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- JUDGE DIPPEL: Okay. Let's go ahead and
- 3 go on the record.
- 4 My name's Nancy Dippel. I'm the
- 5 Regulatory Law Judge assigned to this case, and we have
- 6 come here today for Case No. GC-2017-0173, in the
- 7 matter of Montgomery and Greaser, Complainant, versus
- 8 Union Electric Company doing business as Ameren
- 9 Missouri for Respondent. We've come here today for a
- 10 procedural conference.
- Mr. Greas-- or Mr. Montgomery was
- 12 representing this firm in the complaint, is the
- 13 Complainant, and has not appeared on our teleconference
- 14 yet, and I have attempted to call his number that was
- 15 on the pleading and did not get an answer and there was
- 16 no way to leave a message. So, we're going -- it's now
- 17 10:15, and we're going to go ahead and --
- Oh, has someone joined us? Hello?
- 19 UNKNOWN PERSON: Hello. I'm calling for
- 20 Malcom Montgomery.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Yes.
- 22 UNKNOWN PERSON: He wanted me to call and
- 23 get this all set up for him. I will now transfer the
- 24 call to him. Okay?
- 25 JUDGE DIPPEL: Okay. Thank you.

1 UNKNOWN PERSON: You're welcome	· ·
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- JUDGE DIPPEL: We can go off the record
- 3 while we get this set up.
- 4 (Off the record.)
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Mr. Montgomery?
- 6 MR. MONTGOMERY: Hello. This is Malcom
- 7 Montgomery. I am sorry for being late.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: All right. We can barely
- 9 hear you, Mr. Montgomery.
- 10 MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay. Can you hear me
- 11 better now?
- 12 JUDGE DIPPEL: Yes. I'm Nancy Dippel.
- 13 I'm the Regulatory Law Judge.
- Okay. So, Mr. Montgomery has joined us
- 15 on the telephone, and I'm going to begin with entries
- 16 of appearance.
- 17 And, Mr. Montgomery, I'll go ahead and
- 18 let you go first.
- 19 MR. MONTGOMERY: My name is Malcom H.
- 20 Montgomery. I am the complainant, and I think that's
- 21 it? Right?
- JUDGE DIPPEL: That's fine.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: And for the Company?
- MS. GIBONEY: For Union Electric Company

- 1 doing business as Ameren Missouri, I'm Sarah Giboney of
- 2 the law firm Smith Lewis. My address is 111 South
- 3 Ninth Street, Columbia, Missouri, 65201, and with me as
- 4 a company representative is Ms. Cathy Hart.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: And for Staff?
- 6 MS. ASLIN: For Staff counsel, Casi Aslin
- 7 and Jeff Keevil, and as our representative from Staff,
- 8 we have Michelle Bocklidge. Our address is P.O. Box
- 9 360, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: And, Mr. Montgomery, could
- 11 you hear Ms. Aslin all right?
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Kind of. That's all
- 13 right.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Okay.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: No problem.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: I'll have her speak up a
- 17 little.
- 18 MR. MONTGOMERY: All right.
- 19 JUDGE DIPPEL: All right then.
- Okay. So, I called you here today for a
- 21 Procedural Conference and sort of an opportunity for
- 22 you all to discuss this matter and see if there's any
- 23 settlement or satisfaction that can be reached.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: I don't actually have a

- 1 lot of procedural matters before us. Just, if there is
- 2 not a settlement that can be reached, then we would go
- 3 ahead and -- and do a procedural schedule to set this
- 4 for hearing. And, so, you might consider that if -- if
- 5 there's --
- 6 MR. MONTGOMERY: So -- so, this is not
- 7 for purpose of -- excuse me. But this is not for
- 8 purpose of actually arguing the merits today.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPEL: That is correct.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- 11 JUDGE DIPPEL: This is just a conference,
- 12 like I say, to see if you all can -- can reach any kind
- 13 of settlement; and, if not, then for you to maybe agree
- 14 to a date for a hearing or --
- MR. MONTGOMERY: And -- and the date for
- 16 hearing, that -- that hearing would be conducted where?
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Well, as this is a small
- 18 complaint matter --
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Yes.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Oh, yes. I'm sorry. I
- 21 was just -- I just realize this is not residential
- 22 complaint. Our Residential Complaint Rule or a Small
- 23 Complaint Rule requires that, if you request it, we
- 24 come to you. But I'm not sure if that counts for
- 25 commercial.

- 1 MR. MONTGOMERY: On a commercial
- 2 building?
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Does Staff know the answer
- 4 to that? I'll have to actually -- to be honest, I'll
- 5 have to look at the rule, Mr. Montgomery.
- 6 MR. MONTGOMERY: Well, I'd certainly
- 7 request that you come to me instead of me going to you,
- 8 but -- but I appreciate you looking into it, yes.
- 9 JUDGE DIPPEL: And -- and we can, even if
- 10 -- if it's conducted here.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- MS. GIBONEY: I just looked at the rule,
- 13 and it just says if a customer of a utility files a
- 14 formal complaint regarding any dispute involving less
- 15 than \$3,000. So, I guess it applies to any customer.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Okay. So, it does apply
- 17 to you then. So -- so, you --
- MR. MONTGOMERY: So, we can -- we can
- 19 have a hearing here -- here in Cape Girardeau?
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Yes.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Good. Okay.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: You know, as -- as
- 23 somebody from -- who is from that area, I -- I hope
- 24 that you can reach a settlement.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Well, I -- I'd certainly

- 1 like to.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: All right. But, yes. And
- 3 -- and, Mr. Montgomery, our procedural rules, do you
- 4 have a copy of those?
- 5 MR. MONTGOMERY: I'm not sure that I do.
- 6 You may well have sent them to me. I actually reviewed
- 7 this matter from the standpoint of merits, but I don't
- 8 know that I actually reviewed it from the standpoint of
- 9 procedures.
- 10 JUDGE DIPPEL: Okay. Well --
- MR. MONTGOMERY: You may well have sent
- 12 them to me, but I apologize, I have -- I have not
- 13 reviewed those.
- 14 JUDGE DIPPEL: Our small complaints are
- 15 generally more informal anyway --
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- 17 JUDGE DIPPEL: -- but I -- I will direct
- 18 you, they're in the Code of State Regulations --
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: -- in Chapter -- what is
- 21 it? -- 240 --
- 22 MR. KEEVIL: 4-- 4 CSR 240-2.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Yeah.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay. And I'm sorry. I
- 25 -- I know -- I could not hear him, so --

- 1 JUDGE DIPPEL: That's fine.
- 2 MR. MONTGOMERY: CSR what now?
- JUDGE DIPPEL: It's 4 CSR -- so, it's
- 4 Title 4 of the Code of State Regulations, Chapter 240,
- 5 or 240 is the -- the division number.
- 6 MR. MONTGOMERY: All right.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: And, then, our procedural
- 8 rules are in Chapter 2. So, if you go to the Secretary
- 9 of State's website, you can --
- 10 MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- 11 JUDGE DIPPEL: -- you can see all of
- 12 those rules.
- 13 MR. MONTGOMERY: Sure. That will be
- 14 fine. That will be fine.
- 15 JUDGE DIPPEL: And, so, that's really all
- 16 I have, unless there are other procedural motions or
- 17 comments that you would like to make.
- 18 Mr. Montgomery, did you have anything
- 19 else?
- 20 MR. MONTGOMERY: Not from the standpoint
- 21 of procedural. And I would like to make a couple of
- 22 points in hopes that we can resolve this matter, but if
- 23 I'm not allowed to do that at this point, I understand.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Well, I'm going to --
- 25 after we're done with the formal stuff here, the Court

- 1 Reporter and I are going to leave, and I'm going to
- 2 leave you all to talk -- talk, hash it out in private.
- 3 Okay? So --
- 4 MR. MONTGOMERY: That's fine. But you're
- 5 more than welcome to be the referee throughout the
- 6 entire process.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Well, to keep my
- 8 neutrality for a --
- 9 MR. MONTGOMERY: I understand.
- 10 JUDGE DIPPEL: -- a hearing, I'll -- I
- 11 will not do that.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: I'll let you have your
- 14 settlement in private.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Yeah.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: So, did you have anything
- 17 further, Ms. Giboney?
- MS. GIBONEY: Judge, I was just wondering
- 19 what kind of timeline we might be looking at? I'm
- 20 hopeful we have a settlement, too, but if we don't,
- 21 should we maybe set a -- a date by which we would file
- 22 a Joint Procedural Schedule or something like that?
- 23 JUDGE DIPPEL: Well, yes. I would ask
- 24 that you all file a procedural schedule joint if you
- 25 can; if -- if you can't, individual within 10 days.

- 1 And I'll -- I can issue a notice about that.
- MS. GIBONEY: Thank you.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Thank you.
- 4 JUDGE DIPPEL: Again, the small complaint
- 5 procedure is more expedited as well. So --
- 6 MR. THOMAS: Judge, while you're talking
- 7 about that, just one thing. I mean, God forbid if it
- 8 goes to hearing, I do believe you can do the small
- 9 complaints by video or phone or something like that.
- 10 JUDGE DIPPEL: Yes. I -- I probably
- 11 would --
- 12 MR. THOMAS: I would certainly request
- 13 that you consider that very strongly.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Well, Judge, I -- I
- 15 certainly understand their request, but I would much
- 16 prefer everybody come down to Cape Girardeau.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: Well, we can -- we can
- 18 figure that out later.
- MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
- JUDGE DIPPEL: But, certainly, parties
- 21 such as Staff who is neutral, I would certainly be
- 22 willing to allow to appear by phone.
- 23 MS. GIBONEY: So long as anyone filing an
- 24 exhibit or wishing to use an exhibit would provide
- 25 copies before time electronically so that all the

1	parties will have them.
2	MR. MONTGOMERY: That's fine, Judge.
3	JUDGE DIPPEL: But, again, we'll discuss
4	that or I'll put discuss I'll put that in a
5	procedural order that comes out. But if you again,
6	if you don't have a settlement on the merits and you do
7	have some particulars about the procedure, you may
8	also, you know, agree to whatever procedure you'd like
9	to follow and and submit that to me as well.
10	MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
11	JUDGE DIPPEL: Anything else from Staff?
12	MS. ASLIN: No.
13	JUDGE DIPPEL: All right, then. I think
14	that concludes the on-the-record portion, so I will
15	leave the room and let you all talk it out. If you
16	have any questions for me, I will be in my office, and
17	you can reach me there. So
18	MS. GIBONEY: Thank you, Judge.
19	JUDGE DIPPEL: Thank you, Mr. Montgomery.
20	MR. MONTGOMERY: Judge, thank you.
21	JUDGE DIPPEL: And we'll go off the
22	record.
23	MR. MONTGOMERY: Okay.
24	(Off the record.)

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
