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- JUDGE JONES: This is Case No. CR-2007-0403, the
- 3 matter of Atmos Energy Corporation's filing for purchased
- 4 gas adjustments in the 2006-2007 period.
- 5 Let's take entries of appearance beginning first
- 6 with Atmos.
- 7 MR. DORITY: Thank you, Judge. Appearing on
- 8 behalf of Atmos Energy Corporation, Larry W. Dority and
- 9 James M. Fischer, Fischer & Dority, PC. Our address is
- 10 101 Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri, 65101.
- 11 JUDGE JONES: And for Office of Public Counsel?
- 12 MR. POSTON: Thank you. Mark Poston, appearing
- 13 for Office of Public Counsel.
- 14 JUDGE JONES: And Staff of the Commission?
- MR. BERLIN: Appearing on behalf of the Staff of
- 16 the Missouri Public Service Commission, Bob Berlin and
- 17 Lera Shemwell, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson City,
- 18 Missouri, 65201.
- MS. SHEMWELL: 102.
- 20 MR. BERLIN: 102.
- 21 JUDGE JONES: Well, just to get you all started,
- 22 so I understand what's going on, what -- what issues does
- 23 Atmos take with Staff's position? Please don't tell me
- 24 they have to do with affiliate transactions.
- 25 MR. DORITY: Actually, your Honor, that -- that

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- 1 is one area that -- that we would take exception with.
- 2 And we are in the process of trying to work through a
- 3 number of the issues that we've identified for Staff.
- 4 As I mentioned off the record, we will convene a
- 5 conference call among the parties at 10:30 this morning.
- 6 That will involve a number of our folks that could not be
- 7 here in person. There are still some discovery
- 8 outstanding. Not at issue at this point. It's just from
- 9 a time line standpoint, our responses are -- are not yet
- 10 -- not yet due. And so that will probably be the subject
- 11 of some discussion as well.
- 12 JUDGE JONES: Okay.
- 13 MR. DORITY: And we had informally visited prior
- 14 to going on the record about a -- a realistic time line
- 15 for continuing our discussions and then providing your
- 16 Honor with a proposed procedural schedule.
- 17 And we were thinking a -- a three-week time
- 18 frame would probably give us sufficient opportunity to --
- 19 to know whether or not we're going to be needing to
- 20 proceed in this matter. So if that would --
- JUDGE JONES: No problem for me.
- 22 MR. DORITY: -- be acceptable to you, then we'd
- 23 probably be looking at a date about three weeks out to
- 24 file a procedural schedule.
- 25 JUDGE JONES: Okay. That -- when you say three

- 1 weeks, you mean you need that amount of time to know
- 2 whether or not you need to proceed to a hearing?
- 3 MR. DORITY: Correct.
- 4 JUDGE JONES: So after three weeks, it's either
- 5 -- some kind of filing, either status or procedural
- 6 schedule?
- 7 MR. DORITY: That's right.
- 8 JUDGE JONES: Have you all been following the
- 9 Laclede case? You have. 203 -- 288, I think it is. It
- 10 has do with Laclede and LER and the affiliate transactions
- 11 and all those things.
- MR. DORITY: Yes, Judge.
- 13 JUDGE JONES: Could this case possibly take that
- 14 same route?
- MS. SHEMWELL: Possibly.
- 16 JUDGE JONES: Okay. And let me also ask -- and
- 17 -- and I can't recall if Staff, in your recommendation,
- 18 requested that the Commission open up an investigatory
- 19 docket.
- MS. SHEMWELL: We have not.
- 21 JUDGE JONES: Okay. I don't -- so it sounds
- 22 like everything is going to be involving discovery of
- 23 transaction of affiliates? Is that pretty much it, or are
- 24 there other little things that --
- 25 MR. DORITY: I think there are a few other

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- 1 smaller items. And I don't believe that at least at this
- 2 point the -- the scope of the affiliate issue is perhaps
- 3 as broad as it may have been in the -- in the Laclede
- 4 matter.
- JUDGE JONES: Okay.
- 6 MS. SHEMWELL: And Staff would concur.
- 7 JUDGE JONES: You do concur, or you would concur
- 8 under certain conditions?
- 9 MS. SHEMWELL: We concur. I --
- 10 JUDGE JONES: Mr. Poston, did you have an
- 11 opinion?
- 12 MR. POSTON: No. We haven't taken any position
- on any of this stuff.
- 14 JUDGE JONES: Okay. That's all I had. Does
- 15 anyone have anything else they want to talk about on the
- 16 record?
- 17 MR. DORITY: I don't believe so.
- MR. BERLIN: No.
- 19 JUDGE JONES: Hope you can work it out. And
- 20 thank you.
- 21 MR. DORITY: Thank you.
