**JOINT MOTION OF ALL PARTIES TO EXTEND TEMPORARY
WAIVER AND FOR ADDITIONAL TIME TO FILE UNANIMOUS
STIPULATION OR PROPOSED PROCEDURAL SCHEDULE**

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, on behalf of all of the parties in this case, and submits this Joint Motion to Extend Temporary Waiver and for Additional Time to File Unanimous Stipulation or Proposed Procedural Schedule. In support thereof, the parties state as follows:

1. On August 4, 2005, the Commission issued an Order Opening Case to address the request of Southwestern Bell Telephone, L.P., d/b/a SBC Missouri for a waiver of the requirement of 4 CSR 240-29.040(4) that the originating Calling Party Number (“CPN”) be included in the 11-01-XX billing records for wireless-originated calls.¹ The Order also established a procedural schedule that provided for the case to be concluded by September 30, 2005.

2. On August 8, 2005, Staff filed a Joint Motion of All Parties to Suspend Procedural Schedule. Staff explained that the parties agreed that the temporary waiver could and should be extended to allow the parties to meet in an attempt to resolve this matter in an informal setting. Accordingly, the parties proposed to file, no later than November 18, 2005, either a unanimous stipulation with respect to the waiver, or if a unanimous stipulation could not be

reached, a proposed procedural schedule. The parties also requested that the temporary waiver be extended until November 30, 2005. In an Order issued August 12, 2005, the Commission granted the parties' Motion to Suspend the Procedural Schedule and extended the temporary waiver as requested.

3. The parties have conferred and would like to have the opportunity to hold further discussions in an attempt to resolve this issue in a more informal setting. The parties agree that the temporary waiver can and should be further extended in order to do so. The parties agree to attempt to resolve this matter by unanimous stipulation. If the parties do not reach an agreement and file a unanimous stipulation by January 20, 2006, they agree to jointly or separately file proposed procedural schedules for the resumption of the contested case proceedings by no later than January 20, 2006. The parties understand that in this event the waiver will have to again be extended to include the time necessary to submit the case within the timeframe of the procedural schedule that is ordered.

4. The parties request that the temporary waiver be extended until January 31, 2006. The parties request that they be directed to file, by no later than January 20, 2006, either a unanimous stipulation with respect to the waiver, or, if a unanimous stipulation cannot be reached, a proposed procedural schedule to be used to resolve the matter.

5. SBC Missouri, the Office of the Public Counsel, the Small Telephone Company Group, and the Missouri Independent Telephone Group have all authorized Staff to submit this Joint Motion on their behalf.

WHEREFORE, the parties to this case jointly move the Commission for its Order extending the temporary waiver until January 31, 2006, and extending the date for filing either a unanimous stipulation or a proposed procedural schedule until January 20, 2006.
