address for the record. 19 MAJOR PAULSON: It's going to take a minute. 20 I've been there a short time. 21 22 My address is -- these are all capitals --23 acronym, AFLSA/ULT, 139 Barnes Drive, Suite 1, Tyndall 24 Air Force Base, Florida 32403-5319. 25 JUDGE RUTH: Thank you.

1 Okay. Mr. Comley.

2 MR. COMLEY: Let the record reflect the entry of appearance of Mark W. Comley, Newman, Comley & Ruth 3 PC, 601 Monroe, Suite 301, Jefferson City, Missouri, 4 appearing on behalf of the City of Kansas City. 5 6 JUDGE RUTH: And representing DNR. MS. WOODS: Your Honor, Shelley Woods, 7 8 Assistant Attorney General, representing the Missouri 9 Department of Natural Resources. Our address is 10 Post Office Box 899, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. JUDGE RUTH: Thank you. 11 12 Staff. MR. WILLIAMS: Nathan Williams and Steven 13 14 Dottheim representing the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission. Address is P. O. Box 360, 15 Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. 16 17 JUDGE RUTH: Thank you. 18 And Public Counsel. 19 MR. COFFMAN: Appearing on behalf of the Office of the Public Counsel, John B. Coffman and 20 Douglas E. Micheel, P. O. Box 7800, Jefferson City, 21 22 Missouri 65102. 23 JUDGE RUTH: For the record, is Mr. Micheel 24 present today? 25 MR. COFFMAN: He's not here today.

1 JUDGE RUTH: Thanks. 2 Have I missed any parties? Okay. It's my understanding that in early July 3 Aquila had filed its proposed tariff sheets for the rate 4 increases for the steam and the electric rates. 5 6 The Commission suspended those tariff sheets on or about July 22nd, and on July 24th the Commission 7 8 consolidated these two cases. 9 This early prehearing conference has been 10 scheduled to allow the parties to meet and confer, 11 perhaps narrowing or resolving some of the issues, and also to give the parties an opportunity to work on a 12 13 proposed procedural schedule. 14 Although the Commission has set hearing dates, there are some additional dates that the parties will 15 need to agree on and submit to the Commission. 16 17 Do the parties have any questions at this time? I have no questions for the parties. 18 19 I don't intend to stay down here. I will be in 20 my office. If you need me or if you want to look at the hearing calendar --21 22 MR. WILLIAMS: Just Staff has been advised, if 23 an inquiry is made into the EFIS system, the proposed 24 rates that Aquila has filed for the electric is not 25 available in the EFIS system.

1 JUDGE RUTH: The tariff themselves? 2 MR. WILLIAMS: The tariff is not. JUDGE RUTH: The tariff is not available in the 3 EFIS but the steams are? 4 MR. WILLIAMS: But the steams are. 5 6 JUDGE RUTH: Oh. You know, this is not my case, but I believe I may have heard something, that 7 8 there is a problem with Aquila, in that the tariff sheets 9 were having problems being submitted into EFIS, because, 10 perhaps, the name that EFIS has Aquila registered under is different than the tariff sheet's name. 11 I will check on that. If I can find any 12 additional information before you all leave, I'll come 13 14 down and share that with you. Mr. Williams. 15 MR. WILLIAMS: I'm not sure if they're 16 available if you look under the case name, but I've been 17 advised that they are not available if you do look under 18 19 the tariff sheets. 20 JUDGE RUTH: That they're not available, which 21 way are you sure of? 22 MR. WILLIAMS: As tariff. 23 JUDGE RUTH: Okay. 24 Okay. Well, while the rest of you are 25 discussing these matters, I'll go see what I can find out

1 about EFIS and try to get some more information for you. 2 Any other comments, questions? MR. CONRAD: On EFIS or on the secret filing 3 or --4 JUDGE RUTH: I'll try and find out why EFIS 5 6 does not show the electric rate case tariff sheets. MR. COFFMAN: Your Honor, I was wondering if 7 you were able to inform us about when the test year 8 9 decision may be made by the Commission. 10 And the reason I bring that up is that it may 11 have some relationship to what will be a reasonable schedule in the case, as we stated in our test year 12 13 recommendation. 14 JUDGE RUTH: At this point I have been in 15 contact with Judge Jones this morning, and it was his expectation that he would not rule on that until next 16 week, which would be after the deadline, I believe, the 17 2nd. September 2nd is the deadline for the filing of the 18 19 proposed procedural schedule. 20 I can take another look at that, and I'll be talking to him later today and see if, perhaps, he will 21 22 revise his decision on that. 23 MR. COFFMAN: And if I might just be a little 24 more specific, that the known and measurable period that 25 Aquila is requesting may or may not be a reasonable one

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from our perspective given the span of time between when that financial period is over and the data of the company is available for auditors review and when the direct testimony of our office and other responsive parties is required.

And we thought a two-month period would be adequate there, and there is a question about whether the Staff recommendation, which is only a six-month period, or the Company's recommendation, which would be a ninemonth known and measurable period, is going to be adopted, and that has some relevance to what we would find reasonable.

MR. SWEARENGEN: In conjunction with that, Your 13 14 Honor, if I might just add, the Company has come up with 15 a couple of alternative proposals to resolve the issue of 16 the update period, and those are things that we intend to discuss today and, hopefully, we can get that worked out. 17 JUDGE RUTH: And I will tell you, I suspect 18 19 that it would be possible for me to issue an order 20 suspending the September due date, if that's necessary, but I doubt, since it's not my case, that I would make a 21 22 decision on the test year while Judge Jones is out this 23 entire week. 24 And I don't know if he'll be able to review

24 And I don't know II he'II be able to review25 that while he's out of state, but I will check with him

1 and look into it.

2	MR. WILLIAMS: Judge, I don't believe the
3	parties really have a dispute about the appropriate test
4	year. It's over the update period.
5	JUDGE RUTH: Okay.
6	MR. COFFMAN: Right.
7	MR. WILLIAMS: And Staff suggests and
8	anticipates that this will be a topic during discussions
9	during this prehearing, which will also, as Mr. Coffman
10	indicated, have some ramifications for the proposed
11	schedule.
12	JUDGE RUTH: And if the parties meet and
13	determine that the September 2nd deadline is not feasible
14	for one reason or another, you may wish to request a very
15	short extension.
16	I don't off the top of my head, I believe
17	it's the beginning of June that this case has been
18	suspended to, and a few more days for the procedural
19	schedule to be filed probably would not cause significant
20	problems.
21	And while we're discussing the procedural
22	schedule, I wanted to mention that Judge Jones scheduled
23	this with three weeks of hearing, and that was to save
24	those dates on the calendar.
25	If the parties in good faith do not believe
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1 that the hearing will take the entire three weeks, then 2 we would expect you to say so in your proposed procedural schedule, so that those dates or some of those dates 3 4 could be freed up for other hearings, perhaps even another Aquila rate case hearing, which there is another 5 6 Aquila rate case and there weren't many days available on the calendar for that hearing. 7 8 Just something to keep in mind. 9 If you need the entire three weeks, that's 10 fine, but there may have to be adjustments made in various cases then. 11 Any other comments? Questions? 12 Then that will conclude the on-the-record 13 portion of the prehearing conference. 14 15 I will get back to you later this morning on the EFIS tariff issue. 16 17 If you don't hear from me and you want to call or come up, you're welcome to do that. And the calendar 18 19 is up there, also, if you're wanting to look at dates. 20 Thank you. WHEREUPON, the on-the-record portion of the 21 Prehearing Conference was concluded. 22 23 24 25
