2	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. We'll go on the record. Good
3	evening. Today is June 12, 2019. The Missouri Public Service
4	Commission has set aside this time in Columbia today for a
5	local public hearing in File Number GR-2019-0077, which is
6	captioned as In the Matter of Union Electric Company, doing
7	business as Ameren Missouri's Tariffs to Increase Its Revenues
8	for Natural Gas Service.
9	My name's John Clark. I'm the Regulatory Law
10	Judge overseeing this hearing. With me today are Public
11	Service Commissioner Commissioners Daniel Hall and Maida
12	Coleman.
13	Commissioner, would you like to make any opening
14	remarks?
15	COMMISSIONER HALL: I'll just say thank you for
16	being here. These local public hearings are an important part
17	of the process. The testimony you provide will be a part of
18	the record in the case, and those commissioners who are not
19	here today will have access to that transcript. With that, I
20	look forward to hearing your testimony.
21	JUDGE CLARK: Anything you would like to add?
22	COMMISSION COLEMAN: We appreciate you being here
23	tonight.
24	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you so much. I'm going to
25	begin by asking counsel to enter their appearances for the

1	record, starting with Ameren Missouri.
2	MS. GRUBBS: Good evening. Jermaine Grubbs on
3	behalf of Ameren Missouri.
4	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you, Ms. Grubbs. From the
5	Commission Staff?
6	MR. BERLIN: Thank you, Judge. Bob Berlin
7	appearing on behalf of the Staff of the Missouri Public
8	Service Commission. The court reporter has my contact
9	information.
10	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Berlin. From the
11	Office of Public Counsel?
12	MR. HALL: Good evening, your Honor and
13	Commissioners. My name is Caleb Hall, appearing on behalf of
14	the Office of the Public Counsel. My contact information has
15	also been provided previously to the court reporter.
16	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Hall. Anybody else?
17	MS. KREMER: Yes, Judge. Lisa Kremer with the
18	Missouri Division of Energy.
19	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. Thank you, Ms. Kremer. And
20	you're a non-attorney; correct?
21	MS. KREMER: Yes, sir.
22	JUDGE CLARK: It appears we have one person who
23	has signed up to provide comments to the Commission tonight.
24	I'll call that person's name in a minute. When I call your
25	name, please come down to the podium. I'll place you under

1	oath, and then I'll ask you to state and spell your name, and
2	then you'll have an opportunity to offer your comments to the
3	Commission.
4	Also, after you've offered your comments, please
5	remain standing at the podium until you've been excused
6	because the Commission or myself may have some questions for
7	you. If the attorneys have any questions, if they'll let me
8	know just simply by raising their hand, that would be
9	sufficient.
LO	Now, I will say the Commission won't be able to
11	answer any questions today because they have to remain
12	impartial until after the evidence is presented at the
L3	evidentiary hearing. If you have any questions, please speak
L4	to the representatives of the company, the Commission Staff,
15	or the Office of the Public Counsel, who are all here tonight.
L6	And so with that and please excuse me if I
L7	butcher your name Tom Schauwecker?
18	MR. SCHAUWECKER: Close enough. Good evening,
L9	ladies and gentlemen and Commissioners.
20	JUDGE CLARK: Would you raise your right hand to
21	be sworn, please?
22	MR. SCHAUWECKER: I certainly will.
23	JUDGE CLARK: Do you solemnly swear or affirm that
24	the testimony you're about to give is the truth, the whole
25	truth, and nothing but the truth?

1	MR. SCHAUWECKER: Absolutely, yes.
2	JUDGE CLARK: And would you please state and spell
3	your name for the record?
4	MR. SCHAUWECKER: Thomas Charles Schauwecker,
5	Boone County Assessor past 30 years. S-c-h-a-u-w-e-c-k-e-r.
6	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you, Mr. Shwecker (phonetic).
7	MR. SCHAUWECKER: SHAW-weck-er.
8	JUDGE CLARK: Sorry. SHAW-weck-er.
9	MR. SCHAUWECKER: Got it.
10	JUDGE CLARK: What would you like to tell the
11	Commission today?
12	MR. SCHAUWECKER: You know, I would like to tell
13	the Commission that I've had a wonderful working relationship
14	with Ameren for 30 years, to start with, from Mike Coleman to
15	Pam Harrison back here who I've personally met with over the
16	years, but and I noticed in in the rate setting hearings
17	that when the corporate tax income tax was reduced from 35 to
18	21 percent, roughly a 40 percent reduction, that there was
19	some forgiveness in the rates setting.
20	I see where Ameren is asking for about a \$4.8
21	million increase in revenues. There's a recent decision,
22	Estes, the Assessor in Cole County Ameren v. Estes that
23	effectively will if that commission it was issued by the
24	Missouri State Tax Commission. It went all the way up to the
25	Western District Court of Appeals and was remanded back to the

1 Missouri State Tax Commission. The last day of the 2 legislative session, if that order stands as the body of work, Ameren's property tax liability will be reduced by 52 percent. 3 There's currently \$3 million in escrow if you --4 5 for 2018, in Boone County. Boone County was not part of that There's \$30 million in escrow for the 18 counties that 6 7 are subject to that property tax appeal that -- from 2013 through 2018. Half of that would be refunded back to the 8 9 company, and then going forward if that precedent holds, the 10 property tax liability will be reduced by roughly 52 percent. I've done a little quick math in my head, and it 11 12 -- Ameren's property tax liability, Ameren Natural Gas, may be 13 about \$8 million a year. That would be -- that savings would be \$4 million. So what I'm asking the Commission to take into 14 15 consideration is the most recent Missouri State Tax Commission 16 decision that would reduce Ameren's property tax liability by 17 52 percent from the years 2013 through 2018, setting forward. 18 There's an appeal pending in Boone County on their 19 assets here that we have on the books for about 127 million. 20 They want 43 million, 47 million in their appeal. 21 So that is why I'm here, to ask the Commission to 22 take into consideration, just like we did in federal income 23 tax cut, the property tax liability being cut by 52 percent. 24 I'm asking the Commission to take that into consideration in

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your rate setting.

1	COMMISSIONER HALL: Thank you very much.
2	JUDGE CLARK: Thank you for your comments.
3	COMMISSIONER COLEMAN: Thank you, sir.
4	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. I haven't I don't see
5	where anybody else has signed up who wanted to offer comments
6	tonight, and I don't know who else is here, but if anyone,
7	having heard the comments given or just realizing that they
8	would like to offer additional comments of their own, I would
9	invite them at this time to please raise their hand and I'll
10	call you up if you would like to offer any comments.
11	Is there anybody at this time who would like to
12	offer any comments for the Commission?
13	JUDGE CLARK: Okay. I see no hands.
14	Now, the Commission provides local public hearings
15	so that interested members of the public have an opportunity
16	to ask questions of the company, Commission Staff, the Office
17	of Public Counsel, and also so they have an opportunity to
18	comment directly to the Commission. And interested members of
19	the public may still provide written comments through the
20	Public Service Commission website or through the office by
21	contacting the Office of the Public Counsel.
22	Now I'd like to thank everybody who participated
23	and who came here tonight to make this happen, and with that,
24	this hearing is now adjourned. We can go off the record.
