1 The following proceedings began at 1:00 p.m.:

2 JUDGE HATCHER: Let's come to order and go on
3 the record. Today is September 9, 2022. The Commission
4 has set this time aside for an on-the-record
5 presentation in the general rate cases of Evergy
6 Missouri Metro and Evergy Missouri West respectively
7 file numbers ending in 0129 and 0130.

8 I would like to note for the record that we
9 were joined earlier by all five Commissioners and we
10 currently have Chairman Ryan Silvey and Commissioner
11 Scott Rupp on with us and I am expecting our other
12 Commissioners to join us shortly.

13 I do not have a schedule for this
14 presentation. So we'll just follow the order of opening
15 statements as we have been, and I will offer that to the
16 company first. Mr. Fischer, you have the floor.

17 MR. FISCHER: Thank you, Judge. I'm so
18 pleased to announce that we are doing this on-the-record
19 to talk about four different documents that are
20 stipulations and agreements among the parties addressing
21 a wide variety of issues. You asked about how to handle
22 this. You suggested talking about areas we compromised
23 in. I have to say there are so many compromises in
24 these documents, and I personally want to thank all the
25 parties for hanging with us for all those late nights

1 where we hammered through these 45 issues or whatever
2 they were that we started with to get down to a much
3 more manageable number. People talk about state
4 workers. We had state workers that worked long and hard
5 to get us here. So I appreciate that.

6 Anyway, I can go over the documents any way
7 you'd like. The first document is about the revenue
8 requirement issues. Of course the top line issue for us
9 is the agreements on the revenue requirement of 25
10 million and 42.5 is the starting point for the
11 additional adjustments that are being talked about in
12 the rate case itself in the hearings.

13 You mentioned hedging. On page 5, there is a
14 hedging provision, hedging activity costs engaged will
15 be deferred into the company's regulatory asset
16 liability account for future treatment determination.
17 I'd be glad to answer other questions about that if
18 you'd like.

19 But perhaps one of the areas that the
20 Commissioners might be interested in is the program
21 stip. It has a number of existing programs that are
22 being improved and some brand new programs that we're
23 going to be instituting, some of them at the request of
24 the Public Counsel like the critical needs and the
25 rehousing program. We're also going to be having a new

1 low-income solar subscription pilot which is addressed
2 on page 3 of the second stipulation. There's the
3 residential battery energy storage pilot program which
4 we're looking forward to. And then on page 5 at the
5 bottom we start talking about nonresidential electric
6 vehicles and some of the programs that we're bringing
7 forward there.

8 The business EV charging service is addressed
9 on page 6 of that. I believe that was one that we
10 talked about and got kicked forward to the rate case
11 from the transportation electrification docket that we
12 had. And then there's a separate proposal on class
13 revenue shifts. That was largely adopted among the
14 parties, the customer representatives, and the shifts
15 are actually discussed on page 2 of that one.

16 The fourth stipulation is just one of the
17 standard stipulations that most companies do regarding
18 pensions and OPEBs to get to a starting point for the
19 accounting purposes. With that, I'm happy to answer
20 your questions. I'm sure all the parties in this room
21 would be more than happy to give their perspectives.

22 So unless you'd like for me to summarize
23 something else, I'd be glad to take those questions.

24 JUDGE HATCHER: That sounds excellent, Mr.
25 Fischer. Let's go ahead and get to Commissioner

1 questions. Are there any Commissioner questions for the
2 company in their opening statement?

3 CHAIRMAN SILVEY: No questions at this time,
4 Judge.

5 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, Chairman. And I
6 also want to recognize for the record that Commissioner
7 Maida Coleman has again joined us for today. The bench
8 does have a question about the hedging.

9 MR. FISCHER: Okay.

10 JUDGE HATCHER: How are hedging losses
11 considered under the stipulation? Are they considered
12 costs separately or not at all?

13 MR. FISCHER: Paragraph 3 there on page 5 it
14 says the hedging activity costs and gains will be
15 deferred into the company's regulatory asset liability
16 account for future rate treatment determinations. So
17 we're basically deferring those. They used to go
18 through the fuel adjustment clause. Now we're going to
19 have them through a regulatory asset liability account.

20 JUDGE HATCHER: It would be considered as part
21 of the entirety in the deferred account?

22 MR. FISCHER: That's correct.

23 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. I want to follow
24 up on some items of concern to Commissioner Holsman. He
25 had stated he had an interest in an voltage optimization

1 study, and the response that Evergy gave was the issue
2 was settled. Looking over those four stipulations, I'm
3 not quite able to locate where that was settled. Can
4 you describe what the settlement was?

5 MR. FISCHER: It's my understanding from what
6 Kayla Messamore said on the stand that it's not
7 addressed in the settlement. We are doing a number of
8 things that I think Mr. Caisley and Kayla Messamore
9 talked about on the record in that area in that space,
10 and we are looking at those things and doing those
11 studies on our own, but they're not a part of the
12 stipulations.

13 JUDGE HATCHER: There were also under the
14 issue tariff revisions, that's XXVI --

15 MR. FISCHER: Yes.

16 JUDGE HATCHER: -- there were A through E sub
17 issues. I am particularly interested in sub issue B and
18 C.

19 MR. FISCHER: Could you give me what those
20 say? I don't have that one in front of me.

21 JUDGE HATCHER: B is any changes to be made to
22 Evergy's DER which is distributed energy resources, any
23 changes to the DER interconnection tariff is B. C is
24 any changes to be made to Evergy's net metering tariff.
25 The tariff and the stipulation -- I'm sorry. The

1 stipulation resolves it by stating the signatories
2 accept the company's proposed changes to the
3 market-based demand response program tariff.

4 MR. FISCHER: Those would be addressed in the
5 testimony of Brad Lutz, and I think that basically we
6 come to an agreement that those suggestions were
7 appropriate.

8 JUDGE HATCHER: Were sub issues B through E
9 then dropped?

10 MR. FISCHER: Well, in the stipulation, I'm
11 not sure, let's take a look here, on page 13 of the
12 first stipulation we have general tariff changes. Many
13 of those go to rate design suggestions, I think. I
14 don't see anything on DER. Counsel, can you help me?

15 MS. MERS: Yeah. I apologize for
16 interrupting. Nicole Mers with staff. And for my
17 understanding, and I believe we have Claire Eubanks who
18 can also help chime in for anything that might go beyond
19 my understanding, if you look at the first or what I
20 will call the first stipulation and agreement that
21 resolves the revenue requirement issues, if you turn to
22 page 14, my understanding is that issue -- or 7, general
23 tariff changes under the heading of rate design and
24 program settlement, if you then -- which continues onto
25 page 14 that the bullet point D, the company will modify

1 its tariffs to clarify interconnection study terms with
2 staff's proposed language changes and minor cleanup to
3 parallel generation tariff sheets as agreed to by
4 company in surrebuttal involved the proposed discussions
5 and issues with both the DER and net metering.

6 Now I don't believe that that goes to what
7 I've heard in prior cases to the time of use net
8 metering concern although not to get into it, because I
9 know that is not resolved, there is questions on if
10 different proposals that are still live may solve that
11 concern, but that part is not addressed but I think the
12 rest of the issue was supposed to be resolved by D.

13 JUDGE HATCHER: And this is my last question.
14 In the company's various surrebuttals, they seem to
15 agree to a number of the other parties' recommended
16 changes, mainly staff. But if the stipulation accepts
17 the company's proposed changes, does that mean it rolls
18 back to the company's original position or does it
19 incorporate what Evergy said they'd be willing to do in
20 their responses to the other parties in their
21 surrebuttal?

22 MR. FISCHER: I'm not sure which specific ones
23 you're talking about, but I would suggest that the
24 stipulations and agreements that we have agreed to
25 encompass all of the issues and if it says we go to the

1 company's improvements in the tariff, that's where we
2 would go.

3 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you, sir. I have no
4 other questions.

5 MR. FISCHER: Thank you.

6 JUDGE HATCHER: Let's go to staff.

7 MS. MERS: I will try to keep this short and
8 sweet. If needed, we have a various group of staff
9 personnel here to try to answer any questions that you
10 may have. Of course, I will try to attempt the best I
11 can.

12 There are four stipulations and agreements we
13 are asking you guys to approve in this case. In staff's
14 view, these are just and reasonable agreements so that's
15 -- the parties worked very, very hard to come together
16 on and get places that, you know, people gave on certain
17 things to get other things that were priorities to them.
18 There was a lot of compromise and a lot of discussion
19 and debate to try to come to what we all could agree
20 would be the best outcome for ratepayers. We believe
21 that the terms in these four stipulations would be that.

22 I guess in particular interest to staff we are
23 happy that we could come to agreement over some
24 requirements for Nucor as it has been clear that special
25 tariffed rates are becoming more and more interested in

1 by consumers coming to Missouri. So we hope that that
2 can help guide future cases and help us get the
3 information we need.

4 The programs, I'll point that stip out as an
5 area of great compromise among the parties. You know,
6 some parties gave a little more to make sure that other
7 parties or other programs they didn't want to see didn't
8 make it in.

9 But I think that we've come to a fair
10 agreement that gives customers some options for
11 renewable and cleaner energy, gives some low-income
12 programs, and helps address concerns for the progression
13 of electric vehicle and electrification in the state.
14 As Mr. Fischer pointed out, the OPEBs pension stip is
15 pretty typical. So I don't think we need to spend much
16 time on that. And then the class revenue allocations
17 again driven primarily by the consumer parties but I
18 think the fact that we were all able to get to a revenue
19 requirement definitely helped make that happen much
20 easier. I do again thank the parties for all working
21 together so we could get a lot of this out of the way.

22 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you. Are there any
23 Commissioner questions for staff? And I would also like
24 to remind the Commissioners, Brian, if we can get a shot
25 of the courtroom, we have a number of specialized

1 witnesses if any Commissioners do have detailed
2 questions that they would like to follow up on. Any
3 Commissioner questions for staff? Hearing none. Thank
4 you very much.

5 MS. MERS: Thank you.

6 JUDGE HATCHER: I note the attendance of a
7 couple parties. I'll just go ahead and offer any
8 opening statements from MEEG.

9 MR. OPITZ: I don't have any comments other
10 than to thank the parties for our agreements and to
11 thank the Commission and the presiding officer for
12 allowing us the various delays so that we could reach
13 these settlements. Thank you for that.

14 JUDGE HATCHER: You're very welcome. I hope
15 that didn't make the video. Nucor, did you wish to make
16 any statements?

17 MR. ELLINGER: No other opening statement
18 except to join in our thanks to the parties, to the
19 Commission, to the Hearing Officer. We did have to
20 adjust a lot of things along the way. Very appreciative
21 that everyone was able to do that. So thank you.

22 JUDGE HATCHER: And I believe subject to
23 correction or a hand raise, that will bring us to the
24 Office of the Public Counsel, which will be the last
25 opening statement regarding -- or the last presentation

1 regarding these agreements. Mr. Clizer.

2 MR. CLIZER: Your Honor, I have no specific
3 opening statements other than to once again echo what
4 other parties have already said that these agreements
5 represented a result of significant cooperation and time
6 spent by all parties attempting to negotiate what each
7 party felt was the most reasonable outcome that they
8 could hope to achieve. I thank the other parties for
9 the efforts that they've put into this and for the
10 Commission in making delays that MEGC referenced for
11 allowing these negotiations to continue.

12 JUDGE HATCHER: Indeed. I would echo all of
13 those things. I would also like to thank the Chairman
14 on the record and the Commissioners. It has been
15 communicated to those of us who work for the
16 Commissioners to make sure and take care of our own
17 health and to take the day out if need be, and without
18 that direction from the Chair and the Commissioners, I
19 certainly would have been one of those employees who
20 showed up on Friday. So I really appreciate their
21 leadership on that.

22 With all of the thanks being said and done,
23 I'd like to open it up one more time before we get to
24 any final announcements about due dates or anything else
25 we have to discuss.

1 Are there any Commissioner comments before we
2 close out this presentation on the four stipulations and
3 agreements?

4 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: Judge, this is
5 Commissioner Holsman.

6 JUDGE HATCHER: Yes, Commissioner, go ahead.

7 COMMISSIONER HOLSMAN: I just want to thank
8 everybody for the diligent process and appreciated a
9 better understanding well laid in front of us. I just
10 want to say thank you.

11 JUDGE HATCHER: Thank you very much,
12 Commissioner.

13 Okay. Let's get to announcements. I would
14 just like to repeat a couple of the items of my
15 understanding. The presiding officer will be submitting
16 late-filed Exhibit 1000 which will be the currently
17 effective tariff. Number two, we will be having Ms.
18 Tucker and Witness Peterson's testimonies refiled in
19 corrected versions with the appropriate reference
20 between I think what we have all learned is their
21 internal reference to Everygy Metro covering both state
22 jurisdictions.

23 The presiding officer will be issuing shortly,
24 probably not today, a notice of exhibits and I will
25 include the entirety of the number of exhibits. If you

1 heard my monotone just before lunch, that is I believe
2 in the hundreds. I will issue that list. Included with
3 that I will include the due dates. Late submissions are
4 next Friday, September 16, and objections will be the
5 Wednesday following which is the 21st. I will put that
6 in writing for all the parties. Probably not today.
7 I'll try.

8 That is all the pending announcements I have.
9 Anyone else before we close this proceeding?

10 MR. CLIZER: Just very briefly. I apologize.
11 I don't have a copy of the filed timeline. Are all the
12 dates still maintained regarding briefing, et cetera?
13 Is there a timeline for transcripts on that?

14 JUDGE HATCHER: Yep. September 23rd is the due
15 date for transcripts. And I would like everyone to note
16 that I calculated that well in advance and confirmed
17 that with the court reporter. That is ten business days
18 after today.

19 Briefs are due October 10. I am simply
20 restating what is in the procedural schedule. And if I
21 restate it, ignore me and go to the printed schedule.
22 Reply briefs are due October 17.

23 And our operation of law date is December 6.
24 Last call. Any announcements?

25 Thank you. We are adjourned and off the

1 record.
