Page 3 P R O C E E D I N G S 1 2 JUDGE BURTON: All right. Let's go ahead 3 and go on the record in the matter of Craig A. Smith, Complainant, versus Laclede Gas Company, 4 5 Respondent. And that's File No. GC-2015-0147. 6 My name is Kim Burton. I'm the Regulatory 7 Law Judge who has been assigned to this matter that's currently before the Missouri Public Service 8 Commission. 9 10 At this time, I would ask that all the parties enter their appearance for the record. 11 12 Mr. Smith, let us know if you can't hear anyone just because of where things are situated in our --13 in our room. But let's go ahead and start with the 14 15 Complainant. 16 MR. SMITH: This is Craig Smith. I'm a 17 pro se attorney. 18 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. And would you please provide your address for the court reporter? 19 20 MR. SMITH: My office address is 141 North 21 Meramec, M-e-r-a-m-e-c, Suite 201, Clayton, Missouri, 63105. 22 23 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Thank you. And on 24 behalf of Laclede Gas Company? 25 MR. ZUCKER: Rick Zucker here for Laclede

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1	Gas Company. We are located at 700 Market Street,	
2	6th Floor, St. Louis, Missouri, 63101. And I'm	
3	here with Mike Pendergast.	
4	JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Thank you. And on	
5	behalf of the Staff of the Commission?	
6	MR. BORGMEYER: Yes. Thank you, your	
7	Honor. Appearing for the Staff of the Missouri	
8	Public Service Commission, my name is John	
9	Borgmeyer. Address is P.O. Box 360, Jefferson	
10	City, Missouri, 65102.	
11	And with me, I have Justin Edwards, the	
12	Staff member who investigated this complaint, and I	
13	have Gay Fred, who is the Manager of the Consumer	
14	Services Department.	
15	JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Thank you. And on	
16	behalf of the Office of Public Counsel?	
17	MR. POSTON: Marc Poston appearing for	
18	Office of Public Counsel, P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson	
19	City, Missouri, 65102.	
20	JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Thank you, everyone.	
21	Now, the reason I requested this pre-hearing	
22	conference is we received the Complaint as well as	
23	the Answer and Staff's report and recommendation.	
24	And the way this usually works, Mr. Smith,	
25	is we provide an opportunity after we go off the	

Page 5 record here for the parties to discuss and resolve 1 2 any -- attempt to discuss and resolve any ongoing 3 conflict. And if there seems to be issues that are 4 5 still in dispute, my aim is to try to keep things moving by setting a schedule and requesting a 6 7 hearing date if that's needed. 8 Now, Mr. Smith, normally what we do, we 9 have hearing offices here in Jefferson City, Missouri. But we also have offices located in 10 St. Louis. And I believe that's where you're 11 located, correct? 12 MR. SMITH: Correct. 13 14 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. So if we do need a 15 hearing, we will look to what would be the most convenient for you. 16 17 MR. SMITH: Right. JUDGE BURTON: And so if that's a -- a 18 location in St. Louis, please let me know. 19 20 MR. SMITH: Right. That would be where --21 Clayton is the County seat, so either Clayton or the City of St. Louis. City of St. Louis is ten 22 miles away, so that's no big deal. 23 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. And what I would 24 request at that point is, I'm going to let the 25

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1	parties just let me know if there's any dispute	
2	that we believe needs to be resolved through a	
3	hearing before the Commission.	
4	MR. SMITH: Okay. Do you want me to talk	
5	for a couple minutes?	
6	JUDGE BURTON: Yes. That's fine.	
7	MR. SMITH: I'm assuming you have my	
8	Complaint and you reviewed it. There's kind of a	
9	long, rolling history of frustration with Laclede	
10	Gas on my part, the culmination that kind of	
11	prompted the filing of the lawsuit, which was then	
12	met with a Motion to Dismiss, saying that I needed	
13	to file a formal Complaint.	
14	So I filed the formal Complaint because	
15	Laclede gas said I needed to file a formal	
16	Complaint. It was that they they sent me a gas	
17	cut-off notice over a dispute with their estimating	
18	my gas for a period of a year and then finally	
19	coming out in 11 months and some days and changing	
20	the meter and telling me I owed them \$650.	
21	While I was asking how they came up with	
22	the 650, I got a letter in the mail saying they	
23	were going to cut off my gas and that I had to pay	
24	by credit card that weekend on the telephone or	
25	they're going to come out and cut off my gas and	

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I'd owe additional money. 1 2 So I paid by credit card. And when they 3 sent me that notice, I had signed up for this Easy Pay plan. But the Easy Way plan, for some reason, 4 5 wasn't an option. 6 And they demanded that I -- I pay in cash 7 at their window or by credit card on the telephone. 8 So I paid it. And then the Easy Pay plan. When 9 this rolled around, it took out another 650 bucks or whatever it was. \$600 plus. 10 11 So I double paid once, you know, basically 12 under duress and then by the Easy Pay plan. And 13 then they didn't refund my money. And it became pretty obvious that what 14 15 they were going to do was hold onto my money. And then when my 50 or \$100, \$150 gas bill came in over 16 17 a period of months, they were going to credit me for that money. 18 19 And that didn't seem right to me. It. seemed like, you know, if they could Easy Pay take 20 21 my money, they should Easy Pay put it back in. So it made me mad that they had basically 22 converted this money and they were going to hold it 23 24 and not refund it. And I was upset that, you know, I have to pay by credit cards or they'll cut my gas 25

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1	off right now, right now, right now. And yet when	
2	they get an overpayment, they sit on it and they	
3	take their sweet time in paying it back	
4	JUDGE BURTON: Mr. Smith, I'm going to	
5	just interject real quick here. We're not actually	
6	conducting an evidentiary hearing to take testimony	
7	on this.	
8	MR. SMITH: Okay.	
9	JUDGE BURTON: What I'm trying to	
10	determine is, is there still a dispute?	
11	MR. SMITH: Here's where we're at. Here's	
12	where we're at. They have now refunded my money.	
13	So sitting here today, I do not have a in the	
14	State Court action, I asked for punitive damages	
15	for conversion, but I dismissed that lawsuit	
16	without prejudice.	
17	So only thing left is this thing. They've	
18	refunded my money, so I do not have a monetary	
19	claim against Laclede Gas. But what I do have is	
20	you the handling of this.	
21	And it's my understanding that the PSC has	
22	made some recommendations how Laclede Gas or other	
23	people could better address refunds when they get	
24	too much money, and, also, the handling of the	
25	estimated meter readings.	

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1	I sent in a series of meter readings,	
2	which they never acknowledged receiving. And had	
3	they had they got them and recorded them, then	
4	there wouldn't have been this \$650 surprise at the	
5	end of the year of them not having my meter wrong	
6	and coming out and reading the meter.	
7	And I understand there's some	
8	recommendations that they do a better job of doing	
9	something with these cards that they sent out,	
10	which I think they're required to send out the	
11	cards. And then you go down to the basement with	
12	your flashlight and read it.	
13	So, basically, what I told the PSC Counsel	
14	is, you know, where I'm at now is no money, but I	
15	would like to see the PSC address the concerns I	
16	have about how they handled the meter cards and how	
17	they handled my refund, not so much for me, but as	
18	a matter of policy going forward.	
19	And I understand there's some	
20	recommendations. And I've also told Counsel for	
21	Laclede that, you know, I'd be happy if Laclede and	
22	the PSC staff worked out whatever recommendations	
23	came from this Complaint and something was done for	
24	the better of people in the future that are stuck	
25	where I was stuck on the cards not being read and	

Page 10 my refund not being made. 1 2 JUDGE BURTON: Okay. Then why don't --3 why don't we proceed this way, then? I haven't heard from the attorneys yet for Staff, the Office 4 5 of Public Counsel or for Laclede, but it seems to me as if you're content with the recommendations 6 that Staff has made, correct? 7 MR. SMITH: Sure. I'll live with whatever 8 9 they agree to. 10 JUDGE BURTON: Then why don't we do this? 11 We can go off the record and see if the parties 12 want to go ahead and discuss outside of my presence an off-the-record resolution or Laclede's position 13 on those recommendations with Staff. 14 15 And you are more than welcome to stay on the line, Mr. Smith, and participate in that call 16 17 and see if that addresses your concerns. 18 MR. SMITH: I'll be glad to listen, and I promise to keep my -- my windy mouth shut as much 19 20 as possible to let them work it out between 21 themselves. But I am interested in it, so I'd like 22 to stay on and hear what they have to say. JUDGE BURTON: How about this? I know 23 you're saying you're acting Pro Se. But why don't 24 25 I just ask staff to just file a -- a status report

Page 11 after the meeting, let's say, within the next week. 1 2 Would that -- is that sufficient time --3 MR. BORGMEYER: Yes. JUDGE BURTON: -- Mr. Borgmeyer? Okay. 4 5 So that would be till the 18th of March to file a status report on behalf of all the parties just 6 7 indicating where we are. 8 And perhaps if -- if there is a resolution 9 to this or at that point, let me know, Mr. Smith. You can file a motion -- you can -- the parties can 10 file a Motion to Dismiss or you can voluntarily 11 12 determine and submit a request to dismiss your 13 Complaint. I'm not trying to pressure you to do that 14 now. I'm just saying that's your option --15 16 MR. SMITH: All right. 17 JUDGE BURTON: -- after -- after listening to this. So I will wait with baited breath until 18 the 18th and see what the report is, and we will 19 20 proceed from there. 21 MR. BORGMEYER: Sounds fine, your Honor. Thanks. 22 23 JUDGE BURTON: Are there any other issues that we need to address while we're on the record? 24 25 MR. ZUCKER: I don't believe so.

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1	JUDGE BURTON: Well, I thank everybody for
2	their time, and I hope we can revolve so that
3	everyone can enjoy the pleasant spring weather and
