Dear Chairman Brown:

ONCE AGAIN, WE ARE WRITING THE COMMISSION REGARDING AMERICAN MISSOURI HAS FILED REVISED TARIFF SHEETS DESIGNED TO INCREASE THE COMPANY'S ELECTRIC SERVICE REVENUE BY APPROXIMATELY \$263 MILLION. THE AVERAGE RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMER THE PROPOSED INCREASE OF APPROXIMATELY 11% OR \$9.30 PER MONTH OR \$111.60 A YEAR. IN ADDITION TO CONTINUE ITS FUEL ADJUSTMENT CLAUSE THAT REFLECTS CHANGES IN THE COST OF FUEL USED TO GENERATE ELECTRICITY ON THE CUSTOMER'S BILL.

WE ARE NOT IN FAVOR OF THESE PROPOSED INCREASES BECAUSE.

- A. SENIOR CITIZENS HAVE NOT RECEIVED AN INCREASE IN SOCIAL SECURITY IN 2010 & 2011.
- B. IT'S BEEN REPORTED THAT AMERICAN MISSOURI HAS INCREASED RATES BY 26% OVER 2 YEARS.
- C. CONCERNED ABOUT EXECUTIVE PAY & BONUSES.
- D. WHAT ABOUT COMPANY CARE & OTHER PERKS?
- E. MISSOURI RESIDENTS AND BUSINESS ARE STRUGGLING THROUGH BAD ECONOMY, HIGH UNEMPLOYMENT, GAS AND FOOD INCREASES.
