Page 3 1 The following proceedings began at 2:58 p.m.: 2 JUDGE HATCHER: Let's go on the record. Today the Commission has set this time aside for a Procedural 3 Conference in File No. GC-2022-0158. 4 That is Ozarks 5 Medical Center as Complainant and Summit Natural Gas of Missouri as the Respondent. 6 7 So let me tell you where I'm getting pushback from and that is that the parties have not agreed that 8 9 all of the facts can be stipulated. So that sentence that was in the pleading that said almost all is the 10 11 admission that they're not all agreed to. So you all 12 want to avoid a hearing was kind of my understanding. Mr. Hall, this is your baby. Do you want to 13 lead us? 14 15 Sure, Judge. MR. HALL: Thank you. Caleb 16 Hall from Stinson LLP appearing on behalf of Ozarks 17 Medical Center d/b/a Ozarks Healthcare. While given 18 that that was your opening foray, Judge, can I ask for 19 confirmation that that was the only part of the schedule 20 that the Commission saw any issue with? JUDGE HATCHER: Yes. I confirmed that was the 21 only issue that was brought up to me because that led 22 into legal issues about drafting of the order at the end 23 24 of the case from simple things like does the stipulation 25 of facts, is that going to include everything that the

Page 4 1 Commission needs to cite that SNGMO is a company and 2 they're in Missouri, et cetera, and how will the Commission handle whatever the remaining disputed fact 3 4 or facts are. My thought, and I'm just throwing this out there as a discussion idea, is a hearing date, I 5 don't know, what do you want to call that, a potential 6 7 hearing date, a save the date hearing date so that 8 basically the Commission does not want to be in the 9 position and has had recent experiences of parties saying here are the facts, please decide it without a 10 11 hearing and the Commission then finds that they need to 12 do some cleanup at the back end which is what I'm trying 13 to avoid.

14 So I don't think I have any other cards to lay 15 out. That was the only issue. If we can call it maybe 16 a temporary hearing date or some way to clean up if 17 somebody finds fault with the stipulation of facts or if 18 there's a disputed fact that suddenly needs to be 19 undisputed. I really shouldn't be allowed to just talk 20 into a microphone. Mr. Hall, please save me.

21 MR. HALL: Judge, in that case, I think my 22 question would be when would you like a second filing 23 from the parties, because I am confident that we can 24 come to an agreement on some type of tentative hearing 25 date with revised schedule going forward. If that was

Page 5 the only concern the Commission had, I'm confident we 1 2 can move forward. JUDGE HATCHER: Awesome. I don't need a 3 4 timeline. If we bump against, I think February 24 is whatever the next date that pops up in what you quys 5 submitted, if we get there, I will handle it the same 6 way I did with the -- oh, the data request response 7 I will just quote on motion of the Commission on 8 times. its own and resolve that. But you know, sooner is 9 10 better, because whatever your procedural schedule ends 11 up being has to go to the Commission for agenda 12 approval. So just add that one Wednesday in there between when it gets to me and when it would, quote, go 13 into effect. But like I said, I'll happily clean up the 14 15 next deadline that's coming up. I think it was also a 16 discovery deadline. I haven't pulled it up. 17 Mr. Cooper.

18 MR. COOPER: Yes, Judge. Dean Cooper 19 appearing for Summit Natural Gas of Missouri, Inc. That 20 sounds good to me. In fact, I guess I would ask that perhaps we be given this line once we go off the record 21 22 for the procedural conference just to continue the discussion somewhat. I had sent to some other people 23 24 something just for consideration and review and 25 discussion, and perhaps we could at least have an

Page 6 initial discussion of that again after we go off the 1 2 record. JUDGE HATCHER: Absolutely. And I double 3 4 checked when setting up this conference to make sure that I can specifically hang up and somebody will become 5 I don't know who. It will be a surprise to 6 the host. all of us. I realize now I did not ask for 7 8 introductions. I didn't even pull up a script for a 9 procedural conference. 10 We have had introductions by Ozarks Healthcare 11 and by Summit Natural Gas. Staff, would you like to go 12 ahead and make your introduction for the record? 13 MS. MYERS: Sure. Good afternoon, Judge. Jamie Myers on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri 14 15 Public Service Commission, and I believe Paul Graham may 16 also be joining me. MR. GRAHAM: He is here. Paul Graham also 17 18 entering on behalf of the Staff. 19 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. And I don't see 20 any other attorneys on the line. I'll go ahead and ask if there's any other parties that would like to make an 21 22 introduction, go ahead now. 23 MR. POSTON: Marc Poston with OPC. Thank you. 24 JUDGE HATCHER: Okay. I think I'm done. I'm 25 going to open it back up, Mr. Hall, Mr. Cooper, Ms.
