2	The Commission calls File HR-2011-0241. This is in
3	the matter of Veolia Energy Kansas City Incorporated
4	for authority to file tariffs to increase rates.
5	My name is Daniel Jordan; I'm the senior
6	regulatory law judge assigned to this action. We're
7	here for a discovery conference.
8	I will begin by taking entries of
9	appearance. We'll start with the applicant. We have
10	one on the phone and one here in person.
11	MR. DOWNEY: Diana, you want to go
12	first?
13	MS. VUYLSTEKE: Sure. Diana Vuylsteke of
14	the law firm Bryan Cave, 211 North Broadway, Suite
15	3600, St. Louis, Missouri 63102.
16	MR. DOWNEY: And Edward Downey, also with
17	Bryan Cave, 221 Bolivar Street, Suite 101, Jefferson
18	City, Missouri 65101.
19	JUDGE JORDAN: Now, does the applicant
20	have any representatives of the client with them
21	today?
22	MR. DOWNEY: We do. Daniel Dennis, vice
23	president and general manager of Veolia Energy Kansas
24	City and Steven C. Carver, consultant with UtiliTech,
25	Inc.

1	JUDGE JORDAN: Okay. Thank you.
2	And for Staff?
3	MS. KLIETHERMES: Sarah Kliethermes for
4	the Staff of the Public Service Commission. I
5	believe our address has been previously recorded.
6	JUDGE JORDAN: All right. And do you

8	MS. KLIETHERMES: I believe Brett Prenger
9	is on the phone. Is there anyone else on the phone
10	for Staff?
11	MR. PRENGER: No, that's it.
12	JUDGE JORDAN: And for Intervenors?
13	MR. FISCHER: James M. Fischer, Fischer &
14	Dority, 101 Madison, Suite 400, Jefferson City,
15	Missouri, appearing on behalf of the intervenor,
16	Kansas City Power & Light Company.
17	MR. COOPER: Dean Cooper from the law firm
18	of Brydon, Swearengen & England, P.C., P.O. Box 456,
19	Jefferson City, Missouri 65102, appearing on behalf
20	Southern Union company doing business as Missouri Gas
21	Energy.
22	JUDGE JORDAN: And it looks like the
23	intervenors don't have any representatives of their
24	clients with them. Okay. Very good.
25	This is our final scheduled discovery

1	conference. As far as I know there are no discovery
2	matters outstanding. I have no discovery motions
3	pending before me filed and awaiting ruling.
4	Does anyone know of anything else or know
5	otherwise?
6	MS. KLIETHERMES: Judge, just for clarity
7	I believe that there was a discovery dispute that was
8	resolved by between Staff and the Company by Staff
9	imputing a number or something to do with rate case
LO	expense. Shouldn't shouldn't be an issue. I
11	think we've reached resolution on it.
12	JUDGE JORDAN: Okay.
