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1 2 \* \* \* \* 3 PROCEEDINGS 4 5 JUDGE STREARLEY: Good evening, it's 6 Wednesday, May 23rd, 2007. The Missouri Public 7 Service Commission has set this time for a local 8 public hearing in Case No. GR-2007-0208. The Laclede 9 Gas Company seeks to implement a general rate increase for its natural gas service in Missouri. I am Harold 10 Stearley. I am a Regulatory Law Judge that will 11 12 preside over this hearing tonight. With me is 13 Commissioner Appling. While the other commissioners couldn't be 14 here physically, they will either be watching this by 15 16 web casting, or they will be able to review our recording and the official transcripts from the court 17 reporter in this matter. They will all be reviewing 18 any testimony that we receive. 19 20 Any testimony we receive tonight will be 21 recorded by the court reporter, and it must be given 22 under oath. The purpose is to give the general public 23 an opportunity to present their remarks and comments 24 on this case and have them entered into the official 25 record. If the people present choose to testify, what we will do is call their names, I will ask them to spell their names for the Court Reporter so that it is entered into the record correctly. I will then swear them in and they can provide to the commission whatever statements they wish to register with regard to this case.

7 There may be some follow-up questions from attorneys that are present, for those witnesses, or 8 9 from Commissioner Appling, or from myself. So we don't want you to be finally excused until all 10 questions have been asked and answered, and that you 11 12 have been given a full opportunity to present your 13 comments. We will conclude our hearing when everyone 14 who wishes to has had an opportunity to give their remarks. Does anyone have any questions about the 15 16 procedure that we will follow?

Well, hearing none, we will begin our public hearing in the matter of Laclede Gas Company's Tariff to Revise Natural Gas Rate Schedules, Case No. GR-2007-0208. We will begin by taking entries of appearance from counsel, beginning with Laclede Gas Company.

MR. PENDERGAST: Thank you, Your Honor.
Michael C. Pendergast, and Ricky Zucker appearing on

5 We've already had an opportunity to talk to 6 two gentleman a bit, but if they have some additional 7 questions I have Chris Cilias, who is our director of 8 operations, Jim Hickman is here from our Monet 9 division, as is Becky Martin. We also have George Csolak from our corporate communications here. As I 10 said, if anybody has any additional questions we will 11 12 be happy to go ahead and try our best to answer them. 13 Thank you.

14 JUDGE STEARLEY: Thank you, Ms. Pendergast. Is there any counsel present from any of the 15 interveners tonight? 16 17 Hearing no responses to that, we will let 18 the reflect that no other counsel has entered an appearance in tonight's public hearing. 19 20 MR. OCHOA: Your Honor, there is the 21 representative from the Office of Public Counsel here. 22 JUDGE STEARLEY: You're certainly right, 23 and I don't mean to forget you. So let me take 24 entries from the staff of the Missouri Public Service 25 Commission.

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MS. SHEMWELL: Good evening, Your Honor. 1 Lera Shemwell, representing the staff of the Missouri 2 3 Public Service Commission, P.O. Box 360, Jefferson 4 City, Missouri 65102. Thank you. 5 JUDGE STEARLEY: Is there anyone from the 6 Office of Public Counsel? 7 MR. POSTON: Yes, thank you. Marc Poston for the Office of the Public Counsel and the Public, 8 9 P.O. Box 2230, Jefferson City, Missouri. JUDGE STEARLEY: All right. Did I miss 10 anyone? Commissioner Appling, would you like to make 11 12 any opening remarks? 13 COMMISSIONER APPLING: No opening remarks, 14 but just to say welcome to everyone and now is the time to speak tonight. We look forward to hearing 15 16 from you. Thank you for being a part of this hearing 17 tonight. JUDGE STEARLEY: I would like to thank our 18 post in Union who provided us with the opportunity to 19 20 do this video conferencing. If we didn't have this 21 type of technology we wouldn't have the opportunity to 22 reach out to so many members of the public. We 23 certainly appreciate their hosting this public hearing 24 for us tonight. With that, I will got through any 25 prospective witnesses we may have in the audience. We 6

certainly have a small turnout here, but we would like
 to hear any comments you have to offer.

3 MR. OCHOA: Would anyone like to testify?4 No, Your Honor.

5 JUDGE STEARLEY: No one wishes to testify? 6 All right. Well, then I guess we will make it a very 7 rapid public hearing then. Mr. Pendergast has 8 indicated that he has some personnel present who can 9 answer and have already answered some questions for 10 the people there. Since we don't have any testimony tonight, then I guess Commissioner Appling I asked 11 12 your for opening remarks, would you have any closing 13 remarks?

COMMISSIONER APPLING: I don't have any 14 closing remarks, but I would like to say to the two 15 16 people that are there, thank you for coming out. Mr. 17 Pendergast is a good man there and any questions you 18 have, I invite you to ask him and his team. Make sure you ask him some questions tonight. Mike, good to 19 20 hear from you. We will be talking to you pretty soon, 21 probably more than we really want to.

22 MR. STEARLEY: I believe this is probably 23 the shortest public hearing I have ever had to preside 24 over, and with that, this public hearing in Case No. 25 GR-2007-0208 is hereby adjourned.
