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PROCEEDINGS

JUDGE DIPPELL: Let's go ahead and go on the record. This is Case No. GX-2018-0279 In The Matter of the Amendment of Natural Gas Safety Rules. These rules in particular are 4 CSR 240-3.270, 3.280, 3.290, 3.295, 40.020, 40.030, 40.080.

And we have come here today for a comment period. My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the Regulatory

Law Judge assigned to preside over this hearing. I will begin -- We have staff and public counsel present.

I'll begin by asking public counsel if they have comments they'd like to put on the record.

MR. WILLIAMS: Thank you, Judge. My name is Hampton Williams. I'm the Director of the Office of the Public Counsel. The comments I have regarding the proposed rulemakings are not on the proposal itself. Instead I prepared a letter that I'd like to submit with the record regarding the process regarding the incorporation of the federal standards.

There are -- It's a requirement as a part of Section 536 21. -- pardon me -- 031 that our administrative rules specifically identify what authority we're incorporating. There's an exception from that statute which identifies to federal standards for hospital licensure. Given that this also, the

federal standards for pipeline safety deal with safety requirements, the Commission might consider in its upcoming legislative session whether or not it would be interested in trying to pursue a similar exception for the purpose of incorporating federal pipeline safety rules so that we don't have to have these annual proceedings.

I understand that even in this proposal that there are specifically identified -- I should say nonincorporations of federal standards. I think that's completely appropriate. I also understand in several of these annual proceedings that there are changes beyond simply the incorporation of the federal pipeline safety standards that are considered in these proceedings.

To the extent that, you know, this annual update may be somehow alleviated by just acknowledging the incorporation of the federal pipeline safety standards through statute and providing that exception from 536's requirement, that might prove an administrative efficiency and it might also reduce this kind of six or eight month rulemaking lag that we have regarding that.

With that stated, I've got copies here that I'd like to submit to the Commission, if possible.
