3	Taylor verse Laclede Gas Company. My name is Kennard Jones I'm
4	the regulatory law judge presiding over this pre-hearing
5	conference.
6	For your benefit, this pre-hearing conference serves
7	two purposes, one to make sure we are on the same page as far as
8	issues are concerned, and two, to give you guys an opportunity
9	to talk and perhaps come to an agreement.
10	MS. TAYLOR: Okay.
11	JUDGE JONES: If you are unable to come to an
12	agreement, then we'll serve a third purpose which is to set up a
13	procedural schedule.
14	MS. TAYLOR: Okay.
15	JUDGE JONES: Which involves trading information,
16	you've been able to ask them for information to prepare your
17	case and set a hearing date and that hearing would also be here.
18	MS. TAYLOR: Okay.
19	JUDGE JONES: If we have to have a hearing it would be
20	in this room.
21	MS. TAYLOR: Got ya.
22	JUDGE JONES: Do you have any questions?
23	MS. TAYLOR: No.

21	into a house with my husband, the address was 3824 Bramble, no
22	2358 Bramble, I'm sorry. I called Laclede Gas and after I paid
23	that account to zero and I asked them, said nobody is living at
24	the home, what can I do. They told me to go ahead and cut the
25	water off and the gas off at the residence since nobody was

1	there, there was no sense, they said or, I can pay \$30 a month
2	just for, just to have an active service although no gas was
3	being used, and I told them well I can just cut it off nobody
4	lives there.
5	So all that time had passed, I moved into my new home
6	that me and my husband bought on 3824 Salida Court and I guess
7	when I transferred things into my name at Laclede Gas for my new
8	residence, they put the account together, therefore I found out
9	that the service on Lee Avenue was still occurring a bill for a
10	vacant home, so I was confused. I had to ask them, the gas was
11	cut off and the house was vacant, how can that happen.
12	So in May of 2013, wait no, March of 20 no, it was
13	May of 2013, when I saw that they had added this bill together,
14	Laclede Gas sent a technician out to my home on Lee Avenue, the
15	technician came into the house, went downstairs and I don't know
16	what they do and how they read anything, but he said he read the
17	meter and the meter was still the same reading from when they
18	checked it automatically from March of 2012. So he was he
19	told me he was unsure of why there was a bill because the meter
20	reading was still the exact same reading from March of 2012,
21	from May to 2013. He said something like they have to do an
22	annual check or just to keep their records straight, but his
23	reading on his thing and from what the record showed said the
24	reading was still exactly the same, no gas had been used.
25	JUDGE JONES: So you actually in March of 2012 when

21	here's some bills from '13, what our records showed was that we
22	turned service on for Miss Taylor on October 9, 2012, and the
23	bills as I was just looking at that, that's '13, '14, let's see,
24	the balance, that starts in '13 right there, I don't find
25	anything right away from earlier than October of 2012.
