- JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Good morning. It's
- 3 Friday, February 9th, 2007, and we are here for the second
- 4 attempt at a prehearing conference with Mr. Tony Walker in
- 5 the case Tony Walker versus Missouri Gas Energy, Case No.
- 6 GC-2007-0162.
- 7 My name is Harold Stearley. I'm the presiding
- 8 officer in this matter. And we'll begin with taking oral
- 9 entries of appearance beginning with Staff.
- 10 MR. FRANSON: My name is Robert Franson. I am
- 11 Senior Counsel with the Missouri Public Service Commission
- 12 representing the Staff of the Public Service Commission,
- 13 P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. And for MGE?
- MS. CARTER: Diana Carter with Brydon,
- 16 Swearengen & England, 312 East Capitol Avenue, Jefferson
- 17 City, Missouri, for Missouri Gas Energy.
- 18 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Just prior to going on
- 19 the record, we attempted to call into our phone bridge,
- 20 which was established for Mr. Walker's participation, and
- 21 he was not on the line at that time. We're going to try
- 22 again now while we are on the record.
- MR. FRANSON: Actually, Judge, don't we have to
- 24 call in first to establish the phone bridge?
- 25 JUDGE STEARLEY: Actually, each time I've called

- 1 in on these, it will continual ring unless somebody else
- 2 is connected. So -- but we had -- we will continue to
- 3 try. And we'll try calling his home number as well if he
- 4 -- if we don't hook up with him on the phone bridge. If
- 5 he -- if he had called in, it would pick up. But it's
- 6 continually ringing so -- I'm going to go ahead and try
- 7 him at his home number. I have two numbers. We will try
- 8 them.
- 9 RECORDING: I'm sorry. Your restriction level
- 10 does not allow access to the number dialed.
- 11 JUDGE STEARLEY: Very well. He must have caller
- 12 block on unidentified lines.
- MR. FRANSON: That could be. But, ordinarily,
- 14 what they do is give you an opportunity to identify
- 15 yourself or unblock it, the ones I've seen. My -- my
- 16 son's daycare has that. And --
- 17 RECORDING: I'm sorry. Your restriction level
- 18 does not allow access to the number dialed. If you feel
- 19 you have reached this recording in error --
- 20 MR. FRANSON: And they will give you an
- 21 opportunity to say you are so-and-so or unblock your
- 22 number. I have no clue how to unblock the number, and
- 23 then I usually identify myself. And then I get through.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: We'll try the phone bridge one
- 25 last time.

- 2 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Very well. Notice on
- 3 this prehearing conference went out well in advance. An
- 4 additional notice was provided on how to participate by
- 5 phone. Plus, I had made contact with Mr. Walker by phone
- 6 advising him that he could attend by phone, which he
- 7 actually said was his preference. And I made phone
- 8 contact to provide him with the number as well as sending
- 9 him written notice.
- 10 Despite these various contacts, Mr. Walker has
- 11 not appeared today by either telephone or in person. And
- 12 at this point, I will cancel -- I had already planned on
- 13 canceling the requirements for any procedural schedule,
- 14 and I will be, I guess -- I could give, at most,
- 15 Mr. Walker one last opportunity to show cause for his
- 16 failure to appear, after which we'll follow up with an
- 17 order to dismiss this action.
- 18 MR. FRANSON: Judge, would -- would you
- 19 entertain or need a Motion to Dismiss made here on the
- 20 record today?
- 21 JUDGE STEARLEY: If -- if you would like to go
- 22 ahead and place one on the record verbally, that's fine.
- MR. FRANSON: I -- I would. We have now been
- 24 here twice for prehearing conferences. And I'm sorry. I
- 25 don't have the date of the first one. But now we've been

1 here a second time, and Mr. Walker has failed to appear

- 2 twice.
- 3 He has had more than sufficient opportunity and
- 4 certainly any problems on -- as far as being allowed to
- 5 appear by phone that has alleviated it. The fact that you
- 6 are calling him alleviates any other concerns. He has not
- 7 shown up for this.
- 8 And, Judge, the Staff's recommendation in this
- 9 case was to dismiss the complaint. Now, the specific
- 10 reasons for that are highly confidential. I'm not going
- 11 to go into that.
- 12 But this Motion to Dismiss is two-fold. One,
- 13 for all the reasons found in the Staff's recommendations,
- 14 the case should be dismissed. And, two, now for
- 15 procedural grounds, failure to prosecute.
- Mr. Walker, twice, has failed to appear for
- 17 prehearing conferences. And so on the grounds in our
- 18 Staff's recommendation is one. And two is the failure to
- 19 prosecute his complaint.
- Judge, I would make a motion to dismiss this
- 21 case with prejudice so that it is over and done with.
- 22 MS. CARTER: Missouri Gas Energy would, of
- 23 course, concur in that.
- 24 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. And I -- I know you
- 25 already have requested both in your -- in your answer and

in Staff's report that it be dismissed. And it's

    he's failed to appear, so he is now also in violation of
