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1 PROCEEDINGS 2 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Let's go on the record. 3 Good afternoon, everyone. We're here for a 4 prehearing conference in Atmos's ACA Case 5 GR-2008-0364. We'll begin taking entries of 6 appearance, beginning with Atmos. 7 MR. DORITY: Thank you, Judge. 8 Appearing on behalf of Atmos Energy Corporation, let 9 the record reflect the appearance of Larry Dority and James Fischer with Fischer & Dority, PC. Our address 10 is 101 Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City, Missouri 11 12 65101. JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. For Staff. 13 14 MR. BERLIN: Appearing on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission, 15 Robert S. Berlin, Post Office Box 360, Jefferson 16 City, Missouri 65102. 17 18 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. For Public Counsel. 19 MR. POSTON: Thank you. Marc Poston, 20 21 appearing for the Office of the Public Counsel and 22 the public, P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri 23 65102. 24 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you. Well, I 25 scheduled this prehearing conference to give you a

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chance to get together to discuss a procedural
 schedule. I'll ask that you file the procedural
 schedule a week from today. That would be the 18th.
 And is there anything else anyone wants to bring up
 while we're on the record?

6 MR. BERLIN: Judge, I might just, while 7 we're on the record, state that Staff anticipates the 8 discovery process, so I think that that would be the 9 prelude to a procedural schedule, and I think we're 10 gonna have -- we're going to meet after this 11 on-the-record prehearing to discuss issues related to 12 that.

JUDGE WOODRUFF: That's fine. Of course 13 14 there's no operational law date involved here, so however quickly or not so quickly you think you can 15 16 do it is probably okay with the Commission. 17 MR. DORITY: I would just respond, Judge, that Mr. Berlin is correct. We do have an 18 19 additional meeting later today to talk more about the issues in the case, and we have circulated a 20 21 preliminary draft proposed procedural schedule for 22 the other parties' consideration, and I think we'll 23 be talking about that. 24 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay.

25 MR. DORITY: I'm not sure that the

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1 discovery necessarily has to be a prelude to filing a procedural schedule. We may be able to accommodate 2 3 that time frame within whatever proposal we would put 4 forward. So I think at this point maybe we could 5 leave the one-week proposal in place, and then to the 6 extent that something changes, we can file a status 7 report or something with the judge advising of that. 8 JUDGE WOODRUFF: That's what I was 9 anticipating. And if you can't file -- if you can't 10 just file a procedural schedule, just file something a week from now telling me when you can. 11 12 MR. DORITY: Okay. MR. BERLIN: All right. 13 14 JUDGE WOODRUFF: Anything from Public 15 Counsel? 16 MR. POSTON: No, thank you. 17 JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Well, thank 18 you all very much then. And with that, the on-the-record portion of this proceeding is 19 adjourned. Thank you. 20 21 (Whereupon, the prehearing conference 22 was concluded.) 23 24 25
