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1	PRODEEDINGS
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3	JUDGE DIPPELL: Good evening. I appreciate you
4	all being here this evening. And I'm going to stand up
5	while I do this because I can't see you all. We can go
6	ahead and go on the record.
7	Today is October 2nd, 2017. And the Missouri
8	Public Service Commission has set this time for a local
9	public hearing in files numbered GR-2017-0215 and
10	GR-2017-0216, which are captioned as: In the Matter of
11	Laclede Gas Company's Request to Increase Its Revenues
12	For Gas Service; and In the Matter of Laclede Gas
13	Company, doing business as Missouri Gas Energy's Request
14	to Increase Its Revenues For Gas Service.
15	The companies have since gone through a name
16	change, which most of you are probably aware. So
17	Laclede Gas Company is now known and Spire.
18	My name is Nancy Dippell. I'm the Regulatory Law
19	Judge presiding over this matter tonight. I have two of
20	our commissioners I would like to introduce.
21	Commissioner Stoll, would you like to say something?
22	MR. STOLL: I'll also stand. I wanted to welcome
23	everybody and thank you all for coming out tonight.
24	This is the beginning of the process in this case. We
25	hold local public hearings, and then later there will be

- 1 evidentiary hearings in Jefferson City. You can attend
- 2 those in person, or you can tune in on the internet and
- 3 watch. Exactly how to do that, I can't tell you, but
- 4 our staff can.
- 5 And again, we're here to listen to your comments.
- 6 I'm sure you've already been told, we commissioners
- 7 cannot answer questions. We will eventually sit in
- 8 judgment of the case and can be disqualified for
- 9 prejudging. But we want to hear what you have to say.
- 10 It's the beginning of the process, and I look forward to
- 11 hearing your comments.
- MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. And then on my left is
- 13 Commissioner Coleman.
- 14 MS. COLEMAN: Thank you. Good evening. Thank
- 15 you so much for coming out. And I just would like to
- 16 add that any comments that you provide this evening will
- 17 be part of the official record, and we'll be considering
- 18 that in our decision making. So thank you very much for
- 19 any comments you may have tonight.
- MS. DIPPELL: And along those lines, we have a
- 21 court reporter to my right. And she'll be taking down
- 22 your statements, and I'll have you give those statements
- 23 under oath.
- 24 The way this is going to work is those of you
- 25 that signed up, I will call you one by one in the order

- 1 you're listed here and ask if you can to come up to the
- 2 podium and speak into the microphone. I'll ask you to
- 3 give us your name and spell it. And then I'll just have
- 4 you give us your comments.
- 5 After you've given your comments, there may be a
- 6 few clarifying questions, either from myself or the
- 7 commissioners, or some of the attorneys present. And I
- 8 would ask you to stay at the podium until you're
- 9 excused.
- 10 And I originally set time limits in this case for
- 11 the local public hearings. Given that there's not that
- 12 many people signed up to testify, we won't worry about
- 13 time limits tonight. But I will ask you to be conscious
- 14 of your neighbor's time this evening.
- So with that, I will ask for the attorneys to
- 16 make their entries of appearance. I'll start with
- 17 staff.
- 18 MS. MERS: Nicole Mers, appearing on behalf of
- 19 Staff. And my information has been provided to the
- 20 court reporter. I would like to take the time this
- 21 evening to hear your testimony.
- MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. For the company.
- 23 MR. ZUCKER: Thank you. Rick Zucker here on
- 24 behalf of Laclede Gas Company, now known as Spire
- 25 Missouri, Inc.

MS. DIPPELL: For the Office of Public Counsel. 1 MS. SHEMWELL: Good evening. Lera Shemwell on 2. behalf of the office of public counsel. And I have 3 4 given my information to the court reporter. 5 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. Any interveners present that wanted to make an entry? Seeing none, we'll go 6 7 ahead and begin with our first witness. Harry Wood. 8 MR. WOOD: I pass. I got my answers. 9 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. Cynthia Peterson. 10 MS. PETERSON: Do you want me to come up there? 11 MS. DIPPELL: If you would, please. If you would 12 start out by giving us your name and I'll swear you in. 13 MS. PETERSON: Cynthia Peterson. C-Y-N-T-H-I-A, 14 P-E-T-E-R-S-O-N. 15 MS. DIPPELL: Okay. Let me swear you in. 16 (Witness sworn) 17 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. Please give us your 18 comments. 19 MS. PETERSON: Okay. I oppose the rate increase for a number of reasons. First, I believe that the 20 21 executive level people of companies, such as utilities 22 and other companies, profit too greatly for the cost 23 that we pay as individual middle class people. I can't speak for all classes, but the middle class is paying 2.4 for lower class, which is a social responsibility. The 25

- 1 upper class seems to have all the tax loopholes, so they
- 2 don't have to pay for anything.
- I had Laclede Gas for the almost 30 years I've
- 4 lived in St. Louis. I've seen things that I find very
- 5 disturbing. One, they can tear up your streets to fix
- 6 the lines, which I appreciate them fixing the lines.
- 7 Yet we still have no street repair.
- 8 In any business -- second, in any business, you
- 9 have to put aside money for maintaining and repairing
- 10 your infrastructure. That cost does get passed on, but
- it shouldn't be every time we turn around, there's a
- 12 rate increase for this and a rate increase for that.
- 13 They obviously don't plan well for a rainy day.
- 14 Three, nothing that has been said today has
- 15 convinced me to change my mind otherwise, and in my
- 16 questioning, that I do not believe that they need this
- 17 rate increase.
- 18 And I am very much against monopolies, were they
- 19 can creatively find ways to bill us under different
- 20 titles. It should be a rate fee for the amount of use
- 21 of your gas. And if it's \$3.00 per therm, or however
- 22 you want to charge, then that's what you charge and you
- 23 figure out how to manage your business on that basis.
- It should be equal to all; meaning if you're a
- 25 two therm user and it's \$6.00 a therm, you're \$12.00.

- 1 If you're a 15 therm user and it's \$6.00, then you get
- 2 the gist.
- 3 So I'm against the rate increase. And I might
- 4 add for the person that's next on the list, they're
- 5 probably going to decline.
- 6 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. Were there any other
- 7 questions for Ms. Peterson? Thank you. And I'll just
- 8 ask, Carolyn Martin?
- 9 MS. MARTIN: Decline.
- 10 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. Ruth Houser.
- 11 MS. HOUSER: Decline.
- MS. DIPPELL: Rob Sonneville?
- 13 MR. SONNEVILLE: Yeah. I'll take that. Rob
- 14 Sonneville, S-O-N-N-E-V-I-L-E.
- 15 (Witness sworn)
- MS. DIPPELL: Go ahead. Thank you.
- MR. SONNEVILLE: Basically I'm here just to
- 18 confirm and thank Cynthia Peterson for what she just
- 19 said. I agree with it wholeheartedly. I just wanted to
- 20 be on record for that.
- 21 MS. DIPPELL: Very well. Thank you, sir. Jim
- 22 Madden.
- 23 MR. MADDEN: Jim Madden. M-A-D-D-E-N.
- MS. DIPPELL: Could I swear you in, please.
- MR. MADDEN: Yes.

1 (Witness sworn) 2 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you. MS. MARTIN: I'm going back several years, 3 4 probably in the 80s. And I mean no ill will toward the 5 Public Service Commission or anything like that. I feel 6 like there's too much of a cozy relationship between 7 Laclede and PSC. Because years ago, there was a couple 8 supervisors that went out and went to put up signs and 9 everything like that for a political person who happened to be Joe Frappier, who was a Senator from North County. 10 The supervisors were Earl James and his wife, Etta 11 12 James. She was head of the republican party up in North 13 County. 14 Mr. Norm Porch was the owner of Fritz's Custard Stand up in South County. Well eventually, Senator 15 Frappier became the public service commissioner. I just 16 17 think -- I would like to see something a little more 18 open. 19 You had another fella, Ben McReynolds. He was a supervisor in the same department. His aunt was Phyllis 20 21 Swafner, who runs the eagle forum for republicans. think there's too much coziness in there, and they were 22 going out, putting their signs up on company time. We 23 2.4 found their signs in the trunks of the car. 25 So this is something that's under the bridge and

- 1 most of them are dead at this point, but I just think
- 2 that they need to clean up their act and stay out of the
- 3 political arena to get all this information done. Thank
- 4 you.
- 5 MS. DIPPELL: Hold on just a moment.
- 6 MR. STOLL: I might add, if you makes feel any
- 7 better, nothing like that better happens today. And it
- 8 doesn't happen between commissioners and the company or
- 9 political people.
- 10 MS. MARTIN: I mean --
- 11 MR. STOLL: I understand. I just wanted to
- 12 assure you it's not going to happen today.
- MS. MARTIN: I just, you know, felt it was wrong.
- 14 And nothing to you can do at the time. I'm retired from
- 15 there. And I gratefully appreciate everything I've done
- 16 and received. But I just think there's too much
- 17 hanky-panky going on.
- 18 MR. STOLL: Thank you for your testimony.
- 19 MS. MARTIN: Thank you, sir. I meant no offense.
- MR. STOLL: None taken.
- 21 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you, sir. Richard Amick.
- 22 MR. AMICK: I decline.
- MS. DIPPELL: Fred Jones.
- 24 MR. JONES: I decline.
- MS. DIPPELL: You guys might start hurting my

- 1 feelings here. There's no one else on my list. Is
- 2 there anybody else who didn't sign up to testify and
- 3 would like to testify? Just raise your hand.
- 4 MS. PETERSON: Can I add one more comment?
- 5 MS. DIPPELL: Certainty. Come on up.
- 6 MS. PETERSON: I probably should have stated this
- 7 earlier. The other beef that I have with Laclede Gas,
- 8 other than they charge us an arm and a leg, is they try
- 9 to hire these outside skag workers to replace meters
- 10 rather than their own loyal, local, Laclede Gas workers.
- 11 And I find that appalling.
- 12 MS. DIPPELL: Thank you, ma'am. Is there anyone
- 13 else who would like to testify?
- Well, I hope if you're passing on your chance to
- 15 testify that means you got some questions answered
- 16 earlier tonight. If you still have questions,
- 17 representatives from the company as well as the Office
- 18 of Public Counsel and staff will still be around when
- 19 we're done here tonight. So you can still ask questions
- 20 of them individually if you would like.
- 21 Commissioners, was there anything further before
- 22 we adjourn?
- 23 MR. STOLL: I think I would like to recognize a
- 24 former student of mine. I know he's embarrassed by
- 25 this. In a previous life, I was a high school teacher,

and Mr. Beckett -- Officer Beckett back there was one of my students. Good to see you here today. MS. DIPPELL: Yes. We appreciate the services of Mr. Beckett and the Fox C6 School District for letting us use their facility. I really appreciate you all coming out this evening. It does help us in our process. With that, we can go off the record. We're adjourned.
