ORDER SCHEDULING A CONFERENCE REGARDING PROCEDURES FOR CONSIDERATION OF AN ACCOUNTING AUTHORITY ORDER

Issue Date: October 10, 2018 Effective Date: October 10, 2018

The Commission opened this case on February 21, 2018, at Staff's request, to consider the propriety of the rates charged by Union Electric Company d/b/a Ameren Missouri for natural gas service in light of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, which reduced the federal corporate income tax rate from 35 percent to 21 percent. In its order opening the case, the Commission ordered Ameren Missouri to "quantify and track all impacts of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 potentially affecting natural gas service rates from January 1, 2018, going forward." In addition, the Commission ordered Ameren Missouri to "quantify and track its excess protected and unprotected ADIT for possible future flow back to ratepayers, and shall advise the Commission how best such flow-back may be accomplished."²

On September 27, Staff filed a motion asking the Commission to clarify its February 21 order to clearly indicate its intent that Ameren Missouri not only quantify and track the

financial impact of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, but also defer those financial impacts from January 1, 2018 going forward to regulatory asset or regulatory liability accounts on its Missouri-regulated financial statements for possible future flow back to ratepayers. In the alternative, if the Commission finds that it did not intend to require that deferral in its February 21 order, Staff asks the Commission to make a deferral order at this time.

On October 5, 2018, Ameren Missouri filed a response in opposition to Staff's motion, *Ameren Missouri's Response to Staff's Request for Clarification of Prior Order or, in the Alternative, Issuance of a New Order.* Ameren Missouri in its response states that the Commission did not issue an accounting order when it issued an order opening this matter, and that the Commission cannot issue a deferral order without Ameren Missouri having an opportunity to file testimony or have an evidentiary hearing. Ameren Missouri indicated that on September 20, 2018, it filed a 60 day notice of its intention to file a gas rate case to address this and other issues. Ameren Missouri asks the Commission to issue an order denying Staff's request.

After considering Staff's motion and the opposition to that motion, the Commission finds that the February 21 order was not a deferral order. But the Commission will further consider the issuance of such an order. To that end, the Commission will schedule a procedural conference and will direct Ameren Missouri to report its quantification of impacts of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017, as well as its quantification of its excess protected and unprotected ADIT, to the most current date available.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. No later than October 24, 2018, Ameren Missouri shall file a report quantifying all impacts of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 potentially affecting natural gas service rates from January 1, 2018, going forward to the most current date available.
- 2. No later than October 24, 2018, Ameren Missouri shall file a report quantifying the financial impact of the amortization of its excess protected and unprotected ADIT from January 1, 2018 going forward to the most current date for which such financial information is available.
- 3. A procedural conference is scheduled for October 25, 2018, at 1:00 p.m., at the Commission's office at the Governor Office Building, 200 Madison Street, Jefferson City, Missouri, Room 305. This building meets accessibility standards required by the Americans with Disabilities Act.
