ORDER DIRECTING NOTICE AND MAKING AURORA COMMUNICATIONS, INC. A PARTY

Syllabus: This order provides notice of this application to interested parties and joins the other party to the interconnection agreement, Aurora Communications, Inc. (“Aurora”), as a party to this proceeding.

On July 12, 2007, CenturyTel of Missouri, L.L.C. (“CenturyTel”) filed an application with the Commission for approval of a negotiated Interconnection, Resale and Unbundling Agreement with Aurora under the provisions of the federal Telecommunications Act of 1996. CenturyTel states that the agreement complies with Section 252(e) of the Act in that it is consistent with the public interest, convenience and necessity, and not discriminatory to nonparty carriers. CenturyTel requests expeditious approval of the agreement.

Although Aurora is a party to the agreement, it did not join in the application. Because Aurora is a necessary party to a full and fair adjudication of this matter, the Commission will add Aurora as a party to this case.

The Act provides that an interconnection or resale agreement must be approved unless the state commission finds that the agreement discriminates against a telecommunications carrier not a party to the agreement, or that implementation of the agreement is not consistent with the public interest, convenience, and necessity.¹ Section 252(e)(4) of the Act provides that if the Commission has not approved an agreement within 90 days after submission, the agreement shall be deemed approved. Therefore, the Commission will proceed with this case expeditiously. The Commission finds that proper persons should be allowed 20 days from the issuance of this order to file a motion for hearing. The Commission also finds that notice of this application should be sent to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies.

IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Commission's Data Center shall send notice to all interexchange and local exchange telecommunications companies.
2. Aurora Communications, Inc. is made a party to this case.
3. Any party wishing to intervene or request a hearing shall do so by filing a pleading no later than August 2, 2007, with:
