PROPOSED AMENDMENT

20 CSR 4240-18.010 Safety Standards for Electrical Corporations, Telecommunications Companies, and Rural Electric Cooperatives. The commission is amending section (1).

PURPOSE: This amendment changes the edition of the National Electrical Safety Code that the Public Service Commission adopts for the minimum safety standards applicable to electrical corporations, telecommunications companies, and rural electric cooperatives, and clarifies that the new standards apply only to new installations and extensions.

(1) The minimum safety standards relating to the operation of electrical corporations, telecommunications companies, and rural electric cooperatives are Parts 1, 2, and 3 and Sections 1, 2, and 9 of the National Electrical Safety Code (NESC); [2017] 2023 Edition, as approved by the American National Standards Institute on [August 1, 2016] August 1, 2022, [as modified by Errata thereto issued on September 13, 2016 and March 31, 2017, and published by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, Inc., 3 Park Avenue, New York, NY 10016-5997. The NESC is composed of four (4) different parts and four (4) sections, each of which pertain to different aspects of the electric and telecommunications industries. Part 1 specifies rules for the installation and maintenance of equipment normally found in electric generating plants and substations. Part 2 pertains to safety rules for overhead electric and communication lines. Part 3 contains safety rules for underground electric and communication lines. Section 1 is an introduction to the NESC, Section 2 defines special terms, and Section 9 requires certain grounding methods for electric and communications facilities. The full text of this material is available at the [Energy Analysis Section of the Utility Operations] Industrial Analysis Division - Engineering Analysis Department of the Public Service Commission, Suite 700, 200 Madison, Jefferson City, Missouri. This rule does not incorporate any subsequent amendments or additions.
