1	JUDGE WOODRUFF: This is Case No.
2	GR-2001-387, which is in the matter of Laclede Gas Company's
3	purchased gas adjustment tariff revisions to be reviewed in
4	its 2000-2001 actual cost adjustment. It's also
5	consolidated with GR-2000-622, which is also Laclede's PGA
6	for 1999-2000.
7	Let's begin by taking entries of appearance
8	beginning with Staff.
9	MR. BATES: Good morning, your Honor. My name
10	is Bruce Bates. I represent the Staff of the Missouri
11	Public Service Commission. My address is Post Office Box
12	360, Jefferson City, Missouri 65102.
13	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you.
14	And for Laclede?
15	MR. PENDERGAST: Good morning, your Honor.
16	Michael C. Pendergast and Rick Zucker appearing on behalf of
17	Laclede Gas Company. My business address is 720 Olive

19	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Thank you.
20	And for Public Counsel?

1	was a motion for request for continuance of hearing filed on

6	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And you do not look well,
7	so
8	MR. PENDERGAST: Yeah. And I do not feel as
9	badly as I did on Friday. I am still not 100 percent. I do
10	want to express my appreciation to the other parties, the
11	Staff and the Public Counsel, for agreeing to that
12	continuance on such short notice.
13	I could muddle through it if it were necessary
14	to go ahead and muddle through today. My concern would be
15	that I might give what I've got to others. But if there is
16	a desire to continue the proceedings, I am here and,
17	otherwise, if the Commission's inclined to grant the
18	continuance, you know, I would appreciate that as well.
19	JUDGE WOODRUFF: All right. Public Counsel or
20	Staff, do you have any response?
21	MR. MICHEEL: We supported the continuance. I
22	don't want what Mr. Pendergast has, at least his illness.
23	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Mr. Bates?
24	MR. BATES: I agree with Mr. Micheel.
25	JUDGE WOODRUFF: Okay. I'm inclined to go

1	ahead and grant the continuance. And I'll make a statement
2	on the record that you do look ill, Mr. Pendergast. And I
3	appreciate you coming in and being a trooper today and
4	coming in.
5	MR. PENDERGAST: Thank you, your Honor.
6	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And I was not here on Friday
7	either, but as you can probably hear in my voice, I've been
8	fighting some stuff too, so I will go ahead and grant the
9	continuance.
10	I think the motion talked about continuing
11	until tomorrow or until Thursday. I'm inclined to just let
12	it go until Thursday. Does anyone have a problem with that?
13	MR. MICHEEL: The only complicating matter
14	that I see is I believe we also have a prehearing scheduled
15	in the Panhandle Eastern
16	JUDGE WOODRUFF: That's on Tuesday.
17	MR. MICHEEL: Is that on Tuesday?
18	MR. ZUCKER: The oral argument.
19	MR. MICHEEL: The oral argument. I'm sorry.
20	I knew I had something that conflicted. The oral argument
21	with respect to the Catch-Up/Keep-Up. And I think I'm the
22	person who's required to do that for our office.
23	JUDGE WOODRUFF: And I assume, Mr. Pendergast,
24	you'll do doing that for Laclede, I assume.
25	MR. PENDERGAST: Actually Mr. Swearengen will
