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1	TRANSCRIPT OF PROCEEDINGS
2	JUDGE THOMPSON: We'll go on the
3	record. Good morning. We are here in the
4	matter of Missouri Public Service filing to
5	reflect the winter purchased gas adjustment
6	calculations for the eastern system for the
7	year 2001, 2002, Case No. GR-2002-392. Lewis
8	Mills is the regulatory law judge assigned to
9	preside over this matter, and I am sitting in
10	for him this morning because he is otherwise
11	occupied. My name is Kevin Thompson.
12	We will go ahead and take oral entries of
13	appearance at this time. Why don't we begin
14	with Aquila?
15	MR. COOPER: Dean L. Cooper from the
16	law firm of Brydon, Swearengen & England, P.O.
17	Box 456, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65102,
18	appearing on behalf of Aquila, Inc., doing
19	business as Aquila Networks - MPS.
20	JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you, Mr.
21	Cooper. Mr. Franson?
22	MR. FRANSON: Robert Franson
23	appearing on behalf of the staff of the Public
24	Service Commission, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson
25	City, Missouri, 65102.

1	JUDGE THOMPSON: Thank you. Mr.
2	Micheel?
3	MR. MICHEEL: Douglas E. Micheel,
4	appearing on behalf of the Office of Public
5	Counsel and the public, P.O. Box 7800,
6	Jefferson City, Missouri, 65101-7800.
7	JUDGE THOMPSON: I notice that in
8	Judge Mills' order he discussed the filing of
9	a proposed procedural schedule, but he did not
10	set a date for that. That will be due one
11	week from today. And that's on the record, so
12	conduct yourselves accordingly. Who knows
13	offhand what the date one week from today is?
14	MR. FRANSON: Well, Judge, that
15	would be October 7th.
16	JUDGE THOMPSON: The 7th?
17	MR. FRANSON: Yes, sir.
18	JUDGE THOMPSON: Very good.
19	MR. FRANSON: Could we request that
20	that be October 15th rather than October 7th?
21	JUDGE THOMPSON: For the proposed
22	procedural schedule?
23	MR. FRANSON: Yes, sir.
24	JUDGE THOMPSONO: And why is that?
25	MR. FRANSON: I will be out of the

1	office for a period of time and would request
2	that.
3	JUDGE THOMPSON: Well, okay.
4	MR. FRANSON: I also believe we are
5	near resolution of most, if not all, of the
6	matters in this case.
7	JUDGE THOMPSON: Well, I'm happy to
8	hear that. But assuming you don't get
9	resolved, we'll go ahead and expect the
10	proposed procedural schedule on October 15th.
11	MR. FRANSON: Thank you, Judge.
12	JUDGE THOMPSON: Or by October 15th.
13	Okay? I think that's all I have. Do any of
14	the parties have anything at this time? Mr.
15	Franson?
16	MR. FRANSON: I have an oral motion,
17	Judge, regarding the caption in this case.
18	And I believe that I have talked to
19	Mr. Micheel and Mr. Cooper about this. Judge,
20	the caption that is appearing in the orders is
21	currently in the matter of Missouri Public
22	Service filing to reflect the winter purchased
23	gas adjustment calculations for the eastern
24	system.
25	JUDGE THOMPSON: Okay. You don't

1	like that caption?
2	MR. FRANSON: No. No. I don't I
3	don't care for that one. I would propose
4	instead that that should be as was found in
5	staff's recommendation In The Matter of
6	Aquila, Inc., d/b/a Aquila Networks - MPS,
7	purchased gas adjustment factors to be
8	reviewed in its actual cost adjustment for
9	2001, 2002. Judge, the reason for this motion
10	is that I think when this was originally
11	filed, it came in as a tariff and possibly a
12	modification, but it is not really an accurate
13	caption. And that's why I'm asking that it be
14	modified in that regard.
15	JUDGE THOMOPSON: Okay. Tell you
16	what, since Judge Mills isn't here and since I
17	didn't get a chance to write all that down
18	while you were reciting it, why don't you go
19	ahead and file a written motion to recaption
20	the case?
21	MR. FRANSON: That's why I was
22	making an oral motion, for the specific
23	purpose of avoiding that. And that's why I
24	was asking for it now.
25	JUDGE THOMPSON: Well, go ahead and

	1	do an oral motion, written motion anyway.
	2	MR. FRANSON: I've got an oral
	3	motion, Judge.
	4	JUDGE THOMPSON: Go ahead and do a
	5	written motion anyway. Thank you. Anything
	6	else? Okay. There being nothing further,

	8	portion of the prehearing conference at this
	9	time.
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
