Mayor Stuart Explains Recent Power Outage After meeting with Ameren officials, Mayor Stuart was sufficiently informed to give a comprehensive explanation for the recent extended for the recent extended power outages throughout Margeine: During Tuescay's evening's Council meeting be summarized. The facts are that most of the difficulty came from tree problems. A ground wire hit the 69,000-volt line, causing what our line workers described as an explosion. We've worked closely with Ameren; while we walked the line to locate we walked the line to locate the source of the problem, Ameren flew the line with hel-icopters. Bill, Liz and Kirk got together with Ameren to de-vise a plan. The 69,000-volt line had to be shut down, and we tried to run off our, own generators, but our [genera-tor] engines apparently don't like to play follow the leader; they work perfectly as individthey work perfectly as individ-uals but not together. We have some work to do to address this issue with their synchronization. Since the day the problem started, we have learned we can't run as a stand-alone system. We're not the best equipped to manage that 69,000-volt line. We'll have to hire someone to do that. We have the wrong people running the genera-tors; they are very good at what they do, but they need to focus on the lines. Perhaps we need to cross-train peo-ple. The trees that caused the problem have been trimmed. and more will be done." Street Signs The Marceline Council engaged in an extended discussion about the proper way to dispose of the old street signs. There was general agreement they should be sold, and the revenue from those sales applied to pur-chasing more of the new black and gold signs. The new signs cost \$28.35 each. Councilman Hatfield believes every citizen should have an equal opportunity to have new signs on their street, and City Attomey Othic believes a process sealed bidding backed by a municipal ordi-nance would be best when it comes to selling the old signs. An auction was also suggested.
