- JUDGE STEARLEY: Good morning. Today is
- 3 March 21st, 2007. We're here for a prehearing
- 4 conference in the matter of the application of
- 5 Missouri Gas Energy, a Division of Southern Union
- 6 Company, For a Certificate of Public Convenience and
- 7 Necessity Authorizing it to Construct, Install, Own,
- 8 Operate, Control, Manage and Maintain a Natural Gas
- 9 Distribution System to Provide Gas Service in Platte
- 10 County, Missouri as an Expansion of Its Existing
- 11 Certified Area.
- 12 It's Case Number GA-2007-0289. My name
- 13 is Harold Stearley. I'm the presiding officer in
- 14 this matter. The court reporter this morning is Pam
- 15 Fick.
- And we'll begin by taking entries of
- 17 appearance, beginning with MGE.
- MR. STEINER: Appearing for MGE, Roger W.
- 19 Steiner, 4520 Main Street, Suite 1100, Kansas City,
- 20 Missouri 64111.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Steiner.
- 22 And the Empire District Gas Company.
- MR. KEEVIL: Yes, Judge. Appearing on
- 24 behalf of the Empire District Gas Company, Jeffrey A.
- 25 Keevil of the law firm of Stewart & Keevil, LLC. Our

- 2 Missouri 65203.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Keevil.
- 4 And the Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 5 Commission.
- 6 MR. FRANSON: Robert Franson representing
- 7 the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission,
- 8 P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102. I
- 9 would also like to enter the appearance of Robert
- 10 Berlin also, as senior counsel, representing the
- 11 Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission.
- 12 JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Mr. Franson.
- 13 And the Office of Public Counsel.
- 14 MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing for
- 15 the Office of the Public Counsel, P.O. Box 2230,
- 16 Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- 17 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. And if I
- 18 understand the pleadings to this point, there seems
- 19 to be a little bit of dispute in who has a
- 20 certificate for the surrounding tracts of land for
- 21 the application, but as far as the individual
- 22 sections in which MGE is seeking a certificate, is
- 23 there any dispute as far as who has certification on
- 24 those two tracts?
- 25 MR. STEINER: I don't believe there's a

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1 dispute there. I don't believe anyone does.
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- MR. KEEVIL: I believe that's correct,
- 3 Judge. But I would have to check, but I think that's
- 4 correct.
- 5 JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Were there
- 6 any preliminary matters that I need to address today?
- 7 MR. STEINER: I don't believe so, your
- 8 Honor.
- 9 MR. FRANSON: Judge, I would ask, not
- 10 necessarily that we -- I'm sure we'll talk here
- 11 shortly, but perhaps not, just asking for a -- I
- 12 don't know if you were, but quite often it is
- 13 customary that we get a request, "Please give us a
- 14 procedural schedule in a week." Could we, instead of
- 15 in a week, give you a progress report in a week or
- 16 two weeks? Would that be agreeable to everyone?
- JUDGE STEARLEY: It's agreeable to me.
- 18 MR. STEINER: I'd like to get a
- 19 procedural schedule set. I don't have a problem with
- 20 a progress report at the same time, but --
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay.
- MR. KEEVIL: Well, I think it would be
- 23 premature to set a procedural schedule myself.
- MR. FRANSON: That's why --
- 25 MR. KEEVIL: That was something I was

- 1 going to bring up after the parties discuss --
- 2 MR. STEINER: Do you want to talk about
- 3 settlement, Jeff? Or why?
- 4 MR. KEEVIL: Well, we can talk.
- 5 MR. STEINER: I'm just curious why we
- 6 wouldn't set a procedural schedule.
- 7 MR. KEEVIL: Because it's premature at
- 8 this point.
- 9 MR. STEINER: But why is it premature?
- 10 MR. KEEVIL: Lots of reasons.
- 11 MR. STEINER: Which are?
- MR. FRANSON: Because we don't know --
- 13 Judge, perhaps we should.
- 14 JUDGE STEARLEY: I do have a procedural
- 15 schedule due for next week. Obviously the parties
- 16 are gonna have an opportunity here as I leave to
- 17 discuss these matters, and maybe you'll decide to
- 18 reach a different course here.
- 19 MR. STEINER: Well, your Honor, if --
- 20 I'm sorry.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Go ahead.
- MR. STEINER: If we decide that we would
- 23 rather do a -- instead of a procedural schedule, file
- 24 something else such as a progress report, if we agree
- 25 to that, then could we file something saying instead

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1 of a procedural schedule, you'll be getting a
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- 2 progress report?
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Certainly.
- 4 MR. STEINER: Maybe it's a good idea.
- 5 JUDGE STEARLEY: You're certainly free
- 6 to do that, and we can change the requirement for a
- 7 procedural schedule if all the parties are in
- 8 agreement.
- 9 MR. FRANSON: Judge, we'll know about
- 10 those kinds of things once we have our discussion
- 11 today, so ...
- 12 JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. And this may be
- 13 a little hard for you to predict right now, but I did
- 14 want to ask you all how long you thought you would be
- 15 needing a conference room today? Because we
- 16 potentially have a discovery conference that I need
- 17 to find a room for this afternoon.
- 18 MR. FRANSON: What time do you need it
- 19 for?
- JUDGE STEARLEY: 1:30.
- 21 MR. STEINER: I would think we'd be done
- 22 by then. I have to be somewhere at noon that would
- 23 be hard to change, so I would think so.
- JUDGE STEARLEY: Okay. Very good. Were
- 25 there any other matters I need to take up with the

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parties at this time?
