**ORDER GRANTING AMEREN MISSOURI'S
APPLICATION TO INTERVENE**

On November 9, 2010, MoGas Pipeline, LLC filed a pleading asking the Commission to declare a portion of its tariff to be unlawful, unconstitutional and void. MoGas also asked the Commission to declare the company's rates under that tariff to be void. On November 15, the Commission issued an order directing that notice of MoGas' pleading be sent to potentially interested parties. That order also established December 3 as the deadline for the submission of applications to intervene.

Union Electric Company, d/b/a Ameren Missouri, an electric and natural gas utility in Missouri, applied to intervene on November 18. Ameren Missouri indicates it has a direct interest in this proceeding because it is involved in litigation with MoGas to recover what it believes to be overcharges by MoGas for gas supplied under the tariffs at issue.

Commission rule 4 CSR 240-2.080(15) allows parties not more than ten days from the date of filing in which to respond to any pleading. More than ten days have passed since Ameren Missouri applied to intervene and no party has objected to that application.

The Commission finds that Ameren Missouri's interest in this case is different from that of the general public, and may be adversely affected by a final order arising from this case. Furthermore, the Commission finds that allowing Ameren Missouri to intervene will

serve the public interest. Therefore, in accordance with Commission Rule 4 CSR 240-2.075(4), the Commission will grant the application to intervene.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri's Application to Intervene is granted.
2. This order shall become effective immediately upon issuance.
