- 2 JUDGE THOMPSON: Let's go ahead and go on the
- 3 record.
- 4 Good morning. My name is Kevin Thompson. I'm the
- 5 Regulatory Law Judge assigned to preside over this matter,
- 6 which is In the Matter of the Tariff Filing of The Empire
- 7 District Electric Company to Implement the General Rate
- 8 Increase for Retail Electric Service Provided to Customers in
- 9 Its Missouri Service Area, Case No. ER-2004-0570.
- 10 At this time we'll take entries of appearance,
- 11 beginning with the Company.
- 12 MR. COOPER: Dean L. Cooper from the law firm of
- 13 Brydon, Swearengen & England, P.C., P. O. Box 456, Jefferson
- 14 City, Missouri 65102, appearing on behalf of The Empire
- 15 District Electric Company, along with Mr. Jeff Keevil.
- 16 MR. KEEVIL: Yeah. Also on behalf of Empire, Jeff
- 17 Keevil of the law firm of Stewart & Keevil, L.L.C., 4603 John
- 18 Garry Drive, Suite 11, Columbia, Missouri 65203.
- 19 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr. Keevil, Mr. Cooper.
- 20 Staff?
- 21 MR. FREY: Thank you, Your Honor. Dennis Frey and
- 22 Steve Dottheim, P. O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102,
- 23 appearing on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public
- 24 Service Commission.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.

- 1 Public Counsel?
- 2 MR. COFFMAN: John B. Coffman, appearing on behalf
- 3 of the Office of the Public Counsel, P. O. Box 2230, Jefferson
- 4 City, Missouri 65102.
- 5 JUDGE THOMPSON: Intervenor Praxair?
- 6 MR. CONRAD: Your Honor, let the record show the
- 7 appearance for Praxair of Stuart W. Conrad, the law firm of
- 8 Finnegan, Conrad & Peterson, 1209 Penntower Office Center,
- 9 3100 Broadway, Kansas City, Missouri 64111.
- 10 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 11 And are there -- is there counsel present
- 12 representing intervention applicants?
- MS. WOODS: Yes, Your Honor.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Yes, ma'am.
- 15 MS. WOODS: Shelley Woods, Assistant Attorney
- 16 General, representing Missouri Department of Natural
- 17 Resources, Post Office Box 899, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 18 65102.
- 19 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 20 And, Mr. Conrad, you're also here for Explorer
- 21 Pipeline?
- MR. CONRAD: Yes, Your Honor, I am. And if it
- 23 please the Commission, I'll not repeat all of that.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 25 We have pending two applications for intervention,

- one, Explorer Pipeline, the other the Missouri Department of
- 2 Natural Resources.
- 3 Are there any objections to those intervention
- 4 applications?
- 5 (No response.)
- 6 JUDGE THOMPSON: Hearing none, they will both be
- 7 granted.
- 8 Pursuant to the procedural schedule -- or excuse
- 9 me -- the -- the suspension order, there is a proposed
- 10 procedural schedule due, I believe, a week from today. So I
- 11 would urge the parties to use their -- their time here this
- 12 morning to discuss their calendars.
- 13 Finally, there's also pending a motion to lift stay
- 14 with respect to one of the proposed tariff sheets, and there's
- 15 been a number of pleadings filed with respect to that. And we
- 16 are not going to take up that issue this morning.
- 17 Do the parties have any other issue or matter to
- 18 take up at this time?
- 19 Mr. Conrad?
- MR. CONRAD: Yes, sir.
- 21 Just very brief -- really more in the line of
- 22 clarification. First of all, I think substantial progress has
- 23 been made. And one of the things that we're gonna be talking
- 24 about today is just clarifying that everybody's on the same
- 25 page with respect to the procedural schedule that's been

- 1 circulated.
- But in the course of that, I need to get, I guess,
- 3 some clarification here on the record. Mr. Frey has entered
- 4 appearance as counsel for the Staff, and that's well and good.
- 5 In the course, however, of the exchanges regarding
- 6 procedural schedule, I have received some copies of pleadings
- 7 from Mr. Watkins on behalf of Staff.
- 8 And I guess the first level of my concern is that
- 9 under the -- the ethical canons, I should not have contact
- 10 directly with him if he's represented by counsel, which I'm
- 11 sure he is based on Mr. Frey's appearance.
- 12 But I do need to have clarification as to kind of
- 13 who's -- to whom I should be responding and -- and -- and so
- 14 on.
- 15 Danny, if -- if you could help me out on that.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Mr. Frey?
- 17 MR. FREY: Your Honor, I'd just respond by saying
- 18 that Mr. Conrad needs to respond to me in this matter. And
- 19 if it -- if it's a -- a concern or a problem that Mr. Watkins
- 20 has helped out in the course of our e-mails in the past, I
- 21 respectfully apologize for that to Mr. Conrad. And we'll take
- 22 steps to ensure that it doesn't occur again.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay.
- 24 Are you satisfied?
- 25 MR. CONRAD: Yeah, it's not -- it -- you know, the

1 fact that it occurs is not an issue. I just needed to have

- 2 clarification as to who --
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Who you should respond to.
- 4 MR. CONRAD: -- who was running the show, if you
- 5 will. And that's -- that's fine.
- 6 Thank you.
- 7 JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you.
- 8 Anyone else have any other matter to bring to my
- 9 attention at this time?
- 10 JUDGE THOMPSON: Mr. Coffman?
- MR. COFFMAN: No.
- JUDGE THOMPSON: Mr. Cooper?
- MR. COOPER: No, Your Honor.
- 14 JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. There's been a lot of talk
- 15 about changing the way that the Commission processes things,
- 16 particularly rate cases. And I can tell you that as far as
- 17 I'm concerned at this time, we are proceeding in an entirely
- 18 traditional manner.
- 19 So just expect things to unfold in the way that
- 20 they typically do in rate cases. If they're going to be any
- 21 changes, you'll find out about them shortly after I do.
- There being nothing else, we will conclude the
- 23 recorded portion of the prehearing conference.
- 24 WHEREUPON, the on-the-record portion of the
- 25 prehearing conference was concluded.
