- 2 JUDGE DALE: We are here today, June 12, 2007
- 3 in Case No. GR-2007-0280 in the matter of Laclede Gas
- 4 Company's Tariff to revise natural gas rate schedules.
- 5 My name is Colleen Dale. I'm the regulatory law judge
- 6 handling this hearing. With me is Commissioner Appling
- 7 who may or may not have questions for you after you
- 8 come up to testify. I see that Commissioner Murray is
- 9 joining us also.
- 10 When you come up to speak, please keep in
- 11 mind that we are here to have your comments. We're not
- 12 here to answer questions, but hopefully, Mr. Graham,
- 13 who is the only person signed up to testify will have
- 14 already had his questions answered. So come on up.
- 15 JERRY GRAHAM,
- 16 after being first duly sworn to tell the truth
- 17 testifies as follows:
- 18 JUDGE DALE: Thank you. Could you please say
- 19 and spell your name for the court reporter.
- 20 MR. GRAHAM: Jerry, J-E-R-Y Graham,
- 21 G-R-A-H-A-M.
- JUDGE DALE: Thank you. Please go ahead.
- MR. GRAHAM: I -- what I have to say is very
- 24 short. I understand they have to make money, the
- 25 company does. I live on a fixed income, Social

1 Security, pension check from Boeing. That's all I have

- 2 coming in. As we was talking in the back, you know,
- 3 when you're on a fixed income, you've got to watch your
- 4 money so much. If you go on billing, at the end of the
- 5 year, you've got to come up with the money, if you do,
- 6 there goes Christmas.
- 7 So I try to pay my bills, you know, every day
- 8 or every month so I don't have that problem. The only
- 9 thing I can say, I live on a fixed income. I don't
- 10 have that much extra money. I hope the company can
- 11 find some way to cut costs.
- 12 I mean, I'm down to the -- groceries going
- 13 up. A gallon of milk is \$3 a gallon for 2 percent. I
- 14 guess I'm going to have to start buying powdered milk.
- 15 Go back to that.
- So that's all I have to say, not too much.
- 17 Do you have any questions?
- 18 COMMISSIONER APPLING: How you doing,
- 19 Mr. Graham?
- MR. GRAHAM: Good.
- 21 COMMISSIONER APPLING: Good. Do you live in
- 22 the City of St. Charles?
- MR. GRAHAM: No, sir, I don't. I live in
- 24 St. Charles County.
- 25 COMMISSIONER APPLING: Okay. All right.

- 1 What do you average, if you don't mind, you don't have
- 2 to share, what do your average bills run per month,
- 3 your bills, you know, electric, gas bills.
- 4 MR. GRAHAM: Oh, I would not -- I would give
- 5 you the figures, but I don't have that off the top of
- 6 my head.
- 7 COMMISSIONER APPLING: Okay. I had -- just
- 8 trying to get a fix on it because the fixed income is
- 9 one of the things that we listened to a lot and we --
- 10 the company listens to that a lot, too. But I was just
- 11 trying to get a feel for what your bills run a month,
- 12 but that's fine.
- 13 MR. GRAHAM: I can get that -- I don't have
- 14 any problem sharing that with you. The only thing I
- 15 can say, is that years ago, I bought a high efficiency
- 16 furnace, 98 or 99 percent efficient. And yes, it saves
- 17 me a little bit on gas, but the thing of it is, it
- 18 sounds silly, it don't put out hot air. My -- me and
- 19 the company and I have gone round and around, the one
- 20 that installed it. My furnace inside my house is not
- 21 hot like the old furnace used to be that had the
- 22 burners in it.
- 23 Mine's got a spark plug in it and a stainless
- 24 steel thing. It puts out heat, but it runs almost
- 25 constantly to keep the temperature, but it never gets

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- 1 the inside of the house hot.
- 2 But it saves money. It saves maybe five or
- 3 six dollars a month in the gas bill, if I keep it
- 4 turned down.
- 5 COMMISSIONER APPLING: All right.
- 6 MR. GRAHAM: I did try that.
- 7 COMMISSIONER APPLING: What brand do you
- 8 have?
- 9 MR. GRAHAM: I knew you'd ask me that and I
- 10 can't think right this second.
- 11 COMMISSIONER APPLING: Is it a heat pump
- 12 or --
- MR. GRAHAM: No, no. It's not a heat pump.
- 14 COMMISSIONER APPLING: That's okay. No
- 15 problem. Don't worry about it. I was just trying to
- 16 assess the possibility of what you have.
- 17 MR. GRAHAM: It's one that's got the big
- 18 stainless steel tank on the inside that fires with a
- 19 spark plug. I can't think of the name of it right
- 20 offhand. And, you know, that was when I was working
- 21 and I paid so much money for that. That was \$3,000 for
- 22 a furnace. It was a lot of money, but I was working at
- 23 the time and it was no problem.
- 24 COMMISSIONER APPLING: Right.
- MR. GRAHAM: Those days are over.

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1 COMMISSIONER APPLING: Well, Mr. Graham,
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- 2 thank you very much for coming in. We thank you for
- 3 your comments and if there's anything else you can
- 4 think of, you're certainly welcome to send it to us and
- 5 we will consider what you have to say. Thank you.
- 6 MR. GRAHAM: Thank you very much. Did
- 7 anybody else have any questions?
- 8 COMMISSIONER MURRAY: I have some questions.
- 9 Do you have any complaints or are you satisfied with
- 10 the quality of the service that you receive from
- 11 Laclede?
- 12 MR. GRAHAM: Yeah. I have nothing about --
- 13 no complaints about the service. They came out and
- 14 put -- I think they removed the copper line and put a
- 15 plastic line in. They went through the whole
- 16 subdivision in St. Charles Hills and they, I guess,
- 17 they went through the whole subdivision and did that
- 18 because of the cracking in the piping because of the
- 19 freezing in the ground and everything else. I'm glad
- 20 they did it. It was for my benefit, as well as theirs.
- 21 I have no complaints about that. I have had
- 22 various gas leaks and they've came and taken care of it
- 23 and everything. I have no complaints about your
- 24 service. I thank you for your time.
- 25 COMMISSIONER MURRAY: Thank you.

- 1 JUDGE DALE: Before we adjourn, I would like
- 2 to go ahead and take entries of appearance for those
- 3 counsel on record who wish to do so.
