## ORDER DENYING APPLICATION FOR RECONSIDERATION

On February 24, 2010, the Commission issued an order directing its General Counsel to seek remedies in Circuit Court against Laclede Gas Company for Laclede's failure to follow a Commission order. On March 5, Laclede filed an application for rehearing or alternatively for reconsideration. Because the Commission's order is interlocutory<sup>1</sup> and does not dispose of this case, the Commission will consider Laclede's application to be one for reconsideration, rather than rehearing.

Commission rule 2.160(2) requires that applications for reconsideration set forth the grounds on which the applicant considers the order to be unlawful, unjust or unreasonable. The Commission concludes that its order is lawful because Missouri law<sup>2</sup> authorizes the Commission to enforce its powers in Circuit Court, through the Commission's General

Counsel. Further, throughout this proceeding, the Commission has considered the arguments again set out by Laclede in this application. Laclede has presented nothing to show that the Commission's order directing its General Counsel to seek remedies in Circuit Court is unjust or unreasonable. The Commission will deny Laclede's request for reconsideration.

## THE COMMISSION ORDERS THAT:

- 1. Laclede Gas Company's application for reconsideration is denied.
- 2. This order shall become effective upon issuance.
