STAFF RECOMMENDATION TO APPROVE TARIFF

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COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, by and through counsel, and for its Recommendation in response to the Commission's Order Directing Notice, Setting Deadline For Applications To Intervene, and Setting Deadline For Staff To File Recommendation ("Order"), states as follows:

1. On February 1, 2018, Veolia Energy Kansas City, Inc. ("Veolia") filed tariff sheets (Tracking No. JH-2018-0100) to revise its Production Adjustment Cost Clause ("PACC") rates for steam service for the twelve month period of April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2019. The revised tariff sheets bear a proposed effective date of April 1, 2018.

2. The Commission ordered Staff to file a recommendation on Veolia's revised tariff sheets by March 1, 2018. No party has intervened in this proceeding.

3. Staff has reviewed the tariff and is of the opinion the revised tariff sheets are in compliance with Veolia's Tariff Sheet Nos. 36 and 37 and the Commission's Report and Order which approved the PACC in Case No. HR-2014-0066. The PACC Rider reflects a reduction to customer bills in the amount of \$0.16412 per million pounds ("mlb") of steam. Staff further notes this is the third PACC adjustment filing made by Veolia. There are no customer reconciling adjustments calculated in this PACC adjustment factor because Veolia states there are no outstanding balances on the

PACC adjustment accounts. Therefore, as more fully explained in Staff's Memorandum attached as Appendix A, the Staff recommends approval of the tariff sheets filed on February 1, 2018.

WHEREFORE, for the reasons stated above, Staff recommends the Commission approve Veolia's two tariff sheets filed on February 1, 2018 under Tracking Number JH-2018-0100 bearing an effective date of April 1, 2018:

On February 1, 2018, Veolia Energy Kansas City, Inc. ("Veolia") filed with the Commission two (2) tariff sheets for steam service to implement the Production Adjustment Cost Clause ("PACC") for the twelve (12) months starting April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2019. The adjustment is required by Veolia's PACC, which the Commission approved in Case No. HR-2014-0066, effective August 1, 2014.

Veolia's filing included the proposed tariff sheets and supporting work papers consisting of electronic worksheets showing Veolia's calculation of the PACC for inclusion in customers bills' beginning April 1, 2018 through March 31, 2019.

On February 2, 2018, the Commission directed Staff to file a recommendation on the pending tariff sheets no later than March 1, 2018.

The procedure for the calculation of the PACC for steam service sales is set out in Veolia's Tariff Sheets Nos. 31 through 37, which are titled "Production Adjustment Cost Clause." The PACC calculation components as described in Tariff Sheet Nos. 36 and 37 include the Current PACC and the Reconciliation Rate or "R factor" plus any applicable reconciling adjustments.

The PACC Rider for this 2nd revision of Tariff Sheet No. 36 reflects a negative charge per million pounds ("mlb") of (\$0.16412), which is an increase from the previous rate of (\$0.44636). This means that a customer would see a reduction in their monthly PACC bill credit of \$0.28 for every mlb of steam used as compared to the credit from the previous year. The PACC Rider negative charge is a reduction to customer bills to reflect the customer share of the variation in fuel cost for the calendar year that ended in 2017. The PACC Rider rate factor is designed to reflect each Customer's share of the variation in production costs for the 2017 accumulation period compared to the actual production costs in Case No. HR-2014-0066. The difference between actual production costs and the amount of production costs covered by base rates (both on a dollar basis) is multiplied by 95% and then divided by the total metered sales during the accumulation period to quantify the PACC adjustment factor. To determine the amount of an individual Customer's responsibility, the PACC adjustment factor is multiplied by the actual steam sales to that individual customer during the accumulation period, with the resulting dollar amount charged or credited to the Customer in twelve (12) equal installments. Veolia currently has approximately forty eight (48) steam customers.

Currently there is no customer Reconciling Adjustments calculated in this PACC adjustment

factor. In response to Staff Data Request 0002, Veolia has indicated that no reconciliation adjustments are necessary for this filing since there are no outstanding balances on the PACC adjustment accounts. Veolia does have an option for semi-annual rate adjustments to reflect 95% of the changes to production costs.

Staff reviewed the data and mathematical calculations Veolia provided in its worksheets and found Veolia's calculations related to the filed tariff sheets to be correct, and that the calculations satisfy the standards set forth in Veolia's Tariff Sheet Nos. 31 through 37. The calculations are also consistent with Veolia's PACC filing as contained in Case No. HR-2014-0066.

Staff Recommendation

Staff has reviewed the filed tariff sheets and recommends approval of the following tariff sheets to go into effect for service on and after April 1, 2018, the requested effective date:

Staff has verified that Veolia is not delinquent on any assessment and has filed its Annual Report. Veolia is current on its submission of its Surveillance Monitoring reports as required in 4 CSR 240-20.090(10) and its monthly reports as required by 4 CSR 240-3.161(5). Staff is not aware of any other matter pending before the Commission that affects or is affected by this tariff filing. Staff's recommendation for approval of the PACC change in this case is solely based on the accuracy of Veolia's calculations.
