**ORDER REGARDING MOTION FOR RECONSIDERATION**

The Commission is denying the *Motion for Reconsideration, Or, In the Alternative, Application for Rehearing and Motion for Stay of Commission Orders* (“motion”)<sup>1</sup> filed by Summit Natural Gas of Missouri, Inc. (“Summit”). The motion seeks rehearing or reconsideration of the Commission’s *Order Granting Motion to Compel* (“order”).<sup>2</sup>

The standard for rehearing is:

Applications for rehearing may be filed pursuant to statute. [<sup>3</sup>]

The statute on rehearing<sup>4</sup> applies only to a final order disposing of all issues as to all parties.<sup>5</sup> That does not describe the order, which is an interlocutory ruling on a discovery dispute. Therefore, the Commission will deny the motion as to re-hearing.

The order is subject to reconsideration under the following standard:

Motions for reconsideration shall set forth specifically the ground(s) on which the applicant considers the order to be unlawful, unjust, or unreasonable.<sup>6]</sup>

The grounds set forth in the motion do not show that the order is unlawful, unjust, or unreasonable. Therefore, the Commission will deny the motion as to reconsideration.

**THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:**

1. The *Motion for Reconsideration, Or, In the Alternative, Application for Rehearing and Motion for Stay of Commission Orders* is denied.
2. This order is effective immediately upon issuance.
