3	In 1988, I was employed by the Illinois Commerce Commission. My			
4	duties consisted of preparing studies of publicly held utilities operating within the State			
5	of Illinois.			
6	In 1994, I joined the Commission as an Engineer IV - Depreciation. In			
7	this position I have successfully completed training in Basic Depreciation Concepts,			
8	Models Used In Life and Salvage Studies, Forecasting Life and Salvage, and Advanced			
9	Topics in Analysis and Forecasting from Depreciation Programs, Incorporated. My			
10	duties consist of preparing depreciation studies and conducting engineering analysis for			
11	regulated electric, gas, water, sewer and telephone utilities.

20	he does refer to depreciation rates supplied by Staff of the Missouri Public Service

Consequently, in Schedule 1 of Mr. Harwig's direct testimony at page 2, Ì lines 3 (Other Equipment) and 4 (Structure), I believe the more appropriate depreciation 2 rate is 2.0% as prescribed by account 317, in both instances. 3 Please state your recommendation regarding the depreciation rates 4 Q. tabulated on Schedule 1 of your rebuttal testimony. 5 It is my recommendation that the Commission, include in its final Α. 6 Report and Order, approval of the depreciation rates contained in Schedule 1. 7 Does this conclude your prepared direct testimony? Q. 8 9 Α. Yes, it does.
