- JUDGE DIPPELL: This is Case No.
- 3 GC-2009-0036; Staff of the Missouri Public Service
- 4 Commission versus Missouri Gas Energy, a Division of
- 5 Southern Union Company.
- 6 My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the Regulatory Law
- 7 Judge assigned to this case, and I've directed the
- 8 parties to be here today for a prehearing conference
- 9 to discuss the procedural schedule for this case and
- 10 any potential settlement talks that they would like to
- 11 have off the record.
- 12 And I will begin by asking for the attorneys to
- make entries of appearance, and I'll start with Staff.
- 14 MR. REED: Steve Reed and Bob Berlin for
- 15 the Staff, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson City, Missouri
- 16 65102.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPELL: And for MGE.
- 18 MR. BOUDREAU: Let the record reflect the
- 19 appearance of Paul Boudreau with the law firm of
- 20 Bryden, Swearengen & England, P.O. Box 456, Jefferson
- 21 City, Missouri, appearing on behalf of MGE.
- 22 Also here today on behalf of MGE is Todd Jacobs,
- 23 senior attorney. His mailing address is 3420
- 24 Broadway, Kansas City, Missouri 64111.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: And Public Counsel.

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1 MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing for the
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- 2 Office of the Public Counsel and the public.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Thank you.
- 4 Well, as I said, basically I asked you guys to
- 5 come here today to talk about a procedural schedule
- 6 and possible settlement of your dispute, and I would
- 7 greatly encourage those talks to take place.
- 8 Did anyone have anything that they wanted to bring
- 9 up to me?
- 10 MR. BOUDREAU: Actually, I did. And I'll
- 11 discuss this in more detail with the other parties,
- 12 but I was looking at the procedural order, which is
- 13 kind of a standard procedural order, and I'm not sure
- 14 that this case in some ways is real conducive to
- 15 setting out a procedural schedule as has been
- 16 requested.
- 17 In a lot of cases it's been the procedural
- 18 schedule that drives things. I mean, the filing
- 19 reveals things. In this case, although I have a
- 20 general idea of what Staff's concerns about the tariff
- 21 are, I'm not sure what their case is going to be, how
- 22 many witnesses they're going to use, the theories of
- 23 the case, and so I'm not sure that we're in a good
- 24 position to know what we are going to have to do to
- 25 react to that and to prepare a case.

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1 So we are going to have to talk about discovery
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- 2 and the length of discovery, the possibility of
- 3 depositions -- there's just a lot of unknowns about
- 4 this case.
- 5 And one of the things I wanted to discuss with the
- 6 other parties, and I wanted to get the Commission's
- 7 feedback on this, is that one of the things that I
- 8 want to discuss with OPC and Staff is the possibility
- 9 of instead of setting a hearing date that we maybe set
- 10 up a procedural schedule to be finished up with
- 11 another prehearing conference, and that way, at that
- 12 point, possibly schedule the hearing. Simply because,
- 13 you know, trying to set a hearing at this point is
- 14 kind of problematic.
- 15 And the only guidance I'd like to know from you
- 16 is, is that something that the Commission would
- 17 consider, or is the order saying you need a hearing
- 18 date, is that firm?
- 19 JUDGE DIPPELL: No. And certainly you guys
- 20 could vary from that if you want to, at least, you
- 21 know, let me know how you'd like things to progress
- 22 maybe with if you want to put a limit on discovery
- 23 time, if you want to set another prehearing conference
- 24 or settlement conference, if you want to -- there's
- 25 some legal issues in the answer, there's some in these

- 1 defenses, if you all think that you might want to have
- 2 oral arguments on those or something along those
- 3 lines.
- 4 I would be interested in having a response from
- 5 Staff and Public Counsel, if they desire, with regard
- 6 to some of those legal issues that were raised as
- 7 defenses in the answer.
- 8 MR. BOUDREAU: That's helpful. I just
- 9 wanted to know if something like that would be dead on
- 10 arrival. That gives me some guidance on topics of
- 11 discussion.
- 12 JUDGE DIPPELL: Right. So if you can't
- 13 agree to, or don't want to, or agree not to set an
- 14 official schedule -- and you're right, this was sort
- 15 of just a format of procedural -- it might not meet
- 16 the needs of this case.
- 17 MR. REED: Judge, along those lines, can we
- 18 have until the 7th to file it?
- 19 JUDGE DIPPELL: Yes.
- 20 MR. REED: Because I think Monday I'm in a
- 21 seminar all day.
- JUDGE DIPPELL: All right. And I'm not
- 23 sure, I think that date got put in there and I got
- 24 this issued a day later than I had intended.
- 25 MR. REED: So you'll forgive us if we do it

- 1 the 7th?
- JUDGE DIPPELL: In fact, if you like, I'll
- 3 give you to the end of the week.
- 4 MR. REED: Of next week?
- JUDGE DIPPELL: Yeah. I'm not sure what
- 6 that date is. I think it's the 10th.
- 7 MR. REED: Yes.
- 8 JUDGE DIPPELL: And that will give you a
- 9 little more time. This case might be a little bit
- 10 more difficult to decide on how it should proceed
- 11 along.
- 12 Is there anything else that anyone would like to
- 13 bring up? I see Steve's got a calendar there, and I
- 14 didn't think to print off a copy of the Commission's
- 15 calendar.
- MR. REED: It's relatively recent, and just
- 17 in looking at it -- we'll talk about what we want to
- 18 do, you know, but December is obviously too early, and
- 19 we have a few dates there, but February and March, I
- 20 guess, is where the calendar begins to clear. Is that
- 21 your impression?
- 22 JUDGE DIPPELL: Yes. I know I've already
- 23 saved a few dates. When you get past the end of March
- 24 you start getting back into rate cases again.
- MR. REED: Is that KCPL?

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JUDGE DIPPELL: KCPL, Aquila and Greater
    Kansas City, Missouri, Operations -- whatever their
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    new name is. It's actually two different cases.
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          So right now those dates are reserved. We can

    double book if we need to, but given that it's a gas
 6
    hearing and -- well, those are electric cases, but
7
    usually it makes it a little difficult for Staff and
 8
    Public Counsel if you've got those major things going
9
    on at the same time.
