STAFF RECOMMENDATION IN THIS CASE

COMES NOW the Staff of the Missouri Public Service Commission ("Staff") and for its Recommendation in this case states:

1. On June 30, 2005, Aquila Inc. d/b/a Aquila Networks – MPS and L&P (MPS or Company), of Kansas City, Missouri, filed tariff sheets proposed to become effective on July 18, 2005. These tariff sheets were filed to reflect changes in the Company's Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) factors as a result of an estimated change in the cost of natural gas for the remaining portion of the summer season.

2. The changes in gas cost, which reflect increasing gas prices, are proposed to be effective for service rendered on or after July 18, 2005.

3. The Energy Department staff has reviewed the filing and has determined that the proposed gas cost increases were calculated in conformance with MPS's Commission approved PGA clause.

4. Staff is of the opinion that good cause for approval of this tariff sheet on less than thirty days notice is demonstrated by the fact that the Commission approved MPS's tariff that allows for ten (10) business days notice for PGA change filings.

5. Staff recommends, however, that the tariff sheets be approved interim, subject to refund only pending the final Commission decision in this case. Interim subject to refund status

should be maintained pending final Commission decisions in Case Nos. GR-2005-0271, GR-2004-0539, and GR-2003-0369.

WHEREFORE, the Staff recommends that the Commission approve the tariff filing effective on July 18, 2005, only in the basis that the rates are interim subject to refund.

SUBJECT: Staff Recommendation For Aquila Networks – MPS Optional PGA Filing Effective July 18, 2005

DATE: July 5, 2005

On June 30, 2005, Aquila Inc. d/b/a Aquila Networks – MPS and L&P (MPS or Company), of Kansas City, Missouri, filed tariff sheets proposed to become effective on July 18, 2005. These tariff sheets were filed to reflect changes in the Company's Purchased Gas Adjustment (PGA) factors as a result of an estimated change in the cost of natural gas for the remaining portion of the summer season.

For the Southern System (serving communities such as Sedalia and Clinton), the net effect of this filing is to increase the firm PGA factor for the remaining portion of the 2004 - 2005 summer season to \$0.80180 per Ccf (hundred cubic feet), from the firm PGA factor of \$0. 73993 per Ccf currently in effect. When compared to the rates currently in effect, for a residential customer who uses a total of 127 Ccf in July, August, September and October, this proposed change would increase that customer's bill by approximately \$8, or 5% for the remaining summer season.

For the Northern System (serving communities such as Chillicothe and Trenton), the net effect of this filing is to increase the firm PGA factor for the remaining portion of the 2004 - 2005 summer season to \$0.86117 per Ccf, from the firm PGA factor of \$0.78428 currently in effect. When compared to the rates currently in effect, for a residential customer who uses a total of 127 Ccf in July, August, September and October, this proposed change would increase that customer's bill by approximately \$10, or 6% for the remaining summer season.

Case No. GR-2005-0271, under which these PGA changes were filed, was established to track the Company's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 2004-2005 ACA filing. Case No. GR-2004-0539 was established to track the Company's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 2003-2004 ACA filing. Case No. GR-2003-0369, was established to track the Company's PGA factors to be reviewed in its 2002-2003 ACA filing. Interim subject to refund status should be maintained pending final Commission decisions in Case Nos. GR-2005-0271, GR-2004-0539, and GR-2003-0369.

The Commission's Energy Department - Tariffs/Rate Design Staff (Staff) has reviewed this filing

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and has determined that the tariff sheets were calculated in conformance with the Company's PGA Clause. Staff is of the opinion that good cause for approval of this tariff sheet on less than thirty (30) days notice is demonstrated by the Company's Commission approved PGA clause allowing for ten (10) business days notice for PGA change filings. Therefore, Staff recommends approval of the following tariff sheets, as filed on June 30, 2005 with an effective date of July 18, 2005, interim subject to refund:
