ORDER GRANTING WAIVER AND DESIGNATING FILE FOR ISRS FILINGS

On January 16, 2017, Laclede Gas Company, d/b/a Missouri Gas Energy (MGE) filed a notice of its intention to make its next ISRS filing. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-4.020(2) requires regulated entities to file such a notice at least 60 days before filing what is likely to be a contested case. MGE asks the Commission to waive a portion of the 60-day requirement to allow it to make its ISRS filing on February 1, 2017. Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-4.020(2)(B) allows the Commission to grant such a waiver upon a showing of good cause.

In response to MGE's motion, the Commission directed that any party wishing to respond do so by January 26. On that date, the Office of the Public Counsel filed a response indicating it does not object to the requested waiver in these circumstances. Public Counsel explains its belief that the 60-day notice is necessary to ensure that improper ex parte communications about ISRS issues do not take place before an application is filed. MGE already has an ISRS petition before the Commission in File No. GO-2016-0332, and so as long as that file is open, the ex parte communication protections regarding ISRS issues will be in place. Public Counsel is concerned that if GO-2016-0332 were to be closed before MGE files its next ISRS petition, there could be an ex parte protection gap.

To avoid the possibility of such a gap occurring, the Commission has opened a new GO file to contain MGE's next ISRS filing. MGE's notice of intended case filing will be added to that file. That way the ex parte protections will remain in place even if GO-2016-0332 were closed before MGE makes its ISRS filing.

The Commission finds that MGE has shown good cause to grant its request for waiver of the 60-day filing requirement, and the Commission will grant the requested waiver.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Laclede Gas Company d/b/a Missouri Gas Energy's request for waiver of rule 4 CSR 240-4.020(2) is granted and the company may file its next ISRS petition when it is ready to do so.
2. When Laclede Gas Company files its next ISRS petition it shall do so in File No. GO-2017-0201.
3. This order shall be effective when issued.
4. This file shall be closed.
