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1 PROCEEDINGS
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- JUDGE LANE: Okay. We're going to go
- 3 ahead and go on the record. My name is Benjamin
- 4 Lane. I am the regulatory law judge who is
- 5 serving -- will serve as the hearing officer in this
- 6 case. And this is Stanley Lewis versus Laclede Gas,
- 7 Case Number GC-2007-0267, and we're here today for a
- 8 prehearing conference in Mr. Lewis's pro se complaint
- 9 against Laclede Gas.
- 10 This conference was scheduled by order
- 11 dated April 17th, 2007, with notice to all parties,
- 12 and all parties were notified that attendance was
- 13 mandatory and that if a continuance were needed or
- 14 additional accommodations to attend this hearing were
- 15 required, I was to be called at my office, or in the
- 16 case of a continuance, notice was to be served on all
- 17 parties prior to the prehearing conference explaining
- 18 what the need for the continuance was.
- I did not receive any requests for
- 20 continuance. Mr. Lewis, the complainant, did request
- 21 a telephone to participate in this hearing by
- 22 telephone conference, and he is present with us here
- 23 today. And I want to just say -- state for the
- 24 record who is present on this call at this time.
- It is approximately 10:10 a.m. on

- 1 Tuesday, May the 1st, and the hearing was scheduled
- 2 to convene at ten o'clock on the 1st -- well, rather
- 3 than me do that, why don't I go ahead and have the
- 4 parties who are present, the attorneys enter their
- 5 appearances just for the record.
- I know that you have filed written
- 7 entries, but just for the record, if you wouldn't
- 8 mind entering your oral entry of appearance. And
- 9 we'll start with Staff.
- 10 MR. BERLIN: Bob Berlin on behalf of the
- 11 Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, Post
- 12 Office Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
- MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing on
- 14 behalf of the Office of Public Counsel.
- JUDGE LANE: And Mr. Lewis, you are
- 16 present as well, right?
- 17 MR. LEWIS: Yes, sir.
- 18 JUDGE LANE: Okay. I will note that
- 19 there is no representative from Laclede present
- 20 either on the phone or in person. And again, I just
- 21 wanted to note that I have received no request for a
- 22 continuance, no phone messages and no e-mails
- 23 regarding their lack of participation in this
- 24 hearing.
- Normally what I would do right now,

- 1 Mr. Lewis, is -- and just so that you know, there are
- 2 also members of Staff here that have -- were involved
- 3 in the investigation of your informal complaint and
- 4 are familiar with the details of your case.
- Now, normally what I would do at this
- 6 point, Mr. Lewis, is describe the purposes of a
- 7 prehearing conference and what -- what the objectives
- 8 are. And I might as well go ahead and tell you what
- 9 they are in case this is -- winds up being
- 10 rescheduled.
- 11 One of the things you should be prepared
- 12 to discuss here, of course, is the nature of any
- 13 discovery that may need to be conducted. And by
- 14 discovery, Mr. Lewis, we mean the ability -- your
- 15 ability to request information from the other side,
- 16 from Laclede, you know, concerning details about your
- 17 account or anything -- any documents that they may
- 18 have that you may find useful in prosecuting your
- 19 case.
- 20 And the same thing applies for Laclede.
- 21 They'll be able to request information of you. And
- 22 so that's called the discovery process. And that
- 23 may -- sounds like discovery in this case will not
- 24 need to be voluminous, but in case there were some
- 25 documents or other information that is needed, that

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1 can be done once the prehearing conference is
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- 2 completed and we proceed toward an actual hearing.
- 3 You should also be prepared once the --
- 4 once we get past the prehearing conference to put
- 5 together a list of any witnesses that you plan to
- 6 call for your side. And the other side will do the
- 7 same, and also Staff will have witnesses and the
- 8 Office of Public Counsel also might want to have
- 9 witnesses as well. They have the right to call them.
- 10 Also any exhibits, that's written --
- 11 usually written documents or charts or graphs, things
- 12 like that. But the main purpose of the prehearing
- 13 conference -- I'm kind of getting ahead of myself --
- 14 the main purpose of the prehearing conference is to
- 15 provide an opportunity for all the parties to sit
- 16 down at the same table, or in this case, the same
- 17 virtual table, over the phone, and have an
- 18 opportunity to pursue settlement discussions.
- 19 Because it's been my experience that at
- 20 the prehearing conference it's really the last best
- 21 chance for the parties to get together and attempt to
- 22 resolve their differences amicably and see if they
- 23 can work something out just sitting together around a
- 24 table.
- 25 And it's important for you to know,

- 1 Mr. Lewis, that nothing that's said at the prehearing
- 2 conference can be used as evidence against you or be
- 3 admissible in the hearing unless it's -- can be
- 4 proved by independent evidence that's outside of the
- 5 scope of the hearing -- of the hearing room that
- 6 we're in today.
- 7 So it's designed to encourage a very
- 8 frank and very open discussion of the issues. And,
- 9 you know, if the parties can both give a little,
- 10 maybe we can get this thing settled and not need to
- 11 go through the time and expense of having a full
- 12 blown hearing, you know, where the attorneys will be
- 13 asking you questions. And Mr. Lewis, you'll have the
- 14 opportunity to ask questions of the other sides'
- 15 witnesses and provide your own statement and any
- 16 witnesses you may have.
- 17 And I know that process may be
- 18 unfamiliar to you and a little bit daunting, so I'm
- 19 just suggesting that the settlement process that we
- 20 can have at these types of hearings is conducive to
- 21 working that out so everyone can avoid that.
- MR. LEWIS: Yes, sir.
- JUDGE LANE: Do you understand that,
- 24 Mr. Lewis?
- MR. LEWIS: Yes, sir.

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1 JUDGE LANE: Okay. And as I said
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- 2 before, if the parties don't resolve their
- 3 differences at the prehearing conference, then what I
- 4 will probably do is issue an order requiring the
- 5 parties to enter into a proposed procedural schedule
- 6 where we get all of these -- the discovery matters
- 7 and the witnesses and the exhibits and all that, we
- 8 get all that squared away, and then when that's all
- 9 done, we'll go ahead and we'll have a hearing on the
- 10 merits of your complaint.
- MR. LEWIS: Okay.
- 12 JUDGE LANE: Okay. Well, unfortunately,
- 13 most of that process is short-circuited right now
- 14 because Laclede is not here. That's the other side.
- MR. LEWIS: Okay.
- JUDGE LANE: That's the Respondent in
- 17 this matter. And without their presence, of course,
- 18 I don't think we can get too far in terms of
- 19 settlement.
- 20 However, I do want -- and I do want to
- 21 say that with regard to Laclede, the order scheduling
- 22 this prehearing conference specified that if any
- 23 party does not appear without providing a continuance
- 24 or without giving advance notice of their absence,
- 25 the Commission's going to enter an order asking them

1 to show cause why they should not be dismissed from

- 2 the case or lose the case for their failure to
- 3 appear. So that's going to be coming, a show cause
- 4 order having Laclede explain what good cause -- or
- 5 what the cause was for why they're not here today.
- 6 Because these are important matters. We
- 7 schedule them, we have the time. There are four
- 8 people here taking up valuable time, plus your time,
- 9 Mr. Lewis.
- MR. LEWIS: Okay.
- 11 JUDGE LANE: So that will be coming down
- 12 the pike. Now, you don't need to worry about
- 13 responding to that. That's their responsibility.
- MR. LEWIS: Yes, sir.
- 15 JUDGE LANE: But I do want to suggest
- 16 this before we go off the record, and I wanted you to
- 17 know that if we do have another prehearing
- 18 conference, I will actually leave the room while you
- 19 and Laclede and Staff and Public Counsel and the
- 20 Staff personnel that are here to help in this
- 21 process, I'll leave so that I'm not bias or
- 22 prejudiced by anything that I might hear as the judge
- 23 in this case.
- MR. LEWIS: Okay.
- 25 JUDGE LANE: Okay? But I do want to

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1 suggest before we go off the record that if you feel
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- 2 that anything -- it would be helpful to discuss your
- 3 case or to, you know, try to reach, you know, some
- 4 type of agreement in principle or narrow the issues
- 5 down, if you feel that could be useful with the
- 6 parties who are present here today --
- 7 MR. LEWIS: Yes, sir.
- JUDGE LANE: -- you are perfectly free
- 9 to go ahead and do that, to talk with the attorney
- 10 from Staff, to talk with the attorney from the Public
- 11 Counsel who represents the public at large in these
- 12 proceedings and to talk with the members of Staff who
- 13 are here who investigated your informal complaint.
- Do you think that might be helpful,
- 15 Mr. Lewis?
- MR. LEWIS: I really don't think it's
- 17 that serious.
- JUDGE LANE: You don't think what?
- 19 MR. LEWIS: I said I don't really think
- 20 it's necessary. I think they got, you know, the
- 21 previous records, the bills that I paid, the existing
- 22 bills that I paid, plus the repairs that they have
- 23 done to the stove that I had put in and the -- they
- 24 looked over the furnace and the hot water tank.
- 25 JUDGE LANE: Yes, sir. I understand

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1 that from your complaint that they came over and
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- 2 verified that those appliances were working properly.
- Well, all right. I'm certainly not
- 4 gonna put a gun to your head and force you to stay
- 5 here and, you know, engage in some give-and-take and
- 6 to maybe talk about, you know, to narrow down maybe
- 7 some of the issues in the case.
- 8 But I'm getting ready to take this
- 9 proceeding off the record, and I want to thank our
- 10 court reporter for being here this morning, Pam, and
- 11 I'm about ready to conclude this hearing.
- 12 Is there anything else you would like to
- 13 ask of me while I'm still here?
- MR. LEWIS: Huh-uh.
- JUDGE LANE: No?
- MR. LEWIS: Yes, sir.
- 17 JUDGE LANE: Okay. Very good. Well,
- 18 I'm going to go ahead and take us off the record, and
- 19 if you want to stay on the line and, you know,
- 20 Mr. Poston, if you want to, you know, maybe kick
- 21 something off or -- I don't know. It's unknown.
- 22 But Mr. Lewis, if you want to stay on
- 23 the line, feel free. If not, go ahead and just --
- 24 we'll terminate this call and we'll take it from
- 25 here, okay?
