ORDER REGARDING STATUS REPORT AND DIRECTING FILING

On March 5, 2004, the Commission issued a report and order that established requirements for the final phase of Laclede Gas Company's program to replace unprotected steel mains within its gas distribution system. That order required Laclede to replace an average of 10,000 feet of main each year until all remaining unprotected steel mains have been replaced. The Commission also ordered its Staff to file annual status reports regarding Laclede's progress. Staff filed its annual report on April 2, 2014.

Staff reports that Laclede eliminated 9,675 feet of unprotected steel main in fiscal year 2013. During the period of fiscal year 2003 through fiscal year 2013, Laclede has replaced an average of 10,518 feet of unprotected steel main per year. Thus, Laclede has complied with the requirements of the Commission's 2004 order. Staff further reports that Laclede has 8,506 feet of unprotected steel main remaining to be replaced.

The Commission will direct Staff to continue to monitor Laclede's unprotected steel main replacement program and to file its next status report by May 1, 2015.

THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

1. The Staff of the Commission shall file its next annual status report no later than May 1, 2015.
2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
